The Foley Beach Express is the oldest portion of the Express highway. It opened in 2000.

"If you ride that road you'll notice that it doesn't have shoulders and in most high speed roads you need them, the older roads and everything we have a lot of county roads that don't have shoulders but when I say don't have shoulders I mean that they are not paved,"

Right now it's estimated that 3 to 4000 vehicles travel the Beach Express every day. As the area continues to grow and more and more people head to vacation destinations ALDOT estimates that daily average could more than double to 10,000 vehicles each day.

And if a driver isn't familiar with the road some portions that don't have safety shoulders can be deceiving.

"It will either be two foot on the left lane and 6 foot on the right lane or it might be four and four, we're trying to work with engineers to see. We want to match up what Baldwin county has to really make it a seamless transition,"

The city of Foley has secured a \$1.5 million dollar Highway safety Grant and will partner with ALDOT to make the improvements. Last year the county did the same - adding shoulders and rubble strips to its portion from I-10 to County Road 12.

Now it's Foley's turn – and ultimately the city has its sites on not only making the safety improvements but to repave the Foley Beach Express as well. The entire project including the paving could run above the 1.5 million and Foley is working with ALDOT to make it happen.

If you're a parent' struggling to make ends meet during this pandemic, the advance child tax credit payments you started receiving last month are like a lifeboat, keeping your family afloat. But unlike those stimulus checks most Americans received this spring...

"It's not free money."

"It's NOT free money!"

Richard Lindsey is a certified public accountant with the Mobile firm of Lindsey and Waldo. And Richard says these child tax credit payments are meant to get your family through the next few months.

"But beware, be careful. If you're gonna owe money next April 15th, then, if you don't have to absolutely spend it to put bread on the table and gas in the tank, then you might want to put that aside in a savings account and not touch it."

And here's why.

These payments are actually the tax breaks you get when you file your income taxes.. you get a certain tax credit for each child you have. IN fact, the government actually increased that amount this year. These deposits you're getting now are actual advances on that credit.

For example, let's say you have a 10 year old child. At tax time, you'd get a tax break of \$3000 for that child.

To help you out now, the government is advancing you half of that... \$1500 ... in cash payments over the next 6 months. But when you file your taxes next year, that 15 hundred dollars won't be there as a tax break. That means your refund be that much smaller. And, in fact, it might cause you to owe taxes... or more than you're used to paying.

When you get back to work, you could increase your IRS withholding amount on your paychecks to make up the difference. "So what if you don't want this money? Well, Richard says you can go on line and simply opt out of it...." You can do that at IRS.GOV. No, it's not free money, but...

HE IS OUT OF JAIL TONIGHT AND ON ADMINISTRATIVE LEAVE. TONIGHT WE HAVE COURT RECORDS OUTLINING WHAT POLICE SAY HAPPENED INSIDE THE HOME. AS NBC 15'S RACHAEL WILKERSON REPORTS-- HIS WIFE FILED A PROTECTION FROM ABUSE ORDER AGAINST MARLIN YESTERDAY, CLAIMING THE ALLEGED ABUSE HAS BEEN ONGOING.

IN THIS PROTECTION ORDER --- MOBILE POLICE OFFICER DANIEL MARLIN'S WIFE -- outlines three different incidents of ALLEGED abuse... OVER THE PAST 6 WEEKS

SHE CLAIMS ON TUESDAY -- MARLIN WAS ANGRY THAT SHE WAS TALKING ON THE PHONE TO SOMEONE SHE DESCRIBED AS HIS MISTRESS SHE SAYS == AFTER A STRUGGLE MARLIN TOOK HER PHONE AND REFUSED TO GIVE IT BACK.-

AFTER A TUSSLE -- HER PETITION CLAIMS SHE GOT HER PHONE BACK, RAN INSIDE THE HOME.. WHERE THEIR 3 YEAR OLD DAUGHTER LOCKED THE DOOR. THE PETITION INDICATES MARLIN ALLEGEGLY BROKE THE DOOR FRAME TO GET INTO THE HOUSE.

THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE ARRIVED ON SCENE AFTERWARDS AND ARRESTED MARLIN FOR DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND INTERRING WITH AN EMERGENCY CALL.

EARLIER THIS MONTH, MARLIN'S WIFE CLAIMS IN THE PETITION THAT SHE WAS ATTACKED A SECOND WITH THEIR THEIR 3 OLD WATCHING.

AND ON MAY 30TH.. SHE CLAIMS THERE WAS A THIRD INCIDENT AFTER SHE QUESTIONED MARLIN ABOUT HIS ALLEGED MISTRESS IN THE THE PROTECTION ORDER, SHE SAYS MARLIN KNOCKED HER TO THE GROUND WHERE SHE SAYS HE PLACED HIS HAND AROUND HER THROAT THREATENING TO BREAK HER NECK. SHE ALLEGES MARLIN LATER AGAIN PUT HIS.HANDS AROUND HER NECK -- THIS TIME CAUSING HER BODY TO GO NUMB AND SHE FEARED BLACKING OUT.. HER DAUGHTER, SHE SAYS, ONCE AGAIN WAS A WITNESS

DIRECTOR BATTISTE SAYS -- DOMESTIC VIOLENCE ISN'T TOLERATED BY THE DEPARTMENT
