He works through the Hinton Cares Foundation, giving families practical direction, emotional support and encouragement after a terminal diagnosis. He is the author of the booklet, *Baby Steps: I'm Diagnosed, Now What?*

Celebrity talent manager and television producer Cory Taylor shares his story of having a stroke at the age of 41. He ignored stroke symptoms but cannot ignore the aftermath. He is speaking as a National Ambassador for the American Heart and Stroke Association to share warning signs and becoming familiar with F.A.S.T. The facts include:

Monday, October 28, 2019

Kandi Rose was a former stripper and prostitute who had multiple addictions of alcohol, drugs, pornography, lust & gambling. Surviving date rape, gang rape, incest from her own father, and kidnapped at knife point in urban Chicago prepared Kandi to minister God's Word through a pure heart of compassion and eyes of understanding. She is the host of the television program *Addiction Free* where she talks with people who share their stories of being set free from addictions. Hosts Sandra and Erol Onal. Sixteen minute interview within the ninety-minute program.

Tuesday, October 29, 2019

Del Turner shares "I was born in the church and left the church. I became entangled in a world of sin. I had my babies out of wedlock. I attended college but dropped out. I returned to college after giving birth to twins and graduated. My son at the age of 21 had kidney failure and almost died. His twin sister at the age of 29 was diagnosed with cancer and almost died. In 2015, I was diagnosed with cancer. I say to the world that when there is a promise from God over your life, what is meant to kill you actually heals you and what the enemy tried to use to take us out, God used to take us up."

Also appearing on the program was Dominique Friend of Atlanta, Georgia. Dominique is an activist for Sickle Cell Disease awareness (SCD) and research. Dominique has captured the essence of her daily struggles with the unpredictability and pain of Sickle Cell Disease in her autobiography, *SICKLE, A Story of Pain, Purpose and Perseverance*. Hosts Dr. Deborah Isom and Vic Bolton. Sixteen minute interviews within the ninety-minute program.

Monday, November 4, 2019

Born in Korea in 1956 soon after the end of the Korean War, Steve Stirling was stricken with polio at age one. Five years later, marital and financial struggles caused his father to abandon him at an orphanage. Shortly afterward, his three-year-old sister was left there as well.

The Crutch of Success tells Steve's incredible story of early years in the orphanage, his adoption into a large, loving family in Alaska, and his determination to succeed. He earned degrees at Cornell and Northwestern Universities, married the woman who was literally the answer to his prayers, and climbed the corporate ladder with several Fortune 500 companies.

Steve seemed to have it all...but his ambition was detrimental to his health, his family, and his soul. Then God touched Steve and asked him to spend his life helping those in need. All of the experiences of his life, even polio, have prepared him for his role at MAP International—to bring life-saving medicines and health supplies to millions around the world.

Also appearing on the program was Dr. Bessie Fletcher of Winston-Salem, North Carolina. Dr. Fletcher has a heart to minister to mothers and daughters. She is the author of *Good News: God Speaks to Mothers and Daughters*. She is on a campaign to unite mothers and daughters for healing within families, communities, cities and states. Friday, November 8, 2019

Lynita Mitchell-Blackwell is a leadership expert, attorney, CPA, and certified Christian life coach. Lynita is a highly sought-after keynote speaker, Amazon bestselling author of three books on leadership and wealth building, and success coach for business leaders. Her fourth book, *Knocked Down, Set Straight: Face It, Speak It, Forgive It, Release It*, releases this fall.

Donna Boyd-Gomez of Mableton, Georgia shares her story of living with a debilitating chronic illness characterized by pain for 29 years. She says in her book *Chronic Pain, Chronic Jesus* and in her day-to-day life that "Jesus sustains, comforts and empowers." This book is a Christian self help guide on living and managing chronic illness. Monica Matthews shares her story of being a young widow with a daughter in college and how she is boldly standing for Biblical truth as a secular media personality (host of her own talk show on WSB radio), as well as various other opportunities she has had in media on larger platforms. A major take-away from this conversation will be that believers should not fear and shy away from God-given opportunities to stand boldly and proclaim truth even when speaking up may come with a price. Tuesday, November 12, 2019

Rodney Williams is an ordained pastor, author of *Club Meth to Christ*, and founder of Club Meth to Christ Ministries. His goal is to help those who struggle with the devastating bondage of addiction experience lasting freedom. Rodney lived as a drug addict and alcoholic for over twenty years of his life but that all changed the night he was set on fire in a crystal meth lab explosion. That night he surrendered his life to Jesus Christ and from that point on Rodney began following Jesus. Host Katlyn Bryan. Sixteen minute interview within the ninety-minute program.

Tuesday, November 19, 2019

Sylinda Mumphery (SylindaD) is an author, mentor, international speaker and radio talk show host. She is the founder of SylindaD's Girls to Pearls Mentoring Program and Removing The Bandages Women's Movement. She also serves as the Co Facilitator for My Sisters Keeper Cordele. Her movement is very powerful and allows her to grace many platforms and stages as she speaks into the lives of women encouraging them to expose their wounds, undress the mess and allow healing to begin.

SylindaD's Girls To Pearls Is a Mentoring Program that teaches young girls the art of becoming a lady, loving themselves and making decisions based on integrity, morals and character, while walking in their power and purpose. Its mission is to stimulate the minds of young girls everywhere as they learn, grow and understand the importance of empowering their minds, following their dreams and overcoming obstacles.

Heather Roseboro of Atlanta, Georgia knows the importance of being around other Christians who can encourage and uplift one another. That is why she is a part of Removing the Bandages. She will be sharing on how to bounce back from failures.

Sabrena Barnett of Snellville, Georgia will share how she went through a time of depression after experiencing unhealthy relationships, loss of employment and raising a child alone. She rededicated her life to Christ and that changed her way of thinking and living. Today, she wants to share her story to support others who feel lost and alone. Host BJ Arnett. Sixteen minute interview within the ninety-minute program.

Tuesday, December 3, 2019

In 2007, Mishael Porembski became a widowed mother. In just five short months, she lost her husband to suicide, gave birth to their second daughter, and lost her mother to breast cancer. She craved a holistic grief empowerment program that helped younger widows, like herself, and helped her children recover from the losses they experienced. She was tired of asking, "Why did this happen to me?" and wanted to take action, healing her mind, body, and spirit through healthy choices. She asked some widowed friends to join her, and their lives changed dramatically. Not finding a program like this, Mishael developed 180 Your Life as a curriculum and Widow Strong as a nonprofit to provide fresh, dynamic support teams to better empower bereaved women and our grieving families. Host Jeff Taylor. Sixteen minute interview within the ninety-minute program.

Jeff and Renee Jansma's blended family includes Renee's young teen daughter and Jeff's young adult son who has special needs. This 'special needs family' has answered the call from God to fill a gap at their own church and create a year-round, vibrant, very active special needs ministry for people of all ages. They are also directors of a pageant for ladies and gentlemen with special needs. They share how they would like to see churches that are not already doing so to be encouraged to provide a loving community and ministry for special needs children and adults and for everyone to realize that when you minister to (or simply befriend outside the church) an individual with special needs, you are making a significant impact on their family and everyone who loves that person. Wednesday, December 11, 2019

Ellis Lucas saw no hope of salvation in the world around him. His life had spiraled into years of addiction, a violent car wreck, almost losing his life in a house fire, mounting debts, incarceration, and a broken marriage. He was ready to surrender. Only then did he begin to see the signs around him – even in the cat he swore he'd kill – that there was purpose and promise.

"My life had been so completely destroyed that I'd come to believe there was absolutely no hope of every changing, and all I had to look forward to was whatever awaited me beyond the grave—most likely judgment," Ellis shares. "But while locked up in the Clay County Missouri Jail, at the end of life as I knew it, Jesus Christ stretched out His mighty hand of grace and showed Himself along with an astonishing revelation. God loved me and had an amazing plan for my my heart and receive Him that day. And that's a message I want the whole world to hear."

In the new book, *When Ministry Meets Medicine: A Modern Motivational Journal for Holistic Wellness*, Dr. Andrea D. Willis (along with co-author and brother Pastor Antoyne L. Green) tackle a very difficult question; can medicine and ministry not only coincide but augment each other? The church has traditionally been a great source of healing. However, many have silently, and even openly, questioned if the church has lost momentum in promoting strength and healing. Miraculous healing is still possible today. Could it be possible that God also uses the advancement of medical technology and medicine as a mechanism for healing?

In *When Ministry Meets Medicine*, Willis and Green have combined their knowledge, perspective and experiences both as a physician and as a pastor to bring together two fields that, at times, seem to repudiate one another. Yes, faith is vital. And equally important is taking practical steps toward wellness. Faith without works is dead, correct?

Out of the Dust members Chris and Stephanie Teague also share their story. A husband and wife music duo that almost wasn't. Selfish love and sin-wrecked hearts ended their marriage. Yet by a thread of grace, they were restored, remarried and something beautiful was born from their mistakes. Now, they are having the time of our lives traveling the country singing songs of redemption and declaring how the God of Love transformed our hearts. Host Jocasta Odom. She Is Safe Founder and CEO Michele Rickett notes, "99% of people trafficked for sexual exploitation are women and girls; 80% of all humans trafficked are women and girls; 250 million girls are forced into marriage as children; and one in three women and girls experience physical or sexual violence in their lifetime."

While working on a fundraiser for She Is Safe, Atlanta Event Planners Gillian Marto and Deb Hull realized there was no global initiative or umbrella representative of ALL the groups, individuals and movements working to end all types of human trafficking. They founded the Safe Haven project to unify the efforts and provide a powerful, universal symbol that TRAFFICKING IS NOT TOLERATED HERE.

The International Day of the Girl (October 11, 2019) is an international observance day declared by the United Nations. It supports more opportunity for girls and increases awareness of gender inequality faced by girls worldwide. This inequality includes areas such as access to education, nutrition, legal rights, medical care, and protection from discrimination, violence against women, and forced child marriage. The Foundation has issued scholarships and assisted students to Lee University in Cleveland, Tennessee and other universities.

Rev. Leroy Doe was born in Beaufort, South Carolina. He graduated from high school and then became a graduate of SC State University in Orangeburg, South Carolina.

Rev. Doe was called into the ministry over 40 years ago. In 1984 Rev. Does was called to Pastor Concord Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia where he has now served for many years. From his vision at Concord Baptist Church, a non-profit community enrichment corporation, "Citizen's Coalition for Community Development, Inc." was founded.
