Description: There are many ways to prepare your Thanksgiving turkey. One of the more daring ways is to cook it in the deep fryer. The Longview Fire Department hosted a turkey frying demonstration showing what not to do. Fire Marshall Johnny Zackary says make sure the turkey is thawed completely through, and that the temperature of the oil is around 325 degrees. He says the majority of house fires start in the kitchen, so if you are going to fry your turkey, do it outside, away from the house. He also says make sure it is on concrete, away from structures. He also does not recommend frying turkeys due to the potential dangers.

The Tyler Fire Marshall tells us that one of the most common mistakes that they see is people leave them too close to combustible items, such as a bed, or Christmas decorations. Three feet is the minimum distance the heater should be placed away from any item. Look for the ones that include the automatic shutoff if they tip over. Inspect all cords and wires for burns or corrosion. If there are any, you should no longer use the heater.

Description: This is the time of the year to take precautions to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning. The silent killer is a poisonous gas which can cause flu-like symptoms. It's especially common during the winter season since heating appliances produce carbon monoxide gases. Firefighters say homes with gas services or an attached garage are now required to have a detector on every floor of their home.
