JULY 2, 2017 -- In an exclusive interview this morning, **Health and Human Services Secretary Tom Price** addressed the president's tweets this week attacking MSNBC "Morning Joe" hosts, telling moderator Chuck Todd that the president "can do more than one thing at a time" and is "absolutely not" too distracted to campaign for health care.

Price claimed that analyses that show premiums rising for seniors don't take into account everything HHS is doing to roll back rules and regulations: "If you look at it in its totality, and nobody's looking at it in its totality, we will bring down premiums." Watch the full interview.

Sens. Tom Carper (D-Del.) and **Bill Cassidy (R-La.)** exclusively joined the program, addressing the president's tweets this week: Carper noted that Trump "makes it a lot harder for himself," while Cassidy said, "I wake up in the morning and I read about the LSU Tigers. I don't read about the president's tweets," calling them "reprehensible."

On the Senate healthcare bill, Carper said, "This is a great opportunity to pause. This is a great opportunity for guys like Bill and me and others to say, "What is it in the Affordable Care Act that we should fix, that needs to be fixed?"" Watch the full interview.

Malcolm Gladwell, writer for The New Yorker and host of the "Revisionist History" podcast, told Todd that "the only thing worse than a complete lack of trust between the press and the government is press and a government that are completely chummy." And when it comes to the president's tweets, "Trump is not behaving out of character in those moments. That's sort of a crucial thing to remember. It's why you can't be shocked. He's being who he is." Watch the full interview.

JULY 9, 2017 – **Former CIA Director John Brennan** exclusively joined "Meet the Press" this morning, reacting to President Trump's meeting with Russian President Vladimir Putin on Friday: "He said it's an honor to meet President Putin. An honor to meet the individual who carried out the assault against our election? To me, it was a dishonorable thing to say."

"I seriously question whether or not Mr. Putin heard from Mr. Trump what he needed to about the assault on our democratic institutions of the election," Brennan told moderator Chuck Todd. He also noted that he has not been contacted by Special Counsel Robert Mueller when it comes to the Russia investigation. Watch the full interview.

In an exclusive interview, **Sen. Lindsey Graham (R-S.C.)** addressed the president's tweet this morning about working with Russia on cybersecurity to prevent future "election hacking and many other negative things": "It's not the dumbest idea I've ever heard, but it's pretty close."

Graham told Todd that Trump is "doing a good job in Afghanistan, North Korea and ISIL, but when it comes to Russia, he's got a blind spot. And to forgive and forget when it comes to Putin regarding cyberattacks is to empower Putin and that's exactly what he's doing." Watch the full interview.

This morning's broadcast also featured an exclusive sit-down with the party chairs (a tradition of the broadcast dating back to the 1960s) – **Tom Perez of the Democratic Party and Ronna McDaniel of the Republican Party** – for their first joint appearance.

McDaniel said that Democrats and Republicans "do share common values" while Perez said that "Trumpcare ... is a perfect example of our differences." McDaniel also criticized Perez for his previous remarks that "Republicans don't give a s*** about people," noting that "that type of rhetoric doesn't bring people to our party. We have to have reasonable discussions, have a dialogue." <u>Watch the full interview</u>.

JULY 15, 2017 – This morning on NBC News' "Meet the Press," **Jay Sekulow**, a member of President Trump's legal team, reacted to news this week of President Trump's son's meeting with a Russian lawyer promising damaging information about Hillary Clinton: "There's nothing illegal about that meeting."

"I don't represent Donald Trump Jr. and I do not know everyone for sure that was at that meeting," he told moderator Chuck Todd.

Sekulow pointed to former FBI Director James Comey's leaking of a conversation with the president as "the basis upon which all that started" and that his firing by Trump "cannot raise to the level of obstruction of justice." Watch the full interview.

Senate Majority Whip John Cornyn (R-Texas), a member of the Senate Intelligence Committee, exclusively reacted to the president's tweet this morning calling the Russia investigation "a hoax": "It's a mistake to personalize this to President Trump or Hillary Clinton or anyone else."

"I understand the president's frustration when James Comey told him three times he's not the target of an investigation and he wants that made public. But this is not about President Trump. This is about Russia versus United States," Cornyn shared.

The senator told Todd that, if the Republican Party's healthcare bill does not pass, "I assume we'll keep trying, but at some point, if Democrats won't participate in the process, then we're going to have to come up with a different plan." Watch the full interview.

Sen. Mark Warner (D-Va.), the vice chair of the Senate Intelligence Committee, also addressed Trump Jr.'s meeting, telling Todd that the committee is "trying to go about this in a methodical way."

"I've learned that there's a wide breadth between what is called in the espionage business 'a useful idiot' and full-fledged collusion," he said. Watch the full interview.

According to <u>a new NBC News/Wall Street Journal poll finding</u> debuting on this morning's network broadcast, Trump's job approval rating in the American counties that fueled his 2016 victory stands at 50 percent. The full NBC News/Wall Street Journal poll will be released later this week.

JULY 30, 2017 -- When it comes to the Affordable Care Act, <u>"our job is to follow the law of the land,"</u> Health and Human Services Sec. Tom Price told "Meet the Press" moderator this morning, adding that "the current law right now is failing the American people."

He also called on Congress "to go home and talk to their constituents" about health care and renewed the call to "repeal and replace" the ACA. Watch the full interview.

Senator Susan Collins (R-Maine), one of the three GOP senators to vote down the "skinny repeal" of the ACA this week, said that, when it comes to health care, "most of the input that I've had from the White House has been from the vice president and from the administrator of the Medicare and Medicaid programs."

She <u>expanded on a hot-mic moment</u> she had with Sen. Jack Reed (D-R.I.), in which she said "I'm worried" in response to him appearing to call President Trump "crazy": "Actually what I was talking about is the president's budget."

Collins reacted to DHS Sec. John Kelly's new role as White House Chief of Staff, noting that he'll "do a good job" and "bring some order and discipline to the West Wing." She also responded to speculation that Attorney General Sessions may be fired: "if he's being moved because of his correct decision to recuse himself, I think that's a mistake." Former Trump campaign manager Corey Lewandowski exclusively joined the program, advising Trump's new chief of staff to "not try to change Donald Trump ... That is what the American people voted for."

He also <u>called for the firing of Richard Cordray</u>, the first director of the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau: "It's my recommendation to the President of the United States to fire Richard Cordray, and if he wants to run for the governor of Ohio, go do it, but my concern is, you've got an unelected bureaucrat sitting in an office right now, and I hope that the new chief of staff looks at him moving forward and saying it's time to act decisively." <u>Watch the full interview</u>.

AUGUST 5, 2017 – In an exclusive interview with "Meet the Press" moderator Chuck Todd, California Gov. Jerry Brown (D) supported the idea of a lawsuit over President Trump's latest attempt to punish so-called "sanctuary cities," arguing that it's "something that our independent attorney general can decide, but it might just be very helpful to get into court and resolve this in a judicial forum rather than in the rhetoric of politicians talking past one another."

"A few judicious forums to resolve this dispute between the federal government and California – I think – can be very helpful for the whole country, and in a dispassionate way," the governor added. "Because this back and forth by politicians, it doesn't really clarify some of the difficulties of the paramount law of the federal government colliding with the sovereign law of the 50 states."

AUGUST 6, 2017 -- "You have to have a party that rises above the more particular issues to the generic," **California Gov. Jerry Brown (D)** told moderator Chuck Todd this morning on a special edition of "Meet the Press: Our Broken Politics." When asked whether abortion should be a litmus test for Democrats, Brown said, "The litmus test should be intelligence, carring about ... the common man."

On party leadership, Brown says that "if you added up pluses and minuses, I think Nancy <u>Pelosi is a major pillar of the Democratic Party.</u> And the answer is not to try to replace her with somebody, but to make sure the candidates represent and can empathize and be a part of the district they're running in."

Brown also <u>supported the idea of a lawsuit</u> over President Trump's latest attempt to punish so-called "sanctuary cities." <u>Watch the full interview.</u>

Todd exclusively spoke with Sen. Jeff Flake (R-Ariz.), calling the senator's new book, "Conscience of a Conservative" "as much of an indictment on the Republican leadership of the last 15 years as it is on Donald Trump." Despite this, Flake says he didn't think about leaving the party: "Not at all. I'm a proud Republican. Lifelong Republican. And I'm from Arizona. Arizona tends to elect independent-minded people and people who stand on principle, so I'm doing what I think my voters expect of me."

Flake shared that he wishes the party would stand up more to "staff that is demonstrably false," including birtherism: "I wish that we, as a party, would have stood up, for example, when the birtherism thing was going along. A lot of people did stand up but not enough." Watch the full interview.

AUGUST 12, 2017 — When asked if President Trump did enough today in response to the Charlottesville rally, former Chairman of the Joint Chief of Staffs Adm. Mike Mullen exclusively told "Meet the Press" moderator Chuck Todd "it's not just about the president from my perspective. I think political leaders, community leaders, leaders throughout the country need to start standing up to unify this country."

"We are divided, and we are becoming more divided," he continued. "We need to work together as a country, within the differences that we have, but we cannot let this kind of incident or what feeds this kind of incident continue to grow. In fact, the opposite has to happen."

AUGUST 13, 2017 – "Of course it was terrorism," **Lt. Gen. H.R. McMaster,** national security adviser to President Trump, told "Meet the Press" moderator Chuck Todd this morning <u>in reaction to the</u> Charlottesville rally violence.

When asked why Trump did not single-out the neo-Nazis or white supremacists in his response, McMaster said, "When he condemned bigotry and hatred on all sides, that includes white supremacists and neo-Nazis, and I think it's clear. I know it's clear in his mind."

The national security adviser reacted to recent criticism about Secretary Tillerson from Sebastian Gorka, deputy assistant to the president, who had told the BBC that the secretary on "military matters is simply nonsensical," telling Todd: "We should always take Secretary of State Tillerson at his word."

McMaster also called the speculation about his relationship with the president's senior counselor Steve Bannon "just a lot of noise," <u>repeatedly declining to answer</u> whether they can work in the same White House.

The show's other guests also responded to the Charlottesville violence. Adm. Mike Mullen, former chairman of the Joint Chief of Staffs, exclusively told Todd: "It's not just about the president from my perspective. I think political leaders, community leaders, leaders throughout the country need to start standing up to unify this country." Charlottesville Mayor Michael Signer said, "It's on the president and on all of us to say 'enough is enough."

NBC News correspondent Tom Costello <u>reported from the ground</u> in Charlottesville on the aftermath from the rally. He also caught up with <u>Virginia Gov. Terry McAuliffe</u> (D) in an exclusive, on-camera interview, in which McAuliffe said the suspect "is a terrorist, and he used his car as a weapon."

AUGUST 19, 2017 -- In an exclusive interview on NBC News' "Meet the Press," **former Rep. J.C. Watts (R-Okla.)** told moderator Chuck Todd that if members of Congress are "silent, intentionally or unintentionally, they wear the cap saying, "We agree with that.""

"Over the last seven months, there's been ample opportunity to disagree with the president on many issues," Watts said. "This is not a time for us to be afraid of being tweeted. You know, this is not a time for us to suppress our convictions."

He added: "I'm quite disappointed, Chuck, that we didn't have more on the faith council to resign, or at least speak out." Watch the full interview.

Civil rights icon Andrew Young, also a former United Nations ambassador and Atlanta mayor, exclusively shared his insights on this "week of misunderstandings": "We originally sought to redeem the soul of America from the triple evils of race, war and poverty. Most of the issues that we're dealing with now are related to poverty. But we still want to put everything in a racial context. The reason I feel uncomfortable condemning the Klan types is – they are almost the poorest of the poor. They are the forgotten Americans."

Young said that President Trump is "still politicking and thinking nationally, as a nationalist" and that he "made a mistake in thinking that living was easy and it just is not." Watch the full interview.

New NBC News/Marist poll numbers from the key Trump states of Michigan, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin debuted on the broadcast, revealing <u>the president's job rating is below 40 percent in all three states.</u>

AUGUST 27, 2017 -- **Gov. John Kasich (R-Ohio)** exclusively ruled out a 2020 run with Gov. John Hickenlooper (D-Colo.) this morning on "Meet the Press," telling moderator Chuck Todd: "The answer is no."

"First of all, you couldn't pronounce it. And secondly, you couldn't fit it on a bumper sticker," said Kasich. "Because Hickenlooper and I work together, cynics out there say, "Well, they want something." Because we want to stabilize health care and make sure that poor people have something, people assume there's a motive."

He also addressed President Trump's pardon of Arizona Sheriff Joe Arpaio earlier this week: "It absolutely should be out of bounds for somebody to use that as some sort of a political wedge." Watch the full interview.

Ohio Sen. Sherrod Brown (D) also exclusively joined this morning's program, sharing with Todd that he speaks with U.S. Trade Representative Robert Lighthizer "at least every two weeks" and that they're "talking about NAFTA renegotiation, how we do it." Watch Brown's full interview, including the difference between his support for southern border fence versus the president's call for a wall.

The network broadcast also addressed Hurricane Harvey with **FEMA Administrator Brock Long** live from FEMA headquarters and **"NBC Nightly News" anchor Lester Holt** live from the ground in Corpus Christi, who shared he's "seen very little in terms of recovery." Long told Todd that "it's going to be years" of recovery effort and that FEMA has the "reserves and the funding to be able to support the policies in regard to the National Flood Insurance Program, with which "Congress has a lot of work to fix."

SEPT. 3, 2017 – In an exclusive interview on "Meet the Press" this morning, **Sen. Roy Blunt (R-Mo.)** reacted to North Korea's nuclear test conducted overnight, telling moderator Chuck Todd: "The president putting everything on the table is not a bad thing right now, both for North Korea, but maybe, more importantly, for China to be thinking about how consequential this behavior is." He added that North Korea has been "the number-one topic, month after month" in the Senate Intelligence Committee.

NBC News correspondent **Ron Allen** joined the broadcast live from Seoul, South Korea, and NBC News chief foreign affairs correspondent **Andrea Mitchell** offered analysis of the president's tweets this morning, telling Todd that "the word 'appeasement' is just such an insult to South Korea, which is sitting there right in target range."
