Local

HAMMOND: School City of Hammond teachers voiced their frustration over contract negotiations during Tuesday's school board meeting. The district still hasn't reached an agreement with the Hammond Teachers Federation, nearly two months after the state's deadline.

HAMMOND: Hammond Mayor Thomas McDermott Jr., has announced that due to the extreme cold expected this week, the City of Hammond has identified several buildings as warming centers, including: the Jean Shepherd Center, Hammond Civic Center, and Hammond Sportsplex.

LANSING: Some residents in Lansing and the surrounding area have recently been asking themselves, "What's that smell?" Described by many as a gas-like odor, the smell — which was first noticed last week — has caused some to take to social media to seek answers, while others have contacted Village departments, Nicor, and other entities to share their concerns.

LANSING: Mt. Zion UFL Center partners with Illinois Partners In Hope to distribute a variety of donated food once or twice a week. These pop-up pantries are open to anyone, and no ID is required.

CRETE: Fire Department is hiring. Work in a community that wholeheartedly backs its first responders.

CRETE: Due to inclement weather, trash will be picked up a day early

GENOA: Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) announced the allocation of nearly \$2.4 million in grant funding to eight Illinois communities.

GENOA: The Genoa Township Park District in DeKalb County received \$102,800 to acquire a 10-acre parcel of farmland by existing parkland.

I interviewed, Monica Murray, a doctor of audiology with United Health Care and nationally recognized hearing expert. About 48 million adults experience some degree of hearing loss. Researchers say half of people between 12-35 are a t risk of hearing loss due in part to exposure to loud sounds, including music pumped through personal audio devices. One thing Chicagoans can't help but notice when scrolling through news feeds: the number of violent crimes committed by defendants while they were out either on parole, probation or awaiting trial. That's not surprising given the long-term decarcerating trend in Cook County that's left the county's jail population at the lowest level in 40 years. Cook County Chief Judge Tim Evans started a no bail/low cash bail policy in 2017, resulting in a growing number of pretrial defendants out on bond who are then charged with new crimes, as we reported here. The state's new SAFE-T Act has taken that policy even further. In September 2023, Illinois became the first state in the country to eliminate cash bail altogether, while the law also reduced the types of crimes for which defendants could be detained before their trial.

CYBERATTACKS: A GLOBAL IDENTITY CRISIS

I interviewed Michelle Alvarez, Strategic Threat Analysis Manager, IBM X-Force. A global identity crisis is emerging with a 71% spike in cyberattacks and billions of compromised credentials accessible on the Dark Web. In 2023, cybercriminals saw more opportunities to log in vs. hack into businesses, leveraging users' valid accounts unbeknownst to them. This was one the most popular "ways in" for cybercriminals last year.

There was a 266% rise in info-stealer malware designed to specifically steal credentials for user access to emails, bank accounts, crypto wallets and more. Gaining access to user accounts will become increasingly easier for cybercriminals as they begin to leverage AI for their malicious objectives. Just last year there were over 800,000 posts on the Dark Web focusing on AI and GPT, reaffirming cybercriminals' interest in these technologies.

Diversity Key to Research to Advance Brain Health

Right now, one in five Americans struggle with a devastating neurological condition: Alzheimer's disease, Parkinson's disease or

serious mental illness. Combine that with the fact that people are now living longer than ever and the chances of being diagnosed with a brain disorder increase as we age, and clearly something needs to happen.

That something is brain donation for neuroscience research – particularly by communities of color. The speed at which research focused on unraveling the complexities of neurological, neurodevelopmental, and neuropsychiatric disorders can advance depends upon the availability of donated brain tissue. Yet, relative to donations of other organs for transplantation and research, brain donation is severely lagging.

The institution is home to the South Side of Chicago's only Level 1 Pediatric Trauma Center and the University of Chicago Medicine Aeromedical Network (UCAN), which provides helicopter transportation from the scene of an emergency to our Hyde Park campus or between hospitals within a 200-mile radius.

Dr. Pratt is the founder of MedCeep. Their mission is to address the problems of poor healthcare, low health literacy, violence, lack of access to quality healthcare providers, and systemic injustices that have plagued our communities for generations. We focus on empowering underrepresented minority youth to become trained in recognizing and responding to the most prevalent life-threatening emergency scenarios while being exposed to health-related careers, in hopes of increasing representation in the field of medicine. We aim to sustainably combat pervasive health care disparities that more commonly impact the underserved communities we work with.

CAR INSURANCE PREMIUMS ON THE RISE

I interviewed David A. Sampson, president, and CEO of the American Property Casualty Insurance Association (APCIA). It's no surprise to drivers around the country, auto insurance premiums are on the rise. Many drivers are facing double digit increases and as inflation slows down many drivers wonder why their rates have increased.

The answer is for the simple reason that the cost of the things that auto insurance pays for has been rising faster than premiums. This is exacerbated by inflation trends, legal system abuse, and in some states, regulatory uncertainty.

In just the last year, auto claim losses and expenses spiked to more than \$1.12 for every \$1 in premium. U.S. personal auto loss ratios, which compares losses -- excluding expenses the insurer incurs to operate -- to premiums, spiked to 85 percent in the fourth quarter of 2022, reaching the highest quarterly loss ratio in more than 20 years.

Some of the key contributors to rising costs include insurance claims inflation, which has continued to rise faster than the underlying consumer price index (CPI).

Dangerous driving behaviors are also having an impact on costs. As daily driving patterns and traffic volumes rebound from pandemic lows, traffic fatalities remain alarmingly high.
