<b>1</b>	Minimum Wage Increase	Local News	1/1/24 6:00 PM & 10:00 PM	2 minutes	Alaska Minimum wage will increase from 10.85 an hour to 11.73 an hour
<b>2</b>	Alaska Airlines	Local News	1/10/24 6:00 PM & 10:00 PM	3 minutes	Alaska Airlines is ground its fleet of Boeing 737-9 MAX planes while it waits for inspections by the Federal Aviation Administration, prompting a cancellation of all those flights. Impacted guests will be re-accommodated on other flights.
<b>3</b>	Grocery Store Merge	Local News	1/22/24 6:00 PM & 10:00 PM	3 minutes	A lawsuit is seeking to block the Albertsons-Kroger merger which seeks to combine two of the largest grocery companies in the country.
<b>4</b>	Alaska Hunting and Fishing Licenses	Local News	1/30/24 7:00 AM & Noon	4 minutes	Lawmakers are considering a measure that will tighten residency requirements for Alaska hunting and fishing licenses. To qualify you would need to spend at least six months in Alaska each year, and not just own a home in the state.
<b>5</b>	Aggressive Moose	Local News	2/8/24 7:00 AM & Noon	4 minutes	After a teenage girl was trampled by a moose, the public is reminded to give moose a wide berth. High snow pushes moose onto sidewalks and streets where it is easier to walk. Also warned the public not to feed the wildlife.

Gave reasons for the change, and reasons why the changes would not be good. Also stated almost every state is considering ending daylight saving time.
