January 2, 2014

Pat Mathis and Betty Cornett hosted this edition of *Atlanta Live*. Guests included Pastor Joe E. Edwards, Senior Pastor of The Church at Liberty Square in Cartersville, Georgia; Pastor Asa Dockery, Senior Pastor of World Harvest Church North in Blairsville, Georgia; and Pastor David Smith, Senior Pastor of Monroe Church of God in Monroe, Georgia. Also, Pastor Leroy Doe, Senior Pastor of Concord Baptist Church of Atlanta, Georgia shared about the church as well as the non-profit community enrichment organization he founded called Citizen's Coalition for Community Development, Inc. Each guest was featured in a 20 minute interview within the two hour program.

February 6, 2014

Pat Mathis and Betty Cornett hosted this edition of *Atlanta Live*. Guests included Dr. Robert Firth and his wife Dorothy who shared their story of being two residents at the Great Oaks retirement community, ages 92 and 88, who recently were married. Pastor Doug Drucker of Gospel Outreach Church, author of *And Others Had Trial...A Modern Day Job & Sermons From Death Row...Gods' Glory Shines In The Darkness*. Encouraging to see the strength, faith, and love in the struggles and trials of this man and his family. Dan Curry of Loganville, Georgia also shared his story of the faithfulness of God. Dan and his wife Nancy endured some trials and tribulations; but God brought him from despair to determination, and from testing time to testimony time. Each guest was featured in a 20 minute interview within the two hour program.

John Mauldin, M.D. of Atlanta, Georgia, author of *Life Patterns* and *Life Patterns Workbook*, shared about his findings. about in therapy. The chart showed a pattern. His book explains how patterns are formed, how people can learn where patterns come from, and learn more about how to change them. It gives people a way to be free of generational patterns and fears. Each guest was featured in a 20 minute interview within the two hour program.

Atlanta Live

WATC's flagship program airing live weeknights from 7:00 – 9:00 p.m. with an encore presentation the following weekday morning from 7:00-9:00 a.m. and again from 4:00-6:00 p.m. on 57.2.

January 21, 2014

Pastor Leroy Doe of Concord Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia hosted this edition. Guests included Mayor Benny Kashriel of Be a Good Samaritan. He shared that as part of his responsibilities, he established the Forum of Greater Jerusalem for building and developing communities in closer proximity to Jerusalem. In addition, Mayor Kashriel set up the Ma'ale Adumim Fund, which recruits funds amongst Jews and Christians around the world, for many city projects. He has also appeared in television programs and at the US Senate on behalf of the State of Israel and Ma'ale Adumim.

Also, Joseph M. Foster, author of *Outrageous Vision*, shared. *Outrageous Vision* will show you how to dream big dreams, ground your identity in what matters most, and run toward the promise of your future. Pastor J. He feels that to inspire positive behavior in the life of one kid is to change a generation.

Pastor John Philip Manuel of Elshaddai Mission Church of Atlanta, Georgia shared about his experiences around the world and also the impact that the ministry is having here in the Atlanta area. Each guest was featured in a twenty minute interview within the two hour program.

As a teen he found himself mixed up with drug dealing, gang affiliations and living in a single parent home. He seemed to be on the typical path of teens raised in single parent homes living in the inner cities until he met Jesus Christ and everything changed. He uses his past experiences to help those who might be struggling with similar challenges in life.

Yusef Poole of Atlanta, Georgia, author of *Road To Barrister: An Urban Monologue*, shared his story. Since a youth himself, Poole's passion has been working with young people to help them achieve their fullest potential. He has worked with several youth service organizations and now, tying in his faith with community involvement, is an active leader in the teen ministry of an Atlanta church.

She feels that her calling is to remind hurting people that God has a purpose for them and that God treasures us ALL.

Today, she helps others through her organization called Victimize Me No More and has authored a book titled *Hurt No More*. Dr. Tanda Joy Canion of Assembly of Truth Family Worship Center in Atlanta, Georgia shared about the work of the ministry and discussed her past of overcoming an abusive home life, poverty and depression and dealing with her father being an alcoholic. She encouraged viewers that they can overcome the obstacles in their lives. Each guest was featured in a 20 minute interview within the two hour program.

Duffley's story is an amazing testament that no matter how challenging one's situation may appear, there will always be silver linings in the midst of the obstacles and pain. In fact, Christopher's parents have used his story to advocate on behalf of pro-life groups to show that what society would often consider "damaged" or unwanted, is actually something to be considered very special.

Other guests included Khas Dock of Duluth, Georgia, author of *Shades of Grace*. Khas overcame some challenges in growing up in foster care.
