Right now, 2,000 acres have been extinguished. Even though a Burn Ban has not been issued, officials are asking people to avoid burning anything right now.

Record High Temperatures Outpaces Record Low Temperatures in Tulsa

Daily temperature records have been kept in Tulsa for more than 125 years. As recently as last week, Tulsa has been adding record readings to the list. Catoosa Reflects on 30 Year Anniversary of F4 Tornado

2023 marks 30 years since a F4 tornado devastated areas of Catoosa. On April 24, 1993, a powerful supercell storm spawned a tornado on the far east side of Tulsa, making its way along I-44 into Catoosa before lifting. This 5.5-mile-long path was devastating as winds reaching over 200 miles per hour struck homes and businesses. Seven people were killed.

How to Survive a Tornado While Driving

A vehicle is one of the worst places you could be during a tornado, but in a worse-case scenario, it's important to know what to do. As FOX23 meteorologist Michael Grogan explains, drivers should pull over if possible and find either an open building, get into a ditch or culvert, or stay in your vehicle. Do not park under an overpass or bridge, because they will not protect you from blowing debris.

How Much Rain is Needed to Create a Flash Flood?

FOX23 meteorologist Michael Grogan speaks about the risk of flash flooding, and how much rain is needed to make the phenomenon happen. It will depend on how much moisture the soil is holding. Dry ground has a higher capacity to absorb water compared to soil that is already wet. Additional rain that falls on saturated ground will turn into a runoff, which will then stay above ground and create a flood.

Understanding Storm Sirens Ahead of Severe Weather Season

Many Tulsans are familiar with the sounds of the City's tornado sirens because they are tested weekly. There are more than 80 sirens across Tulsa, but officials are worried that too many people rely on the sirens when a tornado is on the ground. Sirens are only meant to alert people who are outside of a tornado. The National Weather Service is reminding people to have weather radios or make sure that you receive weather alerts on your phone.

Officials Issue Ozone Alert Day as Temperatures Rise

Weekend Storm Officially Classified as a Derecho

So far, no charges have been filed against Fletcher, but the funds does impact Tulsa students.

Oklahoma Virtual Charter School Board Votes to Allow Religious Charter Schools

City of Bartlesville Faces Worst Water Crisis in Decades

The City of Bartlesville has raised rates and begun rationing water due to conservation efforts. The changes will only effect families and businesses using more than 10,000 gallons or more a month. The average family uses about 7,000 gallons a month. Restrictions will also apply for outdoor water use. City-owned pools and splash pads will close, and city-owned golf courses will reduce or end irrigation.

Canoo Fights for Oklahoma Incentives After Announcing Pryor, OKC Locations

However, because the company did recently close on its Oklahoma City location, they will receive a \$1 million dollar incentive separate from the Pryor facility.

Neighbors Concerned as Rock Quarry Plans Expansion into Owasso

Neighbors are concerned about the loud noises, explosions, and moving dust involving the quarry. The application to expand operations says that this section of Tulsa County has become a

significant source of limestone which is used in construction. An online petition is circulating and hopes to prevent the expansion.

Italian Company Selects Inola, Will Build Manufacturing Facility

The business deal was sparked by a meeting at the 2022 PGA Championship at Tulsa's Southern Hills Country Club. Construction is expected to begin on the \$1 billion dollar facility next year, and it's expected to bring hundreds of new jobs to Green Country.

Oklahoma Gov. Plans Second Session if Budget Deal is Not Reached

Stitt believes that it should go back to the taxpayers.

Cherokee Nation Breaks Ground on New Wellness Center

Teenager Arrested, Accused of Stabbing Student on Tulsa School Bus

Surveillance Footage Shows Dangerous Inmate Walking Way from Wagoner County Jail

Petition Calls for Stricter Rules for Sex Offenders Following Henryetta Mass Homicide

Rogers County Woman Faces Charges After Bags of Fentanyl Found Near Toddler

Homicide Victim's Mother Calls for Answers One Year After Mass Shooting in Taft

Local, State Officials Release New Details in Mass Homicide in Henryetta

Federal Investigators Arrest Man Accused of Vandalizing Tulsa Donut Shop

New Study Shows How High Heels Can Damage Feet

New Test Can Detect Colorectal Cancer at Earlier Stages

A newly devised tool can be used to detect colorectal cancer earlier than a traditional colonoscopy. The test is a kit called “Bescreened” and is a blood drawl. The kit, which is available at any Oklahoma Any Lab location, is a less invasive way to test for the disease. You must be at least 45 to get the kit, and results are expected in around 10 days. Results are 95% accurate and details what stage of cancer the disease is at.

Local Group Creates Mobile Therapist Following School Shooting

Skillz on Wheelz is an RV that travels to places around Tulsa to provide counseling and mental health services. The unit went to McLain High School following a recent shooting to talk to members of the community who may be shaken up after the attack. Skillz on Wheelz is a nonprofit organization that tries to reach people in north Tulsa who may not have access to mental health care.

New Program Partners Mental Health Professionals with Bartlesville Police Officers

Grand Mental Health has partnered with the Bartlesville Police Department to create a Crisis Response Team. That team rides with officers to assist with certain situations. The staff members also work with officers to talk down people in mental health situations instead of taking them to jail. Two mental health response members go with officers five days a week for eight-hour shifts.

New Spinal Cord Research Allowed Paralyzed Man to Walk Again

A man is walking again after receiving experimental surgery involving the spinal cord. Researchers used electrical stimulation in implants to send a continuous signal to the spinal cord, showing that it is needed. The man has not walked in a decade following an accident, but the new implant allows him to stand and walk for about 100 yards. He is expected to improve, and the therapy is expected to be used in the future.

Oklahoma Supreme Court Rules Two Abortion Bans are Unconstitutional

The Oklahoma Supreme Court has ruled that two recent abortion bans are unconstitutional. One of the bans would give someone the right to sue a doctor who performs an abortion and get a reward of \$10,000. In a statement, Governor Stitt says he disagrees with the ruling, saying the State Supreme Court is using activism to create the right to an abortion in Oklahoma.

Tulsa Firefighters Union Pushes to Allow Medical Marijuana

Several City Council members have shared their approval, but Tulsa Mayor G.T. Bynum says the City must be "cautious and deliberate" because the dosages are not federally regulated.

Gov. Kevin Stitt Vetoes Bill That Would Have Fought Alzheimer's, Dementia

Oklahoma Governor Kevin Stitt has vetoed House Bill 2747, which received bipartisan support. The bill would have expanded training for existing state workers who work with dementia and Alzheimer's. Gov. Stitt said he believed that the bill would "move the needle on disease knowledge or would reduce the risk of the disease." There was also a provision that would have provided grant money to caregivers. Local advocates shared their disappointment in the veto.

Local Nonprofit Opens Cooling Center as Dangerous Heat Arrives

The North Tulsa Dream Center has opened a cooling station as thousands of Tulsans wait for power to be restored following Sunday's storm. The lack of air conditioning and dangerous temperatures put

many people at risk for heat stroke and heat exhaustion. The cooling center is an effort to protect the health of Tulsans who are recovering following the strong storms.

American Heart Association – Tulsa Heart Walk – FOX23 produced and aired PSAs for the 2023 Tulsa Heart Walk, which took place in Tulsa on April 29, 2023. Oklahomans for Equality – Tulsa Pride Parade – Six members of the FOX23 News team (both on-air talent and other staff) walked in the parade on June 24, 2023, to celebrate diversity and show support for LGBTQ+ members of our community. Thousands of Tulsans attended the parade as spectators.

St. Jude Children’s Research Hospital – St. Jude Dream Home Giveaway – FOX23 presented the 2023 St. Jude Dream Home Giveaway to raise money for St. Jude Children’s Research Hospital. Although the hospital is located in Memphis, TN, it serves children and their families from all over the nation, including many Oklahomans. The hospital’s mission is to provide life-saving treatment for children with cancer, at absolutely no cost to their families. Throughout the Dream Home fundraising campaign, FOX23 aired promotional spots and provided news coverage. This year’s campaign raised \$1.5 million to help St. Jude continue its invaluable work.
