July 1ST, 2018 SWACO RECYCLING 30M

July 8th, 2018 Women and Girls Fest 30m

July 15th, 2018 National Urban League Conference 30m

The National Urban League Conference is the largest annual civil rights conference. It lasts four days from Wednesday to Saturday. It kicks off with a keynote address on the State of the Urban League by NUL president Marc Morial, and ends with Community & Family Day and young professional's leadership development training. It attracts thousands of the nation's most influential community leaders, together with top policy-makers, business leaders, leading experts, celebrities and media for four days of dynamic dialogue, networking and entertainment.

July 22nd, 2018 National Urban League: Tech Connect and Careers 30m

The goal of the conference is to engage attendees in discussions of the pressing issues facing African Americans and solutions to address these challenges. The major issues that are discussed at the conference include social and economic inequality across America, improving education in disadvantaged communities, increasing jobs and job training, health and quality of life issues that threaten the lives of African Americans and other minorities, creating quality affordable housing options and creating small business opportunities in African American communities. The theme of this year's conference, *Save Our Cities: Powering the Digital Revolution*.

July 29th, 2018 Topic: Prevention Action Alliance 30m

Prevention Action Alliance offers several programs designed to assist healthy communities in the prevention of substance misuse and the promotion of mental health wellness. Each of our programs is based on a solid foundation of research and evidence proven to effect change and prevent drug use in your community by changing community norms around drugs, reducing the access and availability of those drugs, addressing media messages that promote drug use, and creating or strengthening policies and enforcing those policies to reduce drug use.

August 5th, 2018 Topic- Youth Summit 30m

This civic engagement event will give voice to opportunity youth, ages 16-24, regarding policy solutions for violence, youth justice and restorative justice. During the program, there will be opening youth speakers and youth presenters who will engage in a community civic discussion with local officials. One speaker, 17-year-old Klyer Collier, spoke of how he was "in trouble, kicked out of the house ... skipping school. Terry helped me." With Green's encouragement, "I graduated in 2018 and plan to join the U.S. Marines." Another speaker, DeJon "Deej" White, reported how he, too, had been "kicked out of the house" as a teenager, joined a gang and spent time in prison. The goal is to allow the opportunity youth to share their personal stories and opinions on what is needed from family, community, and public officials for today's youth to thrive

September 2ND, 2018 Topic: Black Girls Commission 30m

Issues like poverty, homelessness and infant mortality are amongst the greatest concerns affecting black women in Columbus, according to city councilwoman Priscilla Tyson, a proud supporter of the commission. She says, "if we start early with our girls we're hopeful that we don't continue to see the same issues that affect our women when the girls become adults." In Ohio, black women are twice as likely to live in poverty as compared to white women with a similar education. In fact, according to the U.S. Census (2015-2016), between the ages of 18-34, black women experience the highest rates of poverty in the state.

September 9th, 2018 Topic: Health and Hoops 30m

Molina Healthcare cares about your child's health and is committed to connecting you and your family to quality health care services. Molina is hosting a basketball clinic in Columbus, OH with the Cleveland Cavaliers. This clinic is free and open to the public.

September 16th, 2018 Suicide Prevention/Mental Health 30m

Quiet thoughts on a canvas is hosting the Unmasking the Madness event. This event will be a conversation about suicide in the black community. Panelist includes Alvis Moore, Destin McKee, Dr. Jesse Sanders and more. The event also included live painters and artist who will create artwork around the topic. Quiet Thoughts on a Canvas is an organization that brings awareness and understanding to topics never discussed through live painting and conversation. Our goal is to give a visual representation of mental illness that allows for people to think twice before judging those who suffer from a mental illness. We find that those who are not educated on mental illness will continue the stigmas associated with mental illness. Through the use of visual arts and conversation, we find this to be a friendly and healthy way to change the way mental illness is portrayed.

September 23rd, 2018 Topic: Ovarian Cancer Alliance 30m

The mission is to promote early detection of ovarian cancer with advocacy, education, awareness, and public outreach to improve outcomes and help save lives. We also work to support women who have been diagnosed with ovarian cancer as well as their family members.
