Shortly after, I met a pastor who hired me to repair his church. He then invited me to an actual service. I attended, confessed my sins (including the drugs I had in my car in the church parking lot),

and accepted Christ. About ten months after I accepted Christ, I received a 20-year prison sentence for trafficking cocaine. The conviction was modified to 10 years, and I completed 5. The time I spent in prison allowed my relationship with Christ to develop. It was one of the best seasons of my life."
