Linkin had been underwater for approximately 20 minutes before he was pulled out. He was assessed as not alive by paramedics who performed CPR to bring him back to life. His family was told that he would never walk, talk or eat again because of extensive brain damage. After month's a treatment at Dell Children's in Austin Linkin was able to walk out of the hospital using a special wheelchair. Since being home he has started walking on his own and saying his second first words. Linkin still has a long road of recovery. Drowning is the number one cause of death in children 1 to 4 years old. Kim Utley owner of East Texas Infant Swim says it is important to teach infants how to float and survive in water. Linkin and his sister Layla started classes at the beginning of the year. He continues to do things doctors said were impossible.

FOX51 explored how East Texans are being affected and what law enforcement is doing to combat the situation. Patti Foster was struck from behind by an 18-wheeler while at a stop light. She had unbuckled her seatbelt to check on flowers in the back seat and was thrown from the vehicle. She later learned the driver was under the influence of marijuana. Smith County Sheriff Larry Smith says they went from arresting about 10 people a year to 150 in 2018 for intoxicated driving charges. Technology is being developed to determine whether someone has used legal CBD or marijuana. For now, the sheriff's office will rely on field sobriety tests and warrants for a blood test is always an option.
