If the school gets the grant, they will receive the funds around December or January.

Description: Longview City officials said they received an unusually high number of health claims this year that exceed the city fund in Longview. The Longview City Council might move \$500,000 dollars into the city's health insurance fund balance. The plan had 11 claims from active and retired employees, which blew out by more than 4 times the city's \$125,000 dollar threshold. The city says the fund will not decrease the general fund balance. Miller says they have a Health Care Plan Committee who will look at how badly they missed this year's threshold and the best budget options for 2017.

Description: The almost \$21 million dollar Cherokee County budget includes raises for county employees. Counties across the state are prepping for the start of the new fiscal year, and in Cherokee County, budget season has taxpayers up in arms. Cherokee County has four precincts, each one gets a certain amount of based on road miles within the precinct. The largest is Precinct Two, with 320 road miles. Pate says they want to take \$200,000 dollars out of Precinct Two, and to disperse it to Precinct One and Four. Precinct Two commissioner Steven Morton says they are looking at dipping into their reserves for an extra \$1.2 Million dollars to even out the current budget. A Precinct Two resident says they used to have \$10 million dollars in reserve, but now they only have \$4 million? On top of that, Commissioners are proposing a 3% increase for all county employees, including a 9.2% salary increase for county commissioners.

Description: The Tyler ISD Board of Trustees approved this year's budget last night during their regular board meeting. Included, is a \$1500 raise for teachers. That's three % above the midpoint of pay scale for all other district employees. It also sets aside funding to hire more teachers, since many of their campuses have grown. Superintendent, Doctor Marty Crawford says 85% of the budget goes into personnel. Also, as the largest districts in East Texas, they want to offer competitive salaries to attract more teachers.

The goal is to reduce or minimize the impact that storm water has in these particular areas of town.

One Doctor recommends all of his patients, age 65 and older get two different vaccines to help ward off pneumonia. Getting both vaccines was recommended by the Advisory Committee of Immunization Practices.
