Noticiero Estrella TV

Estrella TV operates a news division Noticiero Estrella TV. The division airs 2 half-hour news programs also titled Noticiero Estrella TV (Estrella TV News) and "Cierre de Edición" ("Final Edition") which both air Monday through Friday. The division is also joined by two daily news magazine programs, I Testigo ("Witness"), an hour long entertainment "news" focusing on user-generated citizen journalism content of news events and social issues from around the world, and the half-hour "Alarma TV" ("Alarm TV"). Every day, the Latino community in the United States has accurate

and timely information about all the events at the national level and in their countries of origin.

Locally Produced News & Public Affairs Programming

"Noticiero Arkansas" is a 30-minute weekday newscast which is hosted by Andrea Guzman and News Director Karen Espinoza. It airs twice daily every Monday through Friday and addresses up to the minute local, national and international news stories. The **Weekend News Edition** is a recap of the daily newscasts which airs every weekend on Saturday and Sunday.

"Spotlight Latino" is a 30-minute Spanish language news magazine which is hosted by Rolando Ochoa and Rodolfo Portillo. It airs every weekend on Saturday and Sunday. Weekly topics vary but include interviews with local community leaders, reports on topics of public health and safety, matters concerning education in the local community, matters concerning changes to the nation's immigration laws & regulations as well as other local issues and events.

"Estilo de Vida" is a one-minute health spot with host Julie Joyce which airs daily.

These are all produced locally to address current issues of local and community interest. The following are some of the stories which addressed these issues during this reporting period.

Virtual Citizenship Class

May 14, 2020 Noticias Arkansas

Amidst the pandemic, the Springdale Public Library held an important virtual class about the process of becoming a citizen. A special guest spoke to community members who are in the process or might be interested in doing this process to start gathering all the material and learning about the steps needed to change their legal status in the US.

HWOA Help during pandemic

June 18, 2020 was a history day for more than 700,000 young immigrants in the US thanks to a decision of the Supreme Court that voted anonymously against Trump's orders to cancel DACA. The pro-immigrants organization, Arkansas United, gave out a statement about what this decision means to these dreamers.

Vaccines and Doctor Visits during the pandemic

A pediatrician at Arkansas' Children's Hospital spoke with us via Zoom about the importance of parents continuing to take their children to the doctor for routine checkups even though we are in the middle of a pandemic. The doctor gave important information about the steps they are taking at the hospital and their clinic

COVID-19 Tests

We spoke with Amanda Echegoyen from Community Clinic NWA who explained how they are operating during the pandemic and how people can get tested.
