Issues: With all that is happening in the world today domestic violence on the rise.

Program: On Sunday August 7, rebroadcasted on August 14, WKBI FM Talk of the Town host, Denny Heindl interviewed Casandra Maletto from Nick's Tobacco Outlet in St. Marys, PA. Cassandra revealed the staff and management at Nic's had seen an uptick in area abuse reports and decided to do something about it through their workplace. The store cashiers asked customers to round up to the nearest dollar on their purchases to help fund and area organization named CAPSEA. People were invited to come into the store and sign up to win prizes to be given away on August 6. This non-profit organization, Elk and Cameron County Victims Service Agency, provides help for people dealing with domestic abuse in one way, shape, or form. Throughout a three month period, the store collected funds which were used to help area residents. Gift baskets were filled with amusement park tickets, minor league and major league baseball tickets, different nutritional food items, food certificates, small games for children, and many other items designed to make someone's day a little brighter. Large gifts included televisions, camping equipment, and iPad. On the day of the giveaways, a event will be held with free pizza and soft drinks to all who attend.
