Craft-Turney is providing water for residents but they must pick it up. Residents like Eric Helm are showering at homes of relatives. The water is infected with a fungicide. Larry Lowry with the University of Texas Health Science Center at Tyler says that the fungicide is a skin irritant and can cause irreversible eye damage if it gets in an eye. He recommended avoiding the water at all costs. Pets should be kept also. An informational meeting will be held at the Norman Activity Center in Jacksonville to answer questions from residents including how long the order will be in effect.

Neighbors are concerned about the changing landscape from a farm view to solar panels. Another concern is the environment and the leaching of heavy metals and chemicals into the groundwater. The company GSE Eleven LLC has a Frisco address but the owner is based in Romania.
