April 7, 10-11am: The bipartisan Senate group known as the Gang of 8 is preparing to unveil their immigration legislation this week and we'll talk with one of the group's key members: Sen. Lindsey Graham (R-SC). He'll also weigh in on the upcoming budget fight, as well as the new jobs numbers out Friday as employers hired the fewest number of workers in nine months. Plus, tensions have been escalating on the Korean peninsula for days with threats of nuclear war coming from the North. Is armed conflict on the horizon or is it all for show? What do we know about the young North Korean leader? We'll have insights and analysis from Fmr. Gov. Bill Richardson (D-NM), who traveled to North Korea earlier this year, and Michèle Flournoy who served as undersecretary of defense policy under President Obama from 2009-2012.

Then: The political speculation has already begun: Could Hillary Clinton and Joe Biden end up becoming political rivals vying for the same job in 2016? Plus, why is there such a political disconnect between Congress and the public on gun control? How will that affect the prospect of anything getting passed? Bill Richardson, who faced off against Clinton and Biden in 2008 during the Democratic presidential primary, re-joins the conversation, as well as GOP strategist Mike Murphy; *Politico*'s Maggie Haberman; and NBC News Chief Foreign Affairs Correspondent Andrea Mitchell.
