### **OTHER SERVICES**

NEWS: All Townsquare Media of Dubuque stations carry news of the American Broadcasting Company and six local newscasts each weekday supplied by KWWL-TV.

WEATHER: Townsquare features full access to satellite and radar transmissions of current conditions. WJOD is associated with Weathertime, a private weather service that has a much better track record than the National Weather Service, is faster with their reports, and is especially valuable to the Dubuque area's extensive agricultural community. The other four stations receive their weather from KWWL-TV.

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS: Townsquare of Dubuque stations average well over 20 locally oriented public service announcements per day for various non-profit groups in the tri states.

# Quarterly Issues Programs List Station: WJOD-FM

January 1, 2019 through March 31, 2019

### Section I. Issues

The station has identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this guarter:

- A. Animal Welfare: Discussed animal adoptions and responsible pet ownership. According to Laura Merrick CEO of the Dubuque Regional Humane Society the number of abandoned and abused animals admitted to the facility has risen by 30% over the past two years. Many of them are rescued animals from other parts of the country.
- B. **Homelessness:** Discussed the need for more shelter space for the homeless population in the area during the winter months. According to Jon Kelly from Almost Home shelter [inside St. John's Lutheran Church], the need for more beds [especially for men] is growing. Most area facilities are at capacity most nights and some people have been turned away. Another issue is the lack of volunteers to monitor the residents in the current facilities. Men over the age of 18 are needed immediately.
- C. **Parenting Resources:** Discussed the challenges facing new and expecting parents with Shelby Wartick of the Dubuque Stork Affair event. She related how difficult it can be for parents to find the resources they need to take care of their newborns. She provided important information about when and where to seek help in regards to topics like healthcare, daycare, education and finances.
- D. Childhood Hunger: Discussed the shortcomings of the Head Start program and the need for additional resources to feed young children [ages three to six] when school is not in session. Danielle Meyer from Operation New View in Dubuque related that up to 60% of the families participating in the Head Start program struggle to provide their children regular meals during school breaks. She also told our listeners about the Belly Bag program that provides nutritious and easily accessible food for these children.
- E. Overcoming Poverty: Discussed systemic poverty with Caprice Jones Director of the Fountain of Youth self-help center. He related the difficulties in overcoming individual circumstances and breaking the cycle of poverty. He talked specifically about how hard it is for those who never finished school and those with criminal records to find sustainable employment and decent housing.
- F. Gambling Addiction: Discussed the effects of gambling addiction in the community and the resources available to help those afflicted. Mary Neubauer, Director of Public Relations for the lowa Gambling Treatment Program, related that the number of people from our area seeking treatment has increased by 15% over the past year. And she believes this number is likely to increase with the addition of sports wagering at our two, local casinos sometime later this year.
