- 1. COVID Each station in the group covered the ever changing status of both the County and the State with it's ever changing rules and Department of Health directives. Each station in group ran an average of 12 minutes a day coverage.
- 2. BUSINESS ISSUES On all stations we aired what County offices were open, what hours they were operating and what special conditions they require the community to follow. Most offices returned to pre normal operations
- 3. TRAVEL AND TOURIST Maui reached pre-pandemic levels of visitors with air lines fully booked, hotels at 82 % capacity and road traffic being at times overwhelmed.
- 4. FOOD SERVICE OPERATIONS With all restrictions lifted, food service establishments are having trouble staffing the hours they want to be open. Unemployment is 3.2 %
- 5. HEALTH CARE/HOSPITAL STAFFING The hospitals on Maui experience staff shortage which caused several areas of health care not being handled on Island and the need to move patients to other Islands. Kaiser staff walked out due to strike.
