“WJSV provides “COMMUNITY NEWS” twice per hour at the 15:00 and 45:00 minute marks. This segment provides local area residents with weather and local news. Student news producers pulls local stories from MorristownGreen.com, The Daily Record, and NJ.com.

Science and Technology Issues

“WJSV provides listeners with an Educational Science segment called “Earth Sky”. This segment runs at the 30:00 mark each hour. “Earth Sky” provides WJSV with pre-recorded minute and a half science updates that provide local listeners with information on astrology, biology, weather and the environment.

Public Service Announcements

“WJSV runs both local and national public service announcements three times per hour. Local spots include the NJ State Interscholastic Athletic Association campaign for “good sportsmanship” in sports. The Union County (neighboring county) recycling program provided WJSV with a pre-recorded spot which urges listeners to recycle. The stations national PSA’s include; “Wounded Warriors”, “US Homeland Security”, “No Pet Store Puppies”, and “No texting and driving”, among others.

School Based Activities

“WJSV promotes and supports school activities. The station provides play-by-play coverage of the school football team and this year for the first time covered a boys soccer match. This winter sports season, the station plans on broadcasting all of the boys basketball games. Within the sporting event broadcasts are promos for the schools sports video channel; “Colonial Corner Sports” on YouTube. This provides area residents with high school sports coverage that they won’t see anywhere else.

In addition to sports, WJSV reads live promo copy for school charitable events, school concerts, school theater productions, and other club functions.

Community Based Station Tours

On occasion, tours will be given to local girl scouts, brownies, boy scouts and cub scout groups. The station is also present at the annual eighth grade showcase, where station DJ’s highlight activities at WJSV for Morris School District eighth graders who will be entering high school the following year.
