### Program Description:

Cumulus Media has partnered with Second Harvest Food Bank of the Mahoning Valley (501(c)3 charitable organization) for the 2015 Harvest for Hunger campaign. ### Statistics

- In 2016, the Food Bank distributed a record 10.5 million pounds of food in the tri-county area.

- Of the people served in 2016, 31% were children and 20% were seniors.
- For every \$1 donated, the Food Bank can distribute \$11 worth of food for 5 meals.

## **Disney Marathon Complete! Josh Avery of Youngstown, Ohio has completed his first marathon and raised \$9,055 for Rescue Mission of the Mahoning Valley**

Youngstown, Ohio... Josh Avery, Men's Discipleship Manager at Rescue Mission of the Mahoning Valley set a goal last summer to begin training and run his first every marathon to celebrate turning thirty. Especially impressive because Josh was not even a runner, he chose the Walt Disney World Marathon in Orlando Florida on Sunday January 8, 2017 as his goal and started to train.

With a goal in mind to raise some funds for the Rescue Mission of the Mahoning Valley along the way, Josh set up a peer to peer fundraising page and hoped to raise \$1,000 for the shelter. As the date of the race drew closer, Josh had to continue to up his goal.

On Sunday, Josh ran his race. He completed his first marathon and met his increased fundraising goal of \$9,000 for the Mission with the help of dozens of supporters who encouraged him along the way. His final fundraising total was \$9,055 for Rescue Mission of Mahoning Valley. When Josh shared details of his experience with the staff at the Mission this morning, he emphasized how important prayer was in the training and running. He quoted Walt Disney and his view of lifelong prayer "...To me, today, at age sixty-one, all prayer, by the humble or highly placed, has one thing in common: supplication for strength and inspiration to carry on the best human impulses which should bind us together for a better world."

Lynn Wyant, the Mission's Director of Development said "Everyone at the Mission adores Josh and his humble heart. He is someone who is dedicated and always looking for the next challenge. When he and I talked about the Marathon last summer, I just knew it was going to make an impact. Everything Josh and his wife Carissa do is to glorify God."
