Dr. Suzanne Judd/UAB Epidemiologist

If we scale up and those vaccines come online faster that just means we could reach herd immunity sooner.

UAB epidemiologist Dr. Suzanne Judd says the projection assumes that for every positive case, there are three other people who've had the virus and didn't get tested. Judd says some studies show that ratio could be as high as 10 to 1.

We've done similar tests at UAB and we see more like 5 to 1 on the tests we've done when we've looked at people's blood to see if they've developed antibodies. Roughly five individuals have antibodies that never had a positive test.

I think if we look at everything in context, this is modeling and really all of the information has to fall in to place for us where we need to be

Assistant State Health Officer Dr. Karen Landers cautions that while the news is encouraging... it's still imperative we wear masks, social distance and get the vaccine in order to get the virus under control

When we do achieve herd immunity is that when we can expect the state to lift the health orders? Is that when we can expect that to happen? Well, of course we provide information to the governor's office and the governor makes decisions with her guidance related to health orders. I would certainly say we need to continue to stay the course with where we are at the moment until we see these numbers being very low and we have vaccine rates very high.
