PUBLIC AFFAIRS RELATED PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

The following summarizes a representative sample of programming that provided the most significant treatment of community issues during the past quarter. Programming frequently deals with more than one issue.

Education in Moberly - Thursdays at 9:10 am (Education and Youth Issues)

An interview, 3 to 7 minutes each, with staff and administrators with the Moberly Public Schools and Moberly Area Community College.

Education in Macon - Fridays at 9:10 am (Education and Youth Issues)

An interview, 3 to 7 minutes each, with staff and administrators with the Macon Public Schools.

University of Missouri Extension Report with Max Glover - Saturdays at 6:25 am (Agriculture and Conservation)

A weekly 2 minute feature on research and events featured by University of Missouri Extension.

The President's Weekly Radio Address - Saturdays at 7:25 am (Federal Government)

Presidents Barack Obama and Donald Trump address the nation with a short address on issues important to the nation.

Outdoor Report - Sundays at 6:15 am (Agriculture and Conservation)

A weekly 4 to 5 minute interview with an agent from the Missouri Department of Conservation about conservation issues and events.

Legislative Interviews - Various Times (State Government)

We do weekly 5 to 8 minute interviews with area lawmakers that air at various times throughout the weekend, adjacent to newscasts.
