

# KCNV Issues and Programs List

*Q1: January 1, 2024 – March 31, 2024*

KCNV is a public radio station with a 24-hour classical music format. That format doesn't easily lend itself to conventional coverage of news. It's our strong belief that we offer a balance with our 24-hour news station, KNPR, in our service to the Las Vegas region: while KNPR continually covers issues, news, and ideas as they arise on a daily basis in both our region and the world, we think of KCNV's programming as reflecting long-term issues of human society - life and death, war and peace, nationalism, even universal values.

It's our belief that those themes and ideas are presented through complex and powerful works of great composers; in addition, when there is breaking news between midnight and 7pm weekdays and until 4pm Saturdays and Sundays, live hosts don't go into detail but they do alert listeners who might want more detailed information.

The treatment of issues may appear to be abstract and emotional rather than concrete and logical, but through KCNV we seek to complement KNPR's programming by exposing listeners to great music, and in so doing we offer a respite from the 24-hour news cycle in a way that we believe refreshes and replenishes mind and soul.
