Broken Arrow School Uses New Shelter for First Time

A tornado warning this afternoon prompted the kids at Timber Ridge Elementary School to use their brand-new shelter for the first time. The shelter doubles as the school gym and has the highest level of protection on FEMA's rating scale. Charlie Hannema, BAPS public relations officer said that before today, the shelter had only been used for drills. The shelter is able to house the entire student body and staff, which is upwards of 600 people. The room has reinforced walls and ceilings with concrete at the top and can provide near absolute protection from even an EF-5 tornado.

Flood Control Officers Gear Up for Wet Weekend

The Army Corps of Engineers are keeping an extra eye on area dams this weekend ahead of the expected rainfall. Travis Miller, the Keystone lake managers says some corps members will work overtime to combat all the rain that's fallen in other parts of the state now draining into the Cimarron and Arkansas river, along with the remnants of Hurricane Sergio. He says they have doubled the amount of water they're releasing in an effort to keep the lake from flooding. There is currently no flood risk along the Arkansas River, but since Keystone Dam is a popular fishing spot, officials are warning it will be dangerous and likely flooded.

Tulsa Homeless Shelters Brace for Cold

The Center of Hope in downtown Tulsa is the area's largest homeless shelter and the staff are on notice for the coming cold temperatures. They are ready for anyone needing their help to get out of the cold. Major Mark Harwell with the Salvation Army, who runs the shelter, says while the non-profit's famous red kettle campaign is just now beginning, it's last year's donations that are keeping the shelter's lights and heaters on while providing hot meals. EMSA is warning everyone that it is possible to get frostbite in Tulsa or at least suffer from cold exposure this weekend even if you have a home or a coat. The Salvation Army is also taking donations for used coats to pass along to someone that needs it.

Snow Causes School to Lose Power

Tulsa Mayor G.T. Bynum, Tulsa Area Emergency Management, the National Weather Service, and PSO joined up Monday to ask residents to prepare for the winter season ahead. The city says it will focus on main streets before addressing residential areas for emergency crews. Stan Whiteford with PSO said ice storms are more likely to knock your power out than snow. PSO are warning residents not to run generators into their homes and that a professional needs to install any new generators that will be used to restore power to your home so line workers aren't electrocuted when trying to restore power.

Cherokee County Takes Direct Hit from Tornado

Residents in the small community of Welling are dealing with tornado damage tonight after a rare December tornado ripped through Cherokee county. The National Weather Service rated the tornado at EF-2. Cherokee Nation Emergency Officials were out tarping torn roofs, while residents picked up scattered debris in lawns and torn trees. One resident said the tornado was a reminder to not take warnings lightly, even in December. That system also spawned 2 tornadoes right across the state line in Arkansas.

A rare EF-2 tornado tore through Cookson on Friday, causing damage to homes and neighborhoods. Resident Brandy Hicks said the tornado ripped the shingles off the roof and the entire roof of her covered porch. The area around Tenkiller Air Park also saw it's share of damage as the tornado damaged some of the hangers where people stored their boats and planes. County workers have been making their rounds, trying to clear debris and get neighborhoods back to normal. The storm system ended up producing 38 tornadoes across 4 states according to preliminary reports.

Tulsa Police Arrest Man in 39th Homicide of the Year

Tulsa Police have arrested 27 year old Jessdun Markham in the death of 26 year old Dequelon Penn at the Sunset Plaza apartments. Officers say shortly after midnight, Penn's girlfriend called 911 saying her ex-boyfriend, Markham, had shot and killed Penn. When they arrived on the scene, officers found Penn dead in a doorway and Penn was gone. Two women who live in the same building as Penn said they heard gunshots. Police said Markham fled about 2 miles away to the YMCA, where they caught him on the roof. TPD said he confessed to shooting and killing Penn but never gave a motive.

Sand Springs PD Looks for Chase Suspects

Officers in Sand Springs are searching tonight for two people they say lead them on a chase on a stolen motorcycle. Police say the whole thing started in Tulsa at 31st and Memorial after officers spotted a stolen bike with a man driving a woman passenger. TPD followed them onto highway 64 towards Sand Springs, where SSPD was set up. Officers tried to stop the motorcycle when it passed them, but that's when the chase picked up with speeds up to 70 MPH. Police lost the suspects once they got into a rural area west of town but an officer found the bike outside the same home where he had previously recovered a different stolen motorcycle last Saturday. As officials were searching the area for the suspects with K9s and a chopper, they found a third stolen motorcycle as well. Osage County officials say they don't have enough probably cause to obtain a search warrant on the home but they would keep a close eye on it.

Body Discovery Leads to Arrest

The discovery of a man's body along a county road north of Pawhuska has led to three arrests. According to investigators, Maurice Kent, Daniel Keene, and Toby Bighorse got into an argument on the first of October with John Adkins. The suspects reportedly told authorities they made Adkins get out of the car, and a physical altercation ensued. The suspects claim they left in the vehicle after the fight and left Adkins standing in the road. But investigators eventually found Adkins' body near the area where the suspects say they left him. Investigators believe he was killed during an attempted robbery. All three suspects are charged with second degree murder.

Detectives say Lauren was last seen with him on October 27th. Brunner admitted to shooting and killing her, and dumping her body in a recycling bin. er body has yet to be located.

Woman Caught with Meth

A Tulsa woman is behind bars tonight after police say they caught her with meth while she was trying to use phony money at a north Tulsa convenience store. Officers arrested Elli Jencks last night at the S&K Food Mart near Pine and Sheridan. Jencks tried to use a counterfeit \$20 when making a purchase at the food mart. The cashier said he could tell the money was fake and called police. When officers arrived, they found another counterfeit bill in her purse that had the exact same serial number as the other fake bill she tried to pass off. Officers found meth inside a box of Altoid mints in her purse as well.

Burn Victim Is Released From Hospital

Fire Captain Jerry Brown says a woman who was burned after a disturbing crime on Thanksgiving is finally home and recovering. Brown said Alfred Ricketts doused his girlfriend in lighter fluid, then set her on fire outside of her home during an argument. The suspect then ran off and investigators have spent the past 5 days trying to find him. Ricketts was arrested Wednesday morning for first degree arson and endangering human life. Firefighters say the victim suffered second and third degree burns to her hands and upper body. If convicted, Rickets would face up to 35 years in prison.

Single Traffic Stop Leads to Six Arrests

Six men are in the Tulsa Country jail tonight after what started as a simple traffic stop in north Tulsa. Police say they pulled over an SUV near 36th St N and Garrison when they smelled the strong odor of marijuana coming from inside. The six men got out and police searched the car. Officers say they found a bag of marijuana, a digital scale, and two guns, one of which was stolen. The six men were questioned but none of them owned up to the stolen gun or the bag of pot. All six men are now facing a charge for knowingly concealing stolen property and marijuana possession. 3 of the men are facing even more charges, suspected of drug dealing and transporting a loaded gun.

Pizza Delivery Driver Carjacked

The Wagoner County Sheriff's office said a Domino's Pizza delivery driver was robbed at gunpoint by 3 juveniles. It happened east of 32nd Street South in Broken Arrow. Deputies say they kids even took his car. The Sheriff's office said after they got the call, they coordinated with Tulsa Police, who tracked the vehicle and after a short chase caught the thieves in the 61st and Peoria area of Tulsa. Wagoner sheriffs said one of the suspects was later identified by the victim, and that they all three could be connected to other crimes in Tulsa.

Police Investigate Christmas Eve Pawn Shop Burglary

Tulsa Police are investigating who is responsible for breaking in and stealing weapons from a midtown Tulsa pawn shop. Officers say the burglary is unusual because the suspects came in from the roof, instead of the normal front or back door. The thieves rapelled through a hole in the roof and left with at least 10 AR-15 rifles. TPD have worked for hours collecting evidence, dusting for prints, and looking for DNA. They say it isn't clear but they think more than one person was part of the operation. Investigators say there wasn't any video of the burglary so they are looking for the public's help.

The Agape Mission of Bartlesville is open and ready to serve meals in a brand new building today. The 9700 square foot, 1.6 million dollar building is triple the size of the old favility. The new cafeteria can seat close to 100 people, more than double the size of the old one. Director Sherri Smith says the expansion is all to help those in need. The mission already serves about 60,000 meals a year, including the Food for Kids program but with the holidays coming, they expect the need to grow and that they're finally prepared to meet that need.

Tulsa Homeowners Petition Gathering Place Parking

Homeowners in the Maple Ridge neighborhood are dealing with headaches that are coming with the massive influx of people to their area for the Gathering Place. Roberta Clark lives right beside the Gathering Place and sayd that although she loves the park, a few things need to change. Visitors are parking on both sides of the neighborhood street, sometimes illegally. The temporary parking lot also gets muddy when it rains, which forces the park to close it and guests seek parking in the neighborhoods Clark started a petition hoping Gathering Place officials will tackle the parking issues. Tony Moore, executive director for the park says they are aware of the issues and are working with Tulsa Police to find a solution. They are also encouraging guests to take advantage of the two satellite lots and the free shuttle.

Historic Bridge Moves from Sperry to Skiatook

A historic bridge from 1940s has been a landmark north of Sperry over Hominy Creek for decades, until the Oklahoma Department of Transportation decided to demolish it during a road project, unless someone else stepped in. The owners of OK Tank Trucks thought the bridge was worth saving, so three years later they hauled the 40-foot-tall bridge to Skiatook, moving electric and cable lines along the way. They are now working to open a park and monument site for people to visit the historic bridge. The

business owners are taking donations for the bridge project to help with the large task of replacing all the flooring and repainting the bridge to its original color.

Tulsa Police Implement New Report System

The Tulsa Police Department has picked a vendor and are well on their way to implementing a brandnew records system. Right now, officers have to use multiple databases to work a single case. Major
Matt Kirkland says the new system will put all the information into one database, making the
department more efficient and more accurate. They will be able to track crime trends more easily,
possibly helping to catch serial criminals more quickly as well. It's a long process, and TPD expects that it
won't be fully implemented until the year 2021. Another benefit is that the crime tracker on the TPD
website will be updated in real time, and the experience in city courts for things like traffic tickets will
become more user friendly.

Tulsa Buys New Police Chopper

Johnson has owned grocery stores throughout the years and knew the building was the perfect place for another one. Johnson hopes to also open a discount store for other non-food items in the future. It is all part of his plan to provide goods at reasonable prices to help lower income families keep more dollars in their pockets. With his non-profit Genesis 12:2, he hopes to take the store's profits and help families get better housing to climb out of poverty overall. By purchasing the old library building, Johnson is also helping Bacone College stay open after serious financial difficulties.

Popular Claremore Restaurant to Close

Tulsa School Celebrates Renovations

OSU Medical School Plans to Expand to Tahlequah

The Oklahoma State University's medical school plans to expand to Tahlequah in a partnership with the Cherokee Nation in response to a critical need. In less than two years, the Hastings Hospital in Tahlequah will be transformed into a teaching hospital, becoming the first tribal affiliated medical school in the nation. Classes will start in 2020. The first medical school class will accept up to 50 students and house 200 doctors in training once fully operational.

Tulsa Police Hold Youth Forum

The Tulsa Police department held their tenth annual Mayor's Police and Community Coalition with many Tulsa area high schoolers tonight. The TPS Chief of Police, Matthias Whicks, says students have the opportunity to speak with officers one on one. Students learn about police stops, how to act if stopped by an officer, and give feedback to TPD about ways to keep their schools safe. It's also a learning opportunity for the officers. While only a handful of students from each high school attended, they are hopeful officers are able to visit TPS high schools to get more students involved.

Muskogee Schools Awarded Grant

The Muskogee School District has been awarded a 1.16-million-dollar grant from T-Mobile to tear down a barrier between students and success due to a lack of internet access. Dr Jarod Mendenhall, superintendent of Muskogee Public Schools says that while all students have been issued Chromebooks, many are not able to use them at home because they don't have internet access. The money will go toward purchasing hotspots for each student as well as provide free high-speed wireless access to 5800 MPS students. Mendenhall believes this is a way to even the playing field and provide opportunity some of their students wouldn't otherwise have. MPS says all secondary students will get their hotspots before winter break, and the rest of the students will get theirs before spring break.

Sand Springs School Evacuated

Sand Springs' Clyde Boyd Middle School was evacuated today due to what fire officials believe was a heater malfunction. Deputy chief Justin Hall said crews arrived at the school around 2:30pm this afternoon with ONG. Crews went into the school with carbon monoxide monitors and the alerts were high. The school does not have CO monitors as they are not a requirement, only recommended. The superintendent says the students started feeling sick around lunchtime and were evacuated. The 6th graders are able to return to class as they are in a second building, but the seventh and eighth graders had to stay in the gym where the CO levels were clear. Some parents chose to pick up their kids, but all students were safe.

Anderson Students Receive Annual Free Book

Health Department Tests Emergency Response

The Tulsa County Health Department hosted a pop-up flu shot clinic today. After last year's flu season, Leanne Stephens with THD says they wanted to make sure everyone had a chance to get the vaccine this year. The clinic was held at the Oklahoma State University Tulsa campus downtown, and officials said they brought around 1,000 vaccines with them. Even though flu season has just started, the department said Oklahoma has already seen hospitalizations. Last year the department gave out over 10,000 flu shots.

First Medical Marijuana Dispensary Opens in Muskogee

Muskogee's first medical marijuana dispensary opened over the weekend and they say business is booming. The White Rhino dispensary is located near 5th and Broadway. Kim Finnerty owns the White Rhino and is proud to be the first with a city permit and license in Muskogee. She says it's been very busy so far, with 50 patients on Saturday and about that many on Sunday.

Number of Unvaccinated Children Grows

A new report from the Center for Disease Control shows that the number of Oklahoma children who are unvaccinated is growing. The CDC says the percentage of Oklahoma kindergarteners with a vaccination exemption last year was 1.9%. That number has now grown to 2.2%. The Tulsa Health Department says students can be exempt because of religious, medical, or philosophical reasons. The health department still recommends getting your children vaccinated, saying it can also protect those in our community with weakened immune systems.

Medical Marijuana Authority Releases New Report

The Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority has released new numbers showing how much money has come in from application fees. As of today, they have collected 6.8 million dollars in application fees. More than 5 million came from business applications and more than 1 million dollars came from patient applications. They've received more than 14,000 applications so far.

Opioid Nonprofit Expands

Jordan Blake started Reckless Saints of Nowhere in Pryor after seeing a need to provide people a place to live and a job after treatment for opioid addiction. Blake says thirty-day programs are successful less than 4% of the time, but 12-month treatment programs have an 80% success rate. Right now, there are two people in recovery living at the home, but there's space for four more. Kyle Vaughn, a former addict and current employee says they would like to open more houses to help more people. The nonprofit has also helped pay for the treatment of more than 1,000 people.

Lawmakers and Schools Work To Introduce Vaping Bill

Most schools have a ban on e-cigarettes, but Senator JJ Dossett wants to make it even harder for kids to bring them onto campus. Senator Dossett wants to expand the state's anti-tobacco law to ban them at school as well. Three years ago the senator was a teacher at Owasso and said e-cigarettes were just starting to pop up. Now studies show that last year, close to half of all Oklahoma students reported they had at least tried vaping. State law already bans all tobacco products at schools. If lawmakers pass Dossett's bill and e-cigarettes are included, staff members will have to go off campus to vape. If they are caught using the products at school, they will be subjected to a fine.

Medical Marijuana Impact on 2019

Medical marijuana is legal in Oklahoma, and the Tulsa Mayor says it's a new field but growing fast. He says he isn't sure what impact it will have on 2019 yet, but looks forward to watching it play out. Bynum also said that opening up marijuana for taxation could make a difference but it was tough to call this early.

Flu Hospitalizations Continue to Rise

As of today, 16 more people in Oklahoma were hospitalized with the flu in the last week. According to the State Department of Health, that brings the total number of people who were hospitalized this year to 202. In Tulsa county, 51 people have gone to the hospital since September 1st. So far, 10 people have died.
