YOUNGSTOWN

If the preparation for doing something interesting and unusual in one's life, along with the achievement itself and aftermath, could be thought of as writing a story, you could say that Josh Avery has already penned several chapters.

"I'm a big Disney fan and I wanted to do a marathon," said Avery, who has served 18 months as the men's discipleship manager for the Rescue Mission of the Mahoning Valley. "I've tried to say, 'What would be an interesting story of my life?'"

The 30-year-old Avery spoke recently from his office at the Rescue Mission on Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard near downtown about his desire to participate in the 2017 Walt Disney World Marathon on Jan. 8 in Orlando, Fla., to raise money on behalf of the mission.

His goal is to bring in \$1,500, most of which is to go toward a nine-month academic program for men with drug and alcohol problems, as well as those who are trying to better themselves.

The program offers classes three times daily Monday through Friday and includes Bible lessons. It also includes life- and workforce-skills training courses, and money raised also would be used to fund special outings for the participants, said Avery, who has received about \$735 so far from friends, fundraisers and online efforts.

Avery has been training since May for the 26.2-mile race, which will take runners through four Disney theme parks and the ESPN Wide World of Sports complex.

He is following a regimen by Jeff Galloway, a member of the 1972 U.S. Olympic Team who devised a program called the Run Walk Run method, a type of interval training in which participants' long runs are interspersed with walking three days a week to reduce fatigue and the chance of injury.

To that end, Avery spends a lot of time running through Mill Creek Park.

Another crucial piece of the training is eating foods high in protein as well as plenty of vegetables and fruits while avoiding fast foods, said Avery, a 2004 graduate of Heartland Christian School in Columbiana who earned a bachelor's degree in student ministries from Geneva College in Beaver Falls, Pa.

Of course not everyone is athletically primed to run 26 miles, but countless other ways exist for people to live rich, meaningful lives.

Avery said he is challenging others to show their support and love toward the marathon effort and "live interesting stories with their lives."

Regardless of how much money he brings home, perhaps the most rewarding moment for Avery will be who greets him as he crosses the finish line. Expected on the sidelines will be several family members, including his wife, Carissa, and their 3-month-old daughter, Ellie.

"That will be awesome," said Avery, who also is a youth pastor and who took part in a half-marathon last Christmas at Cedar Point in Sandusky.

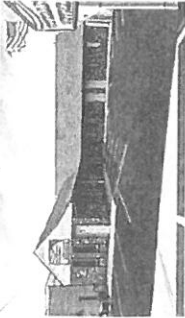

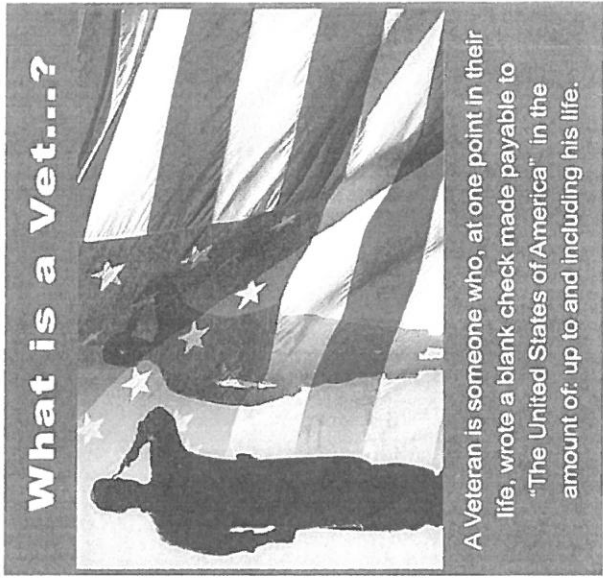

Veterans' Outreach has plenty of history to be proud of, 22 years helping veterans. We enclosed the Deed of Conveyance and our Brochure. I also elaborated on our Charity and finish with our Kentucky Project ahead of us which we hope that you can find yourself a part of!

We raise funds solely to honor and provide services for veterans. Since it's start...we have helped veterans over 100,000 times. In the future we will be helping MILLIONS more. These guys and gals have difficulties ranging from medical issues like PTSD, and other mental and physical disabilities, resulting from their time in the service for this country of ours.

We raise most all funds ourselves, we have some government and corporate funding. We are funded through our "Outreach Program", CD sales, corporate grants, and private donations.

We are hopeful that this program will help us provide services through the winter when so many vets find themselves in situations like do we pay our gas bill or do we buy food. This is the kind of thing that we face every day.

We are comprised of volunteers and employees. Over 85% of our employees are veterans themselves. We are all part of a team that has a sole purpose of making the lives of our veterans better and be there at the ready for any vet in need. Volunteers are needed in allot of categories...they can help even with a computer and a cell phone...No reason why most everyone can't be involved.

Our Services Director meets with those veterans in need. He/she listens, empathizes, and determines their most immediate need. Most of the time, we are able to help the veteran that same day.

We have helped with a variety of needs, most being the basic needs of life, including shelter, rent, utility assistance, food, clothing, auto repair, transportation, fuel and so on. We work with referrals to and from other agencies and organizations to provide the most benefit for the veteran. One Stop, Veterans Clinics, Veterans Service Offices, Goodwill, and just a host of other entities or other groups that are interested and getting assistants with veterans.

We also accept donations at our office of small household items, food, and clothing. Now, allot of non-profits do this, but the big difference at Veterans' Outreach, is, that we give the items away to our veterans. We have items available every day that veterans visit our office, and they can have any of those donated items for free.

We have a big Food program that has even been a Remote Giveaway to veterans and their families in other counties. Going very well in Ohio and Kentucky! The Ohio Office particularly has received a Special Grant from

Wal Mart to partly subsidize the Food Program. We give away 20 lbs. of food into a custom canvas carry bag with all of the 5 Food Groups that are necessary.

We are also developing a PTSD Program in Kentucky on a property that was donated to us from one of our volunteers...it is called, "***Heroes' Passage, A Retreat for Veterans!***"

It is a 200-400 acre piece of Kentucky Wilderness that we will carve out a program like no other to help our veterans between 24-35 years of age to get them back on that right path so as they can find themselves after the conflict has ended...but many the conflict still lives within them.

They need that Beacon of Hope and Heroes' Passage can offer that to them.

Heroes' Passage is planning 60 individual residencies for a 3-6 month "Program of Reconstitution"...Getting them to look forward and concentrate to live and strive for the good of themselves and their loved one. We will have a church built..."Spiritual Awakenings"...Hi Tech Training/Job Readiness Centers, a Community Center, Farm with full tilt Agriculture and Livestock Applications, A Stable of Tennessee Walkers for Therapy Rides...An Iron Man Course, A Tribute Garden for Veterans...(with a waterfall and reflective pool already there), etc.... It is an aggressive plan and formula that will hopefully trigger the realization of their personal existence and get those previous combatants to find their self again. We want them to say at the finish of their Passage, that, "It Is Well with My Soul!"

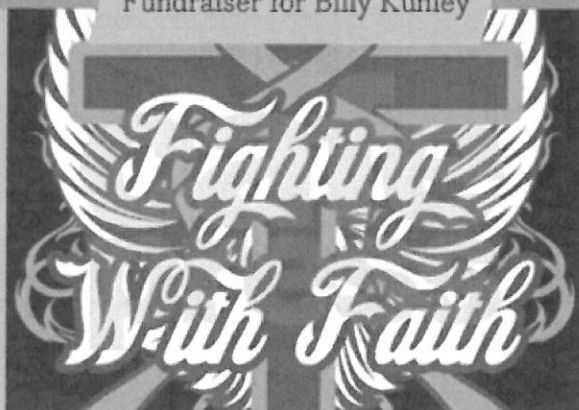

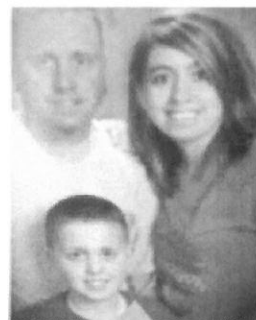
