October 1, 2023 - December 31, 2023

Topic: Overcoming Addictions

During 4th Quarter 2023, WATC presented programming to offer hope to those who are struggling with addictions in their lives and present resources to help them overcome these addictions. Such programming included the following:

<u>Atlanta</u> Live

The flagship program of WATC airs weeknights from 7:00-8:00 p.m. with a rebroadcast from 2:00-3:00 a.m., 7:00-8:00 a.m. and 3:00-4:00 p.m. on WATC 57.2/The Point Television Network.

November 1, 2023

George A. Wood is an ordained minister, pastoral care counselor, recovery ministry founder, and recovery activist. A former addict and suicide survivor, George has dedicated his life to radically grace-laced, Christ-centered recovery for people struggling with addiction, mental health problems, and suicidal thoughts.

All of us are recovering from something. Whether it's an addiction, a painful incident from our past, or a daily challenge just to get by in this world, something is holding us back from the promised-land life God wants for us.

Following *The Uncovery: Understanding the Power of Community to Heal Trauma*, their debut book which released last year, George A. Wood and Brit Eaton have written *The Uncovery Devotional: Rethinking Recovery One Day at a Time* to help readers take the next step toward healing, being healthier, and happier. Having walked their own parallel journeys with addiction, mental health, suicidal thoughts, and past trauma, George and Brit know healing cannot be found overnight. *The Uncovery Devotional* provides 365 days worth of love, commitment, and compassion that will help those in need uncover and heal the bottom-line issues that cause them to struggle in the first place.

November 14, 2023

Rodney Williams is an ordained pastor, author of the books *Club Meth to Christ* and *Once an Addict, Now Free*, and founder of Club Meth to Christ Ministries. His goal is to help those who struggle with the devastating bondage of addiction experience lasting freedom. Rodney lived as a drug addict and alcoholic for over twenty years of his life but that all changed the night he was set on fire in a crystal meth lab explosion. That night he surrendered his life to Jesus Christ and from that point on Rodney began following Jesus. He will be sharing on the difference in being clean and sober and being free.

Host Dr. Deborah Isom. Sixteen minute interview within the one-hour program.

December 11, 2023

Established in February 2014, 7 Springs Ministries is a faith-based, nonprofit organization dedicated to helping restore the lives of broken people through prision re-entry programs, men's and women's rehabilitation programs, outpatient services and more.

Guests: Johnny Adams is currently the Men's Program Director. He shares how he came to Christ after 25 years of active addiction and chaos. Whitney Cosby is the Esther House Thrift Store Manager and a graduate of 7 Springs. She shares her story of reaching the point for help and entering the program. Bree-Ann Kellum is the Assistant Director of Esther House and a graduate of the 7 Springs program. She shares how she turned to drugs after a lot of loss and heartache and how accepting the Lord changed her life.

Host Nancy Lewis. Eighteen minute interview within the one-hour program.

December 13, 2023

Bobby Hayden, Jr. spent nearly ten years on the streets of Los Angeles as a person with an addiction, but now his Cardboard Box Ministries helps people across the United States find hope again. The faith-based recovery ministry moved to Hendersonville only four years ago, but the program has been working with people experiencing homelessness and people with addictions for over a decade. Hayden said it all started when he first began sharing his story.

At the young age of 8, Hayden was already becoming famous as a singer. He appeared on several national television shows, had a contract with Ed Cummings and the Gerald Purcell Agency, and became a rock and roll star. Hayden said it gave him a desire for fame, but it did not end well.

"My five minutes of fame took me down a road that was just full of despair, drugs, and self — mostly self," Hayden said. "It was a very trying part of my life, but without that, I wouldn't be where I am right now."

Hayden's sister rescued him from the streets, taking him back to Indiana, where he recovered from his addiction in the process of becoming a Christian. Cardboard Box Ministries followed soon after, as Hayden's experiences with addiction and homelessness are the basis of what he does.

"I had a lot of compassion for people who were homeless and battling addiction," Hayden said. "In about 2010 or 2011, after starting to go to church, my faith was being expanded. And when I told this story to people who were suffering from addiction, I noticed that they would lean in, and their lights would go on. They understood what I was trying to tell them."

October 17, 2023

Dr. Saundra Dalton-Smith is a board-certified internal medicine physician, author and popular speaker who shares biblical truths to help heal the body, mind and spirit. She will be sharing about two of her books: Sacred Rest and Set Free to Live Free.

November 7, 2023

In his book, Your Next Leap of Faith: How to Hear God's Voice and Boldly Follow, Shane Winnings shows how hearing God's voice changes the trajectory of your entire life and infuses readers with courage to cast off the world's crushing expectations and go all in for Christ. From the ashes of the emotional pain and dysfunction, Tom and Donna each found the God of all comfort bring healing. Half hour series featuring Dr. Freda Crews and her guests. Airs Thursdays at 11:30 a.m. (through 8/31/23) and Wednesdays at 11:00 a.m. (starting 9/6/23) on WATC.

Suddenly, instead of leaving as she thought he was doing, Bullock grabbed the scissors she had been using and stabbed her nearly 30 times. The attack left Natalie not just with cuts but with a skull fracture and bleeding on her brain. She would have to re-learn how to walk, how to talk, and how to read.

Today, Natalie is a domestic violence advocate and shares her story to help educate others.

Series of fifteen minute programs that air Wednesdays at 10:30 a.m. on WATC and as filler programming following movies on WATC 57.2/The Point Television Network. Host BJ Arnett. WATC TV 57 Original Series.

Public Service Announcements

Public service announcements on a wide variety of health topics offering tips and access to resources aired on WATC 57.1 and 57.2 during the quarter. Approximately 15 minutes per day on WATC 57.1 and 15 minutes per day on 57.2 are devoted to airing public service announcements from many different areas including health-related announcements.

As a non-commercial educational broadcast station, WATC TV provides quality E/I children's programming to its viewers as well as programming to educate parents on issues that will be helpful to them. In addition, the station covers topics to educate and inspire teenagers and young adults. Such programming during 4th Quarter 2023 included the following:

Scaly Adventures

The *Scaly Adventures* cast, composed of Pierce, Tanya and Rick Curren, traveled the world featuring many different animals, as well as their own reptiles. The purpose of the show is not only to teach what reptiles are really like, but also to inspire kids through family-friendly programming. Each episode focuses on teaching children how they should "interact with, care for, and protect animals." Airing Saturdays at 11:30 a.m. on WATC and Fridays at 4:00 p.m. on WATC 57.2/The Point Television Network.

Missing

Missing is a weekly half-hour educational/informational series focusing on actual cases of missing persons. The series, which is appropriate for family viewing and children ages 13-16 in particular, provides information and descriptions of missing children, including endangered runaways as well as victims of abductions. The show also presents peer-to-peer advice on safety in public places and in cyber space, including real-world examples of how to avoid potentially dangerous situations. The program emphasizes taking active responsibility for personal safety and promotes situational awareness, presented in a calm and non-threatening manner suited for teenagers. E/I age range is 13-16 years old. Airing Saturdays at 10:30 a.m. on WATC and Fridays at 4:30 p.m. on WATC 57.2/The Point Television Network.

Biz Kids

Biz Kid\$ is a weekly half-hour series focusing on financial literacy and entrepreneurship for teens, targeting 13 to 16-year-olds. Using a mix of strong financial education tools, dynamic sketch comedy, and inspiring true stories of young entrepreneurs, Biz Kid\$ provides important information for future success. Each episode features math, language arts, and social studies as well as teaching teens about money and business. Airing Saturdays at 11:00 a.m. on WATC and Thursdays at 4:00 p.m. on WATC 57.2/The Point Television Network.

Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World

Elizabeth Stanton has been a world traveler her entire life. From an early age she has experienced the culture of Europe, the wonders of the Far East and the natural beauty of remote destinations. In her own syndicated television series, *Elizabeth Stanton's Great Big World*, Elizabeth travels the globe with her celebrity friends exploring other cultures, learning about history and finding opportunities to help out those in need, while shedding some light on what others less fortunate are dealing with.

Elizabeth is very passionate about giving back and is a supporter of Marines Toys for Tots Foundation, donating thousands of toys to the organization over the last few years. In addition, she has donated money earned from her show to the homeless men, women, and children of Los Angeles, ultimately helping to feed over 4000 families in Los Angeles for two months.

She continues to film new episodes of *Great Big World*, which recently celebrated a 100th episode milestone. E/I age group 13-16 years old. Airing Saturdays at 9:00 a.m. on WATC and Thursdays at 4:30 p.m. on WATC 57.2/The Point Television Network.

DragonflyTV

DragonflyTV is an Emmy-Award winning science education television series produced by Twin Cities Public Television. The show aired on PBS Kids from 2002 to 2008, with reruns until 2010 on selected stations. Seasons 1–4 were cohosted by Michael Brandon Battle and Mariko Nakasone. Seasons 5–7 were hosted by Eric Artell and are produced in partnership with science museums. DragonflyTV was created in collaboration with Project Dragonfly at Miami University, which founded Dragonfly magazine, the first national magazine to feature children's investigations and

discoveries. DragonflyTV pioneered a "real kids, real science" approach to children's science television and led to the development of the SciGirls television series. [1] DragonflyTV and SciGirls were funded in part by the National Science Foundation to provide a national forum for children's scientific investigations. America's Heartland

America's Heartland is a weekly half-hour series featuring everyday Americans and their families, telling fascinating stories across America's heartland. From learning how to make maple syrup to riding with teenage ranchers, this series explores the various ways of life in the current United States, while showcasing the diversity of how people live and work. Each episode visits several locations and introduces teen viewers to ordinary Americans who sometimes have extraordinary occupations. In 2013 their son Judson was born in Pennsylvania. After going through the adoption process with little knowledge, she knew it was her mission to help others considering adoption. In 2014, after being told by doctors that she would likely never get pregnant without medical intervention, she found out she was pregnant with her son Tucker.

Allison entered a pageant in 2015 as motivation to lose baby weight but soon realized she had a much greater mission in pageantry. 'Making EVERY child feel special, loved, and wanted through the Queen of Bags initiative' became her platform. She has tirelessly worked to raise awareness on adoption and fostering, the Ronald McDonald House Charities, Camp Dream, and ways of giving back to our greatest assets, children.

She began her "Queen of Bags" initiative in 2016 after learning that children in foster care often do not have a bag of their own and many times are given trash bags or Tupperware containers to hold their belongings. To Allison, this was unacceptable. She had to stop it. It is now Allison's goal to have duffle bags in every DFCS in the United States so that no child is given a trash bag for their belongings.

November 14, 2023

At the age of 8, Deborah Addington accepted Christ as her personal Savior and fully understands how God can and does speak to children. Her devotion to Him led her to surrender her life at a Christian camp when she turned 16. For over four decades, she has been passionately involved in Children's Ministry, serving as the Children's Director at three different churches, including the groundbreaking role of being the first full-time Children's Director in Gordon County at Belmont Baptist Church.

Currently, she is the Director for IGNITE 3:16, Inc. in Georgia. Her primary focus and passion is to see children embracing God's love, accepting Him as their Savior, and being guided to follow and serve Him throughout their lives and accomplishes that goal by connecting local churches with local elementary schools.

Host Dr. Deborah Isom. Fifteen minute interview within the one-hour program. Georgia-based non-profit.

November 20, 2023

Linda Gunter will be sharing about the work of Love Him Love Them, a non-profit organization that she and her husband founded. From what started with the Gunters starting a homeless shelter to help those in need in Vine City, Georgia, their work evolved to include an after-school program, a jail ministry, providing for foster children and

special needs adults, and an annual Thanksgiving meal for homeless and homebound. In 2004, a tragic event occurred that left five children who just happened to be Haitians without a mom and dad. On the 17th day of the 7th month of the year 2007, the family living in the Gunter home grew from 2 to 7 with these children who were then the ages of 7 to 17. Because of their new Haitian children, the Gunters and Love Him Love Them increased their focus to include Haiti.

The first trip to Haiti was in 2011, which was the year after the devastating earthquake. They took gifts that first year for 17 girls in an orphanage named HUG. What they saw, smelled and experienced completely wrecked them. They knew something had to be done. They have been back every Christmas since. This past Christmas providing gifts and food for over 1700 children and families in the local community.

Linda shared about the upcoming Thanksgiving and Christmas projects and the need for volunteers.
