

To assist you in complying with the reporting requirements for children's television and the requirement that stations air "core" children's programming, we are providing you with episode-specific descriptions (the "NBC Kids" educational and informational programming block) as set forth in the attached Community Relations Quarterly Children's Programming Report for 2nd quarter 2013. The report includes information to help prepare FCC Form 398. Please note that we have not included the specific dates and times for each of the programs as that may be station-specific.

This report is divided into the following categories:

1. Educational Objectives: NBC Kids for both 2nd quarter 2013 and 3rd quarter 2013.
2. Core programming: Regularly scheduled programming furnished by the NBC Network that is specifically designed to serve the early educational and informational needs of children 16 and under. Each of these programs is identified on-air as educational and informational with the "E/I" icon, and is similarly identified to the national listing services. To assist stations with the preemption report section of FCC Form 398, we have added specific episode numbers. Please note that the age target for NBC Kids programming is identified as 2-5 years old.
3. Other programming: Programming furnished by the NBC Network that contributes to the educational and informational needs of children 16 and under, but is not specifically designed to meet the educational and informational needs of children.
4. Public service announcements targeted to children 16 and under.
5. Non-broadcast efforts that enhance the educational and informational value of NBC Network programming to children.
6. Network on-air promotional efforts, which include a schedule of NBC on-air promos for NBC Kids programming.

The regularly-scheduled children's programming and promotional content furnished to you by the NBC Network during the 2nd quarter of 2013 complied with the commercial limits of the Children's Television Act, and 47 C.F.R. §§ 73.670(a)-(d), provided that you broadcast and distributed such programming as furnished to you by NBC, and did not add any promotional or advertising content thereto other than as directed by NBC via weekly postings on APT.

## 2<sup>nd</sup> QUARTER 2013 EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

In compliance with the Children's Television regulations that became effective January 2, 1997, the **SPROUT Programming Block on NBC** features an on-air icon (E/I) indicating that each program is "educational and informational" for children. **This icon is displayed throughout each program.** Also, in compliance with the regulations, the following document, which includes "early educational and informational" objectives of **SPROUT on NBC**, must be placed in your public file.

Each of the programs listed below, which make up the **SPROUT on NBC** programming block, is specifically designed to serve the *early educational and informational* needs of children ages 2-5. All of the programs have educational objectives and messages that are central to the content and appropriate for the program genre.

From April 6, 2013 – June 29, 2013, **SPROUT on NBC** aired six shows returning from the 1st Quarter 2013. These are: **Justin Time, Lazy Town, The Pajanimals, Poppy Cat, Noodle and Doodle, and The Chica Show.**

All six shows were developed specifically for a target audience composed of children from 2-5 years of age and are diverse in the range of content and formats. Five of the shows engage elements of fantasy and imagination to express the educational content. Five of the shows (**The Pajanimals, Poppy Cat, Lazy Town, Justin Time, and The Chica Show**) have a narrative format. One of the shows, **Noodle and Doodle**, provides specific lessons on recycling materials to create art projects.

**Justin Time** features a little boy, Justin, who wants very much to master his destiny, have great adventures, and solve problems. He begins with a problem that vexes him and daydreams his way into an adventure that takes him to different places around the world, providing him with an experience to help solve his problem when he returns home. Justin is accompanied by two imaginary friends throughout his adventures; Olive, a knowledgeable playmate, and Squidgy, the morphing flying sponge, who provides commentary and comedy along the way. Some examples of Justin's lessons involve learning that it takes focus to achieve success, our failures can teach what we need to do to succeed next time, or when one path to solve a problem doesn't work, you can find an alternative way to achieve your goal. Justin promotes self-directed learning from the young child's perspective and imagination.

**Lazy Town** encourages fitness and healthful habits for preschool children. In the imaginary setting of Lazy Town, characters' eating and fitness habits are linked to problem solving in their world. The lead character is Stephanie, a young girl who guides the audience through the story as she and her friends ("human" puppets) and her Uncle (Mayor Milford Meanswell) navigate life within Lazy Town. Robbie Rotten, the underground spy and influencer who personifies the ethos of Lazy Town, is determined to ruin the health and fitness practices of Stephanie and her friends. When the kids have difficulty with Robbie Rotten, Sportacus, a gymnast/athlete prepared to answer any call for help, comes to the rescue from his home in a zeppelin-like aircraft that hovers over earth. The underlying themes of Lazy Town stress the importance of eating "sports candy" (aka fruits and vegetables), always obtaining sufficient sleep, and going outside to engage in a wide range of physical activities including playing games, competing athletically, and even building forts and play structures.

**The Pajanimals** are a group of four preschool aged puppets who live together in a house with their off-screen mother and father. They reside primarily in their bedroom, a dormitory of sorts, where they complete their nighttime routine of brushing teeth and conversing quietly before falling to sleep. The quiet time,

always turns into a discussion that results in a dream-like adventure to solve a problem, such as overcoming shyness, making a new friend, or dealing with a bully. The adventure takes place in several nighttime dream locales where special friends help them work through the social/emotional problem of the day. Specific approaches to managing the problem are demonstrated and practiced throughout the adventure. The children return home in time to get ample rest, confident about facing their issues when they awaken the following day.

**Poppy Cat**, based on the book series by Lara Jones, models the use of imagination and storytelling to encourage creative thinking in viewers. Each episode features the narrator Lara, reading a story about Poppy Cat, to her own cat (who is also named Poppy). She weaves an exciting tale following her imagination, which leads her to distant lands reached by boat, plane, hot air balloon or train. Each story features Poppy Cat, as the leader of a group of animal friends, a resident bully Egbert the badger, and other occasionally recurring characters. A prevailing message emerges within each episode to be nice to your friends and always work together. There remains an overarching implicit message within every episode as well: think creatively and exercise your mind through reading and storytelling – for these activities always lead to enjoyment and adventure.

**Noodle and Doodle**, an instructional series, features creating art projects and cooking projects around a specific theme. Host, Sean, drives around in a double-decker bus fully equipped with art supplies and a kitchen, ready for any assignment. The projects encourage parent engagement and often feature families working together to make something to display within the child's home. Sean's side-kick, Doggity, is an ever-faithful beagle who transforms into an animated character during interstitial trips to a parallel universe, set in a kitchen full of prank playing animated characters. The art projects typically promote utilizing recycled materials in order to demonstrate that creativity can transform something intended for one purpose into something that achieves a completely different goal.

**Chica** is a five-year-old “baby” chick who spends her days with her parents in their costume shop, the Coop. The shop's one employee, Kelly, doubles as Chica's nanny and the ensemble is rounded out with Bunji, a large floppy eared rabbit and Stitches, a straw mannequin that sits in the window. In each episode Chica develops or encounters a problem that she cannot immediately resolve. Usually her issues involve impulse control, distractibility, judgment, and inter-personal behaviors. She and Kelly usually work on the problem through an adventure—a fantasy transformation to animation-- where Bunji and Stitches come alive and join Chica and Kelly for the problem solving process. The core educational content is primarily socio-emotional development, and Chica learns how to express herself properly, think before she acts, and interact with others effectively. She often learns that it takes hard work and practice to become proficient at different skills.

### **3<sup>rd</sup> QUARTER 2013 EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES**

There is one new show for Q3 2013, Tree Fu Tom, a live action/animated series about a little boy who lives in a rural area and has a rich fantasy life in the woods behind his home. Tom uses specific movements to summon up magic powers that permit him to morph into an animated hero and fly around in Treetopolis, the animated version of his woods. While in the Treetopolis, Tom and his friends, Ariella, Twigs, Squirmturn and Zigzoo will invariably run into a problem or disaster that needs fixing. Tom calls upon the audience to practice original dance moves that will bring him magic so he and his friends can resolve their challenge of the day. Educational messages reinforce positive socio-emotional content, with examples that model: being loyal to good friends, knowing how to ask for help, doing the right thing instead of what is

convenient, making the effort to share rather than being selfish, or relying on teamwork in order to accomplish a goal.

Tree Fu Tom will begin airing July 6, 2013 and will replace Poppy Cat.

## 2<sup>nd</sup> QUARTER 2013 SHOW SUMMARIES

**Justin Time** is an animated show specifically directed to the preschool audience and always conveys an embedded lesson; it is possible to understand and manage any problem you have by thinking about it creatively. Justin is a little boy who has two imaginary playmates, **Olivia** (who meets him on his travels) and **Squidgy** the sponge (who also lives in Justin's bedroom). When Justin has a problem or doesn't want to do something his mother has suggested he daydreams his way into an adventure that takes him to places all around the world. On these adventures, he meets Olivia who guides him through an experience that demonstrates to Justin how he can solve his problem. The show provides many facts about the context the characters visit while on the adventure, but the central point is to teach a lesson about a social/emotional dilemma universally experienced by preschool children.

**Lazy Town** is a show featuring the importance of health, fitness, and being good friends. Set in a fantasy world known as Lazy Town, which is populated by inactive residents, we meet a visitor named **Stephanie** who is determined to coax her friends and relatives into adopting a healthful, active life style. She wins over her new friends, **Ziggy, Stingy, Trixie** and **Pixel**, convincing them to leave their gaming consoles and candy stashes at home so they can go outside and play. She persuades her uncle, **Mayor Milford Meanswell**, and his friend **Ms. Busy Body** to support her efforts. **Robbie Rotten**, who lives underground, and is determined to return Lazy Town to its former state of inactivity and quiet, constantly foils the characters' efforts. Coming to the rescue is the athlete **Sportacus** who lives in a zeppelin-like aircraft and receives signals from the kids or the Mayor whenever they need help. Sportacus has two goals, to keep the peace and to promote healthful, positive living. When Robbie Rotten is discovered and contained through comic pratfalls, he returns to his underground lair and all is well in Lazy Town, until another day and another time when Robbie will rise again.

**Pajanimals** focuses on teaching bedtime routines and practicing them consistently so children can get a good night's sleep. In each episode one of the main characters—**Apollo** the dog, **Squacky**, the duck, **Sweetpea Sue**, a horse, and **Cowbella**, a purple and white cow—has difficulty sleeping or faces a problem. They all pile onto one of the beds and are whisked off to a land of adventure that offers solutions to their problems. Each bed travels to a specific place for the adventure: Squacky's bed goes to Ellie the octopus who lives in the Big Blue Sea and to Coach Whistler who lives in Land of Play; Cowbella's bed goes to Edwin, who lives in Storybook Land and to Jerry Bear, who lives in the Big Friendly Forest; Apollo's bed goes to the Moon who is in the Night Sky, and Sweetpea Sue's bed goes to Mr. Happy Birthday, a porcupine who resides in Birthday Land, and Bedtimes Bunny who lives in the Land of Hush. Each show ends with the problem resolved and the Pajanimals tucked into their beds for a good night's rest.

**Poppy Cat** is based on the **Poppy Cat's Adventures** book series authored and illustrated by Lara Jones. A narrator, also named Lara, reads a story to her cat in each episode. This story stars her Poppy Cat, who envisions and takes his friends on imaginary adventures. The friends are **Zuzu**, a Dalmatian who zips around on a skateboard; **Alma**, a southern belle bunny who is ultra-feminine and sweetly dramatic, **Mo**, a little mouse who tries his best to do as much as everyone else despite his size; **Owl**, the wise one who is prone to neck rolls and commentary when things irritate him or don't make sense, and the grouchy **Egbert**, an arrogant and obnoxious badger who refuses to play with the group and invariably attempts to sabotage their adventures. Occasionally **Hilda**, a forgetful and ditzy pigeon who flies into their adventures, appears to

say hello or provide misguided directions to the friends. Once their mission is accomplished, the friends return to their little village and resume their cheerful, active lives. At the conclusion of her story, Lara closes her book and says good-bye to Poppy Cat, who is usually ready for his nap.

**Noodle and Doodle** is a live-action show hosted by Sean Roach that also blends animation and puppetry into the overall format. **Sean** drives a double-decker bus into various communities to meet children who have written to him with a problem that they would like to solve using an art and/or a food experience. Sean is accompanied by **Noodle**, a puppet character and **Doodle**, a digital character that lives inside a tablet computer, and **Doggity**, a faithful beagle. Doggity has a mini-show of his own through an animated alter-ego that appears during diversionary segments set in a restaurant kitchen. The show demonstrates how recycled materials can become art and how food, art, and problem solving can be combined to create a fun experience in everyday life. Every episode can be replicated at home with ease by parents and children playing together.

**Chica** is a five-year-old “baby” chick who spends her days with her parents in their costume shop, the Coop. The shop’s one employee, Kelly, doubles as Chica’s nanny and the ensemble is rounded out with Bunji, a large floppy eared rabbit and Stitches, a straw mannequin that sits in the window. Chica’s parents were formerly entertainers in the vaudeville tradition and they regale the audience with stories and songs from their theatrical past. They enjoy and indulge Chica, who sometimes acts younger than her age and gets into all kinds of predicaments. Kelly uses fantasy play to transform herself, Chica, Bunji and Stitches into animated characters in another universe, who are struggling with a problem similar to the one Chica experienced in the Coop. Without fail, they find the problem can be solved and they carry that knowledge back to the Coop to use on another day.

### **3<sup>rd</sup> QUARTER 2013 SHOW SUMMARIES**

There is one new show for the 3rd Quarter, **Tree Fu Tom**. This series focuses on the amazing adventures of a young boy called Tom who, with the power of ‘movement magic’ called ‘Tree Fu’, can transform into a tiny but mighty magical super hero and travel to a wondrous enchanted kingdom called Treetopolis that exists in a tree in his backyard woods. During each program he calls upon the audience to follow his moves to send him the magic he needs to solve a problem encountered by Tom and his friends. . These include Ariella, a butterfly who is also a rancher and has rope lassoing skills; Twigs, an acorn sprite who folds himself into an acorn when he’s frightened, Squirmtun, a pill bug who looks like a large and imposing coal miner but is often timid and fearful, and Zigzoo, a green tree frog and the resident genius inventor. In each episode there are an action adventure sequences that are key to resolving the challenge of the day.

## **THE CHICA SHOW**

### **CHICA HAS THE CHIRPPLES [ETCS109H]**

Chica tries her best to tell a joke but a case of the chirpples (laryngitis) makes it hard to communicate. Everyone at the Coop offers a remedy to no avail, and Chica is very frustrated. When Timmy, who is deaf, and his mom come into the Coop for a parrot costume, Chica sees how Timmy uses sign language to communicate. After closing time, Kelly and Chica go on their fantasy adventure to the rainforest and Chica learns that different birds communicate by acting things out and by making unique sounds. Upon their return, Chica finds that her voice is restored, and tries again to tell her joke. Kelly finds out just how funny it is.

**[Educational Message: There are many ways to communicate without spoken words, including sign language and body language.]**

### **CHICA'S JUG BAND JAMBOREE [ETCS109H]**

Kelly receives a call from Kenny who tells her that he is having a music party and needs a lot of instruments to be delivered to his house right away. They all go on a search to find all the instruments in the Costume Coop. Jet offers to deliver the instruments in a large washtub he found but Chica doesn't want to share the washtub. Eventually Chica relents and Jet delivers the instruments. When the shop closes, Kelly and Chica head to a Jamboree to perform in the band. Chica won't share any of the instruments and tries to use all of them on her own. When she performs solo trying to play all the instruments she is awful. Chica realizes that she has to share the instruments with her friends to make the band sound good. They go back on stage and the crowd loves them!

**[Educational Message: Taking turns and sharing with your friends is important when working as a team.]**

## **PAJANIMALS**

### **PRESENT FOR MOM [EPAJ102H]**

The Pajanimals are looking for gifts to give Mom for her birthday, but Apollo is having trouble finishing his before bedtime. Apollo is sad that his painting isn't finished and doesn't think it's good enough to be a present. The Pajanimals hop on Sweetpea Sue's bed and visit Mr. Happy Birthday. They ask him for help to find a present for Apollo to give to Mom but none of the gifts seem special enough. Mr. Happy Birthday discovers that Apollo has already made her a painting and explains that once Mom sees all his hard work she will certainly feel special. The Pajanimals head back home to get rest before Mom's birthday.

**[Educational Message: The most special gifts always come from the heart.]**

### **QUEEN FOR A NIGHT [EPAJ102H]**

Cowbella is being bossy and forcing everyone to play the games she wants to play and the Pajanimals are getting frustrated with her behavior. When the Pajanimals confront her about the problem her feelings are hurt. The Pajanimals hop on Cowbella's bed and visit Storybook Land for help. King Edwin turns Cowbella into a queen and the rest of the Pajanimals into her servants. Cowbella sends her servants to work, but when she realizes that she is lonely because she sent everyone away King Edwin explains that you can play with your friends but if you boss them around you will be lonely. Cowbella apologizes and the Pajanimals return home.

**[Educational Message: Friends need to listen to each other and take turns choosing games, not being bossy.]**

### **POPPY CAT**

#### **MOUNT ZUZU [EPCT121H]**

When Zuzu discovers that mountains can be named after people, he is determined to find his very own and plant his very own flag on it. Poppy and her friends go off on a hot air balloon adventure to find a mountain without a flag so that Zuzu can name it. Zuzu spots a mountain in the distance without a flag, but Egbert has already started climbing to the top with his flag. However in his rush, Egbert accidentally deflates their hot air balloon with the end of his flag. As they quickly descend, Poppy and her friends work together to avoid obstacles and come across another mountain without a name. Zuzu decides to name this mountain "PoppyOwlMoAlmaZuzu" after all of his friends. Gilda and her friends give them a lift in the balloon back home.

**[Educational Message: It is best to work together as a team when there are obstacles too big for you to conquer alone.]**

#### **PEARL HUNT [EPCT121H]**

Alma gets a new bracelet made of beautiful pearls. When Mo takes the bracelet and accidentally breaks it, one of the precious pearls fall in the lake. Poppy and friends take an adventure in the ship to Oyster Bay to go diving for a new pearl. After a long search they are ready to give up until Mo comes across an oyster that gives up one of its pearls to replace the one that was missing. Alma is very pleased and they head back to shore with the new pearl.

**[Educational Message: Don't give up when the tasks seems insurmountable because results can happen when you least expect it.]**

#### **THE VERY LARGE BOOK OF PETS [EJTM101H]**

Justin wants a pet, but his Dad warns him that he isn't ready for that responsibility. He enters his imaginary world where he, Squidgy, and Olive obtain and attempt to care for a pet elephant. It proves to be exhausting, and Justin returns home realizing that you can't "turn off" a real pet, so he will happily go to the zoo.

**[Educational Message: Sometimes things that seem fun, are actually more responsibility than we are ready to handle, so thinking of alternatives to our original desire might be better than getting what we want.]**

### **LAZY TOWN**

#### **WELCOME TO LAZYTOWN [ELZT101H]**

Uncle Milford is speaking with Ms. Busybody about his niece Stephanie coming to Lazy Town. Robbie Rotten spies from his lair and shares his vision of keeping Lazy Town the laziest town there is. When Stephanie arrives, she doesn't want to just play video games in the house, she wants to meet other children and play outside. She meets Ziggy, Pixel, Trixie, and Stingy and convinces them to come outside, where they begin to have fun playing together. However, Robbie Rotten tricks the children to distract them from active play. Stephanie is upset and speaks with her Uncle Milford, who wants to help and suggests she contact a super hero. Sportacus receives her letter and arrives in Lazy Town, where his crystal caper allows him to sense problems and he can save the children when they need it. Robbie Rotten sets a trap for Sportacus, but Ms. Busybody falls prey instead, and Sportacus, Stephanie, and Uncle Milford end up saving her. Stephanie asks Sportacus to stay in Lazy Town and he agrees.

**[Educational Message: We need to develop good eating habits and have an active lifestyle.]**

### **NOODLE AND DOODLE**

#### **LET'S FLY A KITE-AIRLINE PILOTS [ENAD101H]**

Ben, Ryan, and Kayla try to play together on a windy day. They brainstorm projects to accommodate the windy weather. Sean and Noodle make Tuna Toastie Kites by recycling the bread bag for the craft project. Meanwhile, the kids collect sticks and leaves and join Sean to make kites using the recycled products, items from nature, and contact paper. The kids take their kites to the park along with their Tuna Toasties and make the most of the windy day.

**[Educational Message: When it is windy outside, you can find objects outside and in your recycling bin to make kites.]**

#### **ART-TASTIC-PAINTERS [ENAD101H]**

Avery, Ian, and Elena want to color but only have little pieces of crayons left. They begin by brainstorming ways to repurpose and use the old crayons. Sean and Noodle then melt the old crayon pieces into new multi-colored crayons in the kitchen. They also recycle the lids of the non-stick spray to make a leaf wreath, using the new crayons for leaf rubbings. The kids hang up the wreath and take the new crayons to finish their artwork.

**[Educational Message: You can reuse your old broken crayons to make new ones in order to recycle and prevent waste.]**

Not finding a sunny beach, Kelly, in the role of an old lady, dresses Chica in winter clothes. Suddenly Chica has a fine time sledding and throwing snowballs with friends. Chica discovers there's more than one way to have fun.

**[Educational Message: If you make adjustments when plans have to be changed you will find that you can still have a lot of fun.]**

### **SNOW PRINCESS CHICA [ETCS111H]**

When Jet arrives with a special delivery package full of winter accessories, Chica puts them all on and dresses up like a snow princess. The only thing missing is the perfect princess crown. After a lengthy search Chica gets frustrated and decides to give up on the snow princess costume altogether. During Chica's fantasy adventure, she becomes a snow princess inside her castle. Missing a crown, she is offered various replacements but nothing seems to work. But when Chica and her friends collaborate, they came up with a nice crown by using their imaginations. Chica and Kelly return to the shop, and Chica finally uses her own imagination to make her own perfect crown.

**[Educational Message: Using your imagination to solve your problem is sometimes the best way to get exactly what you want.]**

### **PAJANIMALS**

Squacky asks for help to fall asleep, so the Pajanimals hop on Cowbella's bed to visit Bedtime Bunny in the Land of Hush. She gives Squacky some suggestions on falling asleep and he quickly gets some rest amid the excitement and the Pajanimals return home.

**[Educational Message: When you are having trouble falling asleep close your eyes, and take deep relaxing breaths.]**

#### **I'M SORRY, REALLY SORRY [EPAJ104H]**

When bouncing around, Cowbella accidentally spills paint all over Sweetpea Sue's Daisy Puff. The two get into a big argument and refuse to talk to one another. Apollo goes to tell Mom and she says that she will wash Daisy Puff in the morning. Despite this, the girls refuse to communicate. The Pajanimals can't sleep so they take a ride to Storybook Land where Edwin tells them that he accidentally turned his friend into a frog and feels terrible. Edwin is trying to find the magic words to make him feel better but can't find them. Cowbella realizes that she needs to say "I'm Sorry" and Sweetpea Sue needs to forgive her. They make up and return home for a good night's rest.

**[Educational Message: When you are having a fight with your friend, "I'm Sorry" are always the magic words to becoming friends again.]**

When they finally find the bird to take a picture, they discover that the bird is actually Gilda in a wig!

**[Educational Message: Don't give up when you cannot find a solution because perseverance always pays off.]**

### **WAIT, LITTLE PENGUIN! [EJTM102H]**

Justin and Mom are going to go skating and Mom has to look for her skates. He enters his imagination where he, Olive, and Squidgy try to help a little penguin that is separated from its family. They think the penguin is playful or confused, instead of realizing that the penguin was really leading the way back to its family the entire time, and the kids were just not listening. When returning home, Justin realizes he should listen to his Mom while skating, because "if I would have listened the first time . . . I wouldn't have fallen."

**[Educational Message: Listening is more than just hearing words, it's realizing the meaning behind the communication.]**

## **LAZY TOWN**

### **SPORTS DAY [ELZT103H]**

Stephanie realizes it is Sports Day, but the rest of the friends are not going to participate. Sportacus and Stephanie convince everyone to join in, but Robbie Rotten tries everything to keep it from happening –

including buying the field. He decides to compete with them for the field, and if he wins, Sportacus is banned from Lazy Town forever. Sportacus helps the kids train while Robbie Rotten devises tools to trick the kids during the competition. Sportacus puts Ziggy in charge of providing the necessary energy from "sports candy." Sportacus tells the kids that he has experienced sugar meltdowns because sugar doesn't give you lasting energy. Robby Rotten uses his candy-faker-maker machine to create a sugar apple to trick Ziggy and Sportacus. When Sportacus has a major lead during the race, Ziggy provides the fake apple to Sportacus, who subsequently has a sugar crash. Robbie Rotten is certain he will win, but the kids figure out his plot and provide Sportacus with real "sports candy." They go on to win the race.

**[Educational Message: Sports candy and energy building foods are fruits and vegetables. Sugar will not give you real/lasting energy.]**

Julia and Joseph visit their aunt and uncle and learn to milk cows. They brainstorm with Sean to make blueberry sprinkle smoothies and magic milk paintings using the milk. Sean and Noodle make the smoothies. In Doggity's segment the crew makes healthy traveling snack boxes to have for a lunch on the go. The kids come and use the leftover milk to make magic-milk using food coloring and soap, and then capture the reaction on paper. The kids share the smoothies with their family and show their aunt and uncle how to make the magic-milk pictures.

**[Educational Message: You can make a healthy smoothie and magic-milk pictures using milk].**

#### **SWEET MEMORIES-SWIMMERS [ENAD103H]**

Samantha and Jessica want to help make their grandparents' wedding anniversary special. They brainstorm ways to make a sweet memories cake using tropical fruit to remind them of their honeymoon in Hawaii and cake-toppers using old pictures. They recycle the oil-bottle lid for the cake-toppers. In Doggity's segment the crew makes hearty stuffed pasta for hard-working construction workers. The kids bring their photos to make the cake toppers. They take the cake home to surprise their grandparents and celebrate their anniversary with them.

**[Educational Message: You can make a cake to celebrate a special moment for someone you love and make a topper to make it extra personalized and special.]**

### **THE CHICA SHOW**

#### **VROOM VROOM VROOM, CHICA [ETCS112H]**

Chica is frustrated when she is "it" for a game of freeze tag because she is not fast enough to "tag" anyone and make them freeze. When the shop closes and she and Kelly go on their fantasy adventure, Chica, Kelly, Bunji, and Stitches are in an Indy 500 type race. Though she is in last place Chica perseveres and keeps going when her friends have to drop out of the race. She ultimately wins the race because she didn't give up when others had to quit. She tries her skill on Kelly when they return to the shop and she's able to catch Kelly at an opportune moment and tag for a "freeze."

**[Educational Message: Sometimes a game is won based on perseverance, not by speed. Just take things at your own pace and eventually others will have to slow down or stop. Then you can move ahead and achieve your goals.]**

### **CHICA, THE BOCKADOODLE BUILDER [ETCS112H]**

Mrs. C is taking a customer on a tour of the shop, recounting her famous costumes. Chica enters in a self-made airplane and announces that she wants to build an airport inside the shop. Despite being told by Kelly that an airport is too big for the shop, Chica persists in trying to do something BIG. She doesn't accept the idea that "small is beautiful" too. While on their fantasy adventure Chica is the "boss" of a building company, and builds Bunji a HUGE house just to fix a broken roof shingle. Bunji finds the new house overwhelming. Chica has to tear it down and return to building something much smaller. Upon her return to the shop, Chica draws plan for new shingle for Bunji's cage.

**[Educational Message: A large size isn't always the most important thing you can do to make an impression. Sometimes the small things are more appreciated.]**

The Pajanimals take an adventure to visit Coach Whistler in the Land of Play for some advice. During batting practice Apollo misses the first pitch and almost gives up. Coach Whistler convinces him to try again and he knocks the ball out the park. After the fun game they return home to rest for tomorrow's big day of baseball practice with Dad.

**[Educational Message: If you don't get something right the first time, persevere because practice makes perfect.]**

#### **NO BATH FOR ME [EPAJ106H]**

When Kelly and Chica go on their fantasy adventure, Bunji becomes the dance instructor and Chica practices the pirouette but it turns out to be the "wing and spin," a new ballet movement. Back at the Coop, Kelly and Chica continue to practice their moves.

**[Educational Message: When you want to learn something new, start with the basics and keep practicing in order to improve.]**

Chica is glad Bunji was found, but really wanted to be the one to undo her own mistake. On the fantasy adventure, Chica, Bunji and Kelly are "super heroes" in a city where Mr. Bubledeedoo (Stitches) is blowing so many big bubbles he is a nuisance.
