Lin Reynolds of Arp shared her experience with AnnaLise Coble. Her troubles started the year after she had breast implants. Her body was ravaged with pain and sickness, autoimmune disorders, thyroid problems, fatigue and other symptoms. She had her breast implants removed seven years later and asked if she could keep one. Reynolds says the implant was filled with mold and she believes it is the cause of her many illnesses. Allergan Brand breast implants are now being recalled and doctors are suggesting you have them removed.
