This half hour series is produced by WATC TV 57 and features award-winning gospel music singer/songwriter Babbie Mason and her guests.

Tuesday, November 24, 2009 at 5:00 p.m.

Nationally-known speakers and recording artists Stacie Ruth and Carrie Beth Stoelting performed two songs and discussed their work in ministry. A focus of Stacie Beth's message to people deals with her grandfather and his diagnosis of Alzheimer's Disease. Stacie wrote a book about her grandfather and the disease called *Still Holding Hands*.

Thursday, December 3, 2009 at 5:00 p.m.

Dr. Francisco Contreras from the Oasis of Hope Cancer Treatment Center shared some of the latest developments in cancer prevention and treatment. He discussed the importance of hope in a patient's recovery from cancer.

Lu-Juan Stout, the Director of Academic Support at Lee University where she serves students with disabilities, talked about her work in Deaf Education. Sean and Jessica Hughes of Freedom Through Christ Ministries shared about the impact that a prescription drug addiction that Sean had almost cost him everything and how the couple have worked together through the challenges. 2 hours.

Bishop Samuel McGill of McGill Ministries of Lilburn, Georgia talked with Charlie Hedgecoth of Noah's Ark Animal Rehabilitation Center and Children's Care Homes. Children participate in "pet therapy" which gives them the chance to nurture the animals back to the point of returning them to their natural habitat and in turn helps the children heal from their abuse and abandonment. 20 minute interview within the 2 hour program.

Pastor Leroy Doe of Concord Baptist Church of Atlanta, Georgia talked with Stacie Ruth and Carrie Beth Stoelting of Bright Light Ministries. The ladies shared about overcoming tragedy with four of their family members dying of dementia and the calling to start the ministry to be caregivers in a hopeless situation. 20 minute interview in the 2 hour program.

Wednesday, November 4, 2009 (encore Thursday, November 5, 2009)

Host Shelley Hendrix of Church 4 Chicks talked with Pastor Adam Jernigan of Love Loud Awareness of Atlanta, Georgia. Love Loud Awareness is a non profit organization to offer help and support to youth who face self hate and self harm addictions. 20 minute interview in the 2 hour program.

Host Javen Campbell talked with Pastor Lynn Braco of Fort Myers Christian Outreach Center in Fort Myers, Florida about her personal story of overcoming the loss of her husband and the secrets that came out following his death, her breakdown, and the loss of her son to non-hodgkins lymphoma. Bishop Jeff Poole of New Hope International in Warner Robins, Georgia discussed his book *Conception to Reception: Birthing the Life You've Always Dreamed Of* about living life to the fullest. Reginald Sharpe and David Brinson also appeared. 2 hours.

Friday, November 20, 2009 (encore Monday, November 23, 2009)

James and Regina Howard talked with Elva "Precious Love" Thompson about the book *A Mother's Cry* and the signs to look for regarding domestic violence. Pastor Emmanuel Eliason of World Gospel Tabernacle in Aurora, Colorado talked about his book *Five Keys of Abundant Life: Redefining Success in a Stressed Society*. This 30-minute program is hosted by Dr. Freda Crews and features a discussion of life-related topics such as overcoming divorce, improving one's self-esteem, etc. Produced in Spartanburg, South Carolina by Bible Study Time, Inc. *Time for Hope* is a Christian mental health program that addresses issues of concern to the community. Topics featured this quarter included the following:

October 24, 2009

Host Dr. Freda Crews talked with Greg Hinnant about his latest book *Gold Tried in the Fire: Tested Truths for Trying Times*. Each chapter addresses biblical truths to help people through challenges in life.

October 31, 2009

Janet Boynes, author of *Called Out: A Former Lesbian's Discovery of Freedom*, talked with host Dr. Freda Crews about her personal story of the pain she felt and how she

came out of the lifestyle. She confronted the way today's media glamorizes homosexuality and challenges Christians to reach out to hurting people with the love and mercy of Jesus Christ.

November 7, 2009

Daniel Henderson, author of *Think Before You Look: 40 Powerful Reasons to Avoid Pornography*, talked with Dr. Freda Crews about some of the men interviewed for this book and the temptation they faced with pornography. The discussion included a look at pastors, a segment of the population who are not exempt from this temptation.

November 14, 2009

Dr. Freda Crews talked with author Deborah Howard about her book *Where is God in All of This? Finding God's Purpose in Our Suffering*. The book takes a biblical look at the ways God uses suffering to mold us as He intends us to be and is presented from the perspective of a hospice nurse who witnesses suffering and pain on a regular basis and offers a warm, wise, kind and honest biblical perspective on this subject of suffering and its impact.

November 28, 2009

Pat Williams, author of *What Are You Living For: Investing Your Life in What Matters Most*, talked with host Dr. Freda Crews about his own life experiences and also the lives of friends and acquaintances. They have it all, yet their lives seem empty and joyless. This program sheds light that all of the money, fame, power and pleasure anyone could want does not necessarily bring satisfaction and that it is important to evaluate and find a new direction if disillusioned with life.

December 5, 2009

Denise Shick, author of *My Daddy's Secret*, talked with Dr. Freda Crews about the true story of the effects of a father's secret sexual addictions on his family and its impact on them. Denise is the director of Help4Families, a Christian ministry that reaches out to family members and churches to bring understanding of the emotional pain and spiritual confusion that people face when a loved one has gender-identity issues.

December 12, 2009

Dr. Freda Crews talked with Drs. Beverly and Tom Rodgers about *Becoming a Family That Heals: How to Resolve Past Issues and Free Your Future*. Working with countless families in their counseling practice over the years, the couple developed a model of relationships that has been used successfully to heal individual and family brokenness. In this program, the Rodgers shared some of their findings to help as many families as possible.

December 19, 2009

Rich Dixon talked with host Dr. Freda Crews about *Relentless Grace: A Memoir (God's Invitation to Give Hope Another Chance)*. Rich shared a gut wrenching view of the reality and pain of the road back from tragedy through love and hope.

December 26, 2009

Hamilton Hess talked with host Dr. Freda Crews about *Hope for Holiday Grief and Depression*. Hamilton discussed the five areas that are addressed when walking the road of grief: An Invitation, Preparations, The Long Road, The End of the Road is a New Beginning, and Return to Emmaus.

Issue: Children's Programming/Teen Programming

During 4th Quarter 2009, WATC TV aired educational children's programming weekday afternoon to teach moral values and to educate on a wide variety of subjects. The programming during this quarter included the following:

Where On Earth in Carmen Sandiego? (Tuesdays and Thursdays at 4 p.m.)

This animated series is based on the success of the popular computer game. It tells the story of world-class thief Carmen Sandiego and his pursuers, a pair of teen detectives. The show teaches children about geography.

Elaine Hopkins and members of Little Hometown Soldiers appeared on the program with host Pastor Leroy Doe. The mission of Little Hometown Soldiers is to reach out and encourage youth and families to be strong, proud and courageous when their parents or loved ones are away serving the country and to also honor veterans who have put themselves in harm's way to keep the United States safe for them to grow into productive citizens. Several musical performances by Little Hometown Soldiers were featured throughout the first hour of the two-hour broadcast.

Military Christmas Greetings

WATC prepared one and two minute spots that ran throughout the broadcast day from mid-December through the Christmas holidays featuring greetings from U.S. military personnel to family members in the viewing area.
