Last year City of Tyler police found 41 card skimmers inside gas pumps within the city limits. In Smith County and surrounding areas, they were able to seize another 96 card skimmers working with other agencies. The Tyler Police went international in working with U.S. Marshals and the Secret Service to arrest two Cuban nationals who took off to Mexico.
