July 1, 2007 – September 30, 2007

Issue: Health and Lifestyle

During 3rd Quarter 2007, WATC featured programming that educated viewers on a wide variety of health related topics to improve both their physical bodies and emotional health. Such programming included the following:

*Time For Hope*

Saturday mornings at 7:00 am

*Time For Hope* is a Christian mental health program that addresses issues of concern to the community. The weekly series is produced by Select Religious Broadcast Service in Spartanburg, South Carolina. 30 minutes. Topics this quarter included:

July 14: Guest Pam Vredevelt discussed her book *The Power of Letting Go*. Pam is a licensed professional counselor who shared about understanding and constructively processing feelings of frustration and anger and replacing that with peace and contentment.

July 21: Author Kim Eckert (*Stronger than You Think*) is a psychologist and counselor who has spent years helping women with a variety of life issues from self-esteem and body image to developing healthy relationships and healing from the past. At the heart of their struggle is not the desire to be perfect, but the desire to be whole. Kim shares that wholeness ultimately comes from God.

July 28: Author, Speaker and Psychologist David Hawkins talked about his book *When Trying to Change Him is Hurting You*. He offered practical suggestions for women who want to improve the quality of their relationships by helping the men of their lives become healthier and more fun to live with.

August 4: Author Brenda Armstrong (*Financial Relief for Single Parents*) shared about how financial hardships can be especially burdensome to single parents who have to carry the load alone. Brenda shared her perspective as a single mom who had to turn things around in her own life.

Brenda Armstrong was also featured on WATC's *Atlanta Live* program in an interview segment taped at the International Christian Retail Show held in July in Atlanta, Georgia. This interview was a 15 minute segment in the two-hour program airing on Thursday, September 20 from 7:00-9:00 pm and repeated on Friday, September 21 from 7:00-9:00 am.

August 11: Guest Alan Heller discussed his book *Learning How to Trust Again*. He talked about how to overcome what people believe is the greatest practical enemy of their emotional, physical and spiritual well-being which is the inability to trust.

August 18: Tammy Maltby, Christian speaker and TV personality, talked about her book *Confessions of a Good Christian Girl*. She discussed the brokenness and pain in her own life and in the lives of other "good Christian girls." She encouraged God's people to own

up to sin, brokenness and shame in the midst and to extend to each other the same persistent, healing grace that Jesus extends to everyone.

August 25: Becky Tirabassi discussed her book *Sacred Obsession*. She explored how people can overcome the obsessive passions that distract them from God and replace them with holy obsession.

September 1: Authors John and Kendra Smiley discussed *Aaron's Way: The Journey of a Strong-Willed Child*. This discussion was aimed at helping stressed out parents realize that they are not alone, that the strong-willed child has thought and behavior patterns that can be understood and anticipated, and that there are insights and strategies that can help them and their child on their journey.

September 8: Dr. Elizabeth Baker (*Living with Eeyore*) addressed how to distinguish a negative personality from a depressive one; genuinely listen; effectively communicate; lovingly challenge a depressed person; and apply God's Word to the situation.

September 15: Dr. Mark Crawford (*When Two Becomes Three*) discussed how to manage conflict, how to grow closer in your new life as parents, and how to work together in love to meet the needs of your newborn. The book is a tool for any new couple seeking to nurture their marriage in preparation for their new baby.

September 21: Guest Dr. Earl Henslin talked about his book *Intervention: Seven Life-Saving Steps*. He discussed with host Dr. Freda Crews some ways to encourage family members of the alcoholic or addict and how to prepare for an intervention with a loved one who has an addiction.

September 29: Steve and Robyn Bloem discussed their book *Broken Minds*. They shared how mental illness is much more subtle than many imagine and much more prevalent.

These half hour special presentations featured host Jeanne Blake and covered the following topics:



"Substance Abuse: One Family Making a Difference": Peter Bildner died from a heroin overdose at the age of 21 and his family is working now to use this tragedy to save other young people from substance abuse.

"Women and Menopause": Authors Pat Wingert and Barbara Kantrowitz (*Is it Hot in Here or is it Me?*) discussed menopause with Jeanne Blake.

"Expression of Addiction": Some view addiction as a lack of willpower, but addiction is an illness of the brain. A recent exhibit of original photographic portraits that show people in various stages of addiction was designed to help the public better understand this illness. Its creator is Dr. Howard Shaffer, the Director of the Division on Addictions, Cambridge Health Alliance, Harvard Medical School.

"Dental Health": Dr. Raul Garcia of the Oral Health Foundation discussed gum disease and how a variety of health problems such as diabetes, respiratory illness and heart disease may be linked to it.
