Wednesday, July 23, 2014

Pastor Troy Shaw was the host of this edition of *Atlanta Live*. Guests included Dr. Aaron Hartman, author of *Adopted: God's Plan "A": The Doctrine of Adoption and its Relationship to Us, the Church and All*. He shared his personal story about adoption and how hearing someone refer to an adoption as "God's Plan 'B'". Fifteen minute interview within the two-hour program.

Friday, August 1, 2014

Pastor Leroy Doe hosted this edition of *Atlanta Live*. Guests included Alicia Bell of Snellville, Georgia. Alicia shared her personal story of how she is trying to find her son who was given up for adoption when she was 15 years old. She feels that this life situation which was filled with loss and pain helps her to be able to cater to the needs of those who feel hopeless because of circumstance. Fifteen minute interview within the two-hour program.

Thursday, August 21, 2014

Betty Cornett of Cornett Ministries in Lawrenceville, Georgia hosted this edition of *Atlanta Live*. Guests included Ginger Sanders, author of *Round Eyes: An Adoptive Child's View of Love*. She shared about her experience with adopting two children from South Korea and how that led her to write the book *Round Eyes*. She has taught Bible studies and Christian classes for many years and is a chaplain along with her husband with the Billy Graham Rapid Response Team. Also, Duane and Jonie Carter along with Pam Meneguzzo appeared to share about their adoption experience. Fifteen minute interview within the two-hour program.

Tuesday, July 1, 2014

Pastor Leroy Doe hosted this edition of *Atlanta Live*. Guests included Dr. Teresa Hairston of Atlanta, Georgia who is the author of *Stop Waiting, Start Winning: Live Your Vision Now*. She shared her story of how she started her business with very little money and encourages others to follow their passion. Also, Tynesha Evans of Duluth, Georgia, shared about her books titled *Don't Let Him Practice on You* and *Encourage Yourself*. She feels that her mission is to empower families while inspiring people to see their vision turn into reality. Twenty minute interviews within the two-hour program.

Thursday, July 10, 2014

Bishop William Sheals of Hopewell Missionary Baptist Church hosted. Guests included cancer survivor, Grammy nominated songwriter and gospel recording artist Tracy Randall who shared his story of overcoming cancer. Twenty minute interviews within the two-hour program.

Bridgette shared how she had been living a self-destructive lifestyle, without any hope or meaning, without any care of who got hurt in the process. Her sins reached full peak and then the Lord gave her a dream about life and death and she chose life. Also, Dr. Riki Brooks of Sandy Springs, Georgia, shared about her work as Founder of the Gospel Fest Music, Health and Wellness Festival. Twenty minute interviews within the two-hour program.

Thursday, July 17, 2014

Host Bishop John Wesley Pace hosted. Guests included Steve Franz of Steve Franz Ministries of Grantville, Georgia. He shared his story of overcoming alcohol, pornography, gang activity and a suicide attempt to help others who may be struggling with similar issues. Twenty minute interview within the two-hour program.

Tuesday, July 22, 2014

Hosts James and Regina Howard talked with Ealum McDonald of Rossville, Georgia, author of *Anchor in the Past: A Chart for the Future*. When Ealum was 14, he witnessed his father killing his mother and has beaten as well. As a

result, he became very bitter and he suppressed those emotions and no one knew the emotional torture he was experiencing. He contemplated suicide. But he reached a point of healing and forgiveness. Twenty minute interview within the two-hour program.

Wednesday, July 23, 2014

Pastor Troy Shaw was the host of this edition of *Atlanta Live*. Guests included Kelley Latta of Kelley Latta Ministries. Her book, *Tested by Fire: Will What You Build Survive?*, poses the question "Are you living your plan or God's purpose in your day-to-day life?" If peace, joy and divine power repeatedly elude you, it may be because your plan isn't exactly what God has in mind. Fifteen minute interview within the two-hour program.

Friday, July 25, 2014

Host Jody Braselton talked with *American Idol* contestant Candice Russell. Candice shared her story of being diagnosed with Grave's Disease in 2010 which is a disease of the thyroid. She has gone through radiation treatments and surgeries and shared how she put her trust in God and this is part of His plan for her life. He shared his story of striving to be a Godly man in the flesh and not just on paper. All interviews were twenty minutes within the two-hour program.

What if everything you thought about weight loss was wrong? Lisa Lynn, a specialist in metabolic weight loss and performance nutrition, shared with viewers on the right way to take off those pounds. Lisa demonstrated some exercise moves that even a beginner can do. She also has a new book out called *The Metabolism Solution*. Lisa struggled with weight all her life and when she turned to God things started to change. She shares her very personal journey in this book. Fifteen minute interview within the half-hour program.

Harvard University research from 2014 showed how anger has a disastrous impact on life itself, reporting that an angry outburst significantly increases the chances of a heart attack or stroke within two hours of the episode, with heart attack risks increasing by nearly 5 times, and stroke risk tripling. Those researchers didn't suggest how to avoid the anger, but author Kay Camenisch has some ideas.

When she and her pastor husband directed a treatment center for troubled youth, they counseled families torn apart by disruptive teenagers only to realize the parents' unresolved anger was often the core family issue. She began her personal study of anger then, and combined it with more than 30 years in ministry and counseling with families into the recently released book *Uprooting Anger: Destroying the Monster Within*. The book's principles have been tested for over a decade in families with teens, in marriages, and with a very tough audience: men in prison. Fifteen minute interview within the half-hour program.

Thursday, August 7, 2014 (Encore presentation)

Sherry, Donna and Kelly talk with author Rick Kiser, Jr. about his personal story of his first child being born and dying on the same day and the impact on his family. He will share about the novel *Forever My Son* as well as *Carly and Friends* which helps children and adults learn how to be examples of Christ.

Kelly, Sherry and Donna talk with Jay Platt about *Living Unstoppable*. Jay is a former Marine and cancer survivor who has conquered some amazing things in his life.

Author Johnnie Jones shares his experience with shingles and what he learned through the experience. Also, Erica Barrett shares how she left corporate America to fulfill her passion and encourages others to follow their own passion.

Gospel recording artist Vernessa Mitchell sings and shares. Also, author Lakia Brandenburg (*He's Not Perfect. I'm Not Perfect. But Together We're Picture Perfect*) talks about how marriage is what you create it to be.

Dr. Jhun Cook shares what he learned at an early age about overcoming obstacles by faith and how not to allow his circumstances and situations determine his outcome. His family's faith and trust in God is what allowed them to survive multiple armed robbery attempts and a life threatening unknown disease that kept Dr. Cook bound in a hospital bed for an entire year.

In *What God Wants Every Dad to Know*, Dr. James Merritt offers ways for fathers to disciple children on money, sex, work, emotions and relationships. God calls for men to raise wise children and to teach that God's way is the right way.

Aimee Peters shared her personal story of being a teenage girl with alopecia, a condition in which hair is lost from some or all areas of the body, usually from the scalp. Because it causes bald spots on the scalp, especially in the first stages, it is sometimes called spot baldness. Today, Aimee shared how she recently went to a women's retreat and during that time discovered how important it was to overcome the fear she had felt for so long and how fear can hold you back from enjoying life to the fullest.

Topic: 8-1-1 Call Before You Dig Program

During 3rd Quarter 2014, WATC worked in conjunction with the Georgia Association of Broadcasters to educate viewers about the importance of calling before you dig to prevent injuries. WATC produced a fifteen minute program with interviewer Michael Vallone talking with spokesperson Cliff Meidl about the dangers of not calling before you dig. Cliff's bio is featured below. Encore presentation on Friday, September 26 on WATC.

When American kayaker Cliff Meidl led his United States Olympian teammates onto the field at the Opening Ceremonies of the 2000 Sydney Olympic Games, nearly two billion viewers around the world were watching this young man from Manhattan Beach, California. Many of these viewers learned of Meidl's courageous rehabilitation and recovery from a tragic construction accident that occurred in 1986.

Meidl had jackhammered into three buried power lines that sent approximately 30,000 volts of electricity shooting through him. Meidl suffered a cardiac arrest and was "gone" for more than two minutes before medics revived him. That powerful jolt was enough to kill several men, but somehow Cliff Meidl clung to life. "I guess I just had more to do in my life" he recalls.

Meidl endured a total of 15 surgical procedures within a year and spent several years on crutches while he worked toward rebuilding his life. The accident disintegrated one-third of both knee joints and severely burned his back and skull. In addition, the accident nearly forced the amputation of his legs. However, Meidl was able to save his legs through an innovative surgical procedure that graphed portions of his calf muscles for attachment onto the remaining knee joints.

After Meidl's knees had sufficiently healed, he used physical therapy to overcome his injuries. At first, Meidl turned to canoeing and kayaking for the therapeutic value. However, he quickly excelled in these sports and thrived on his ability to compete with others in an equal setting. As a result, he threw himself into an aggressive weight lifting and conditioning regimen that enabled him

to compete at the highest level. After years of hard work and dedication to his new sport of flatwater kayaking, Cliff began to make his dream of becoming an Olympian a reality.

In 1995, Meidl won a gold, silver and bronze medal in his kayaking events at the U.S. Olympic Festival in Denver, which became a launching pad toward his Olympic dream. As they say, the rest is history. Meidl made two U.S. Olympic teams, a feat that only fifteen percent of all Olympians accomplish and, more importantly, he has inspired a nation in the process. Today, the 46-year-old financial analyst is enjoying his passion--inspiring audiences. He is now sharing his inspirational story with diverse audiences all across the U.S.

Meidl has served as the national spokesperson for the Construction Safety Council and has recorded several national public service announcements and videos featured on television & radio stations across the United States. In addition, Meidl also served as national media spokesperson for the Electrical Safety Foundation International. Today, Meidl is the national spokesperson for the One Call Centers of America- a national alliance of State "call be you dig" organizations.

Finally, Meidl is the proud recipient of a number of prestigious awards for courage. He received the ARETE Award, the Philadelphia Sportswriters' Courage in Sports Award and the "Patsy Choco Award" from the Los Angeles Marathon. In 2003, Cliff was selected as an initial Olympian honoree of the Olympian Heroes series that features 20 of the most inspirational U.S. Olympians.

Meidl is also involved with his community as a Board Member of the El Camino Community College Foundation and also partners with various community foundations such as the Southern California Special Olympics and Why Can't

We Make a Difference.org. Meidl received a Bachelor of Science degree in Finance from Cal State University Long Beach and has an MBA Degree from the University of Southern California. During the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, Meidl represented the U.S. Olympic Team as Team Leader for Flatwater Canoe & Kayak.
