Catoosa Public Schools Asks Voters to Approve Bond to Pay for New School

Catoosa Public Schools is asking voters to approve a \$9,000,000 bond that would complete multiple classrooms at an elementary school. Last year, Catoosa voters approved a \$52,000,000 bond that would build the new elementary school. However, the school district found that they were \$7,000,000 overbudget during the design phase. The additional funds would allow crews to finish construction and place all grades to fall under the same roof.

New Program Educates College Students About the Agriculture Industry

Tulsa Public Schools Receive Mental Health Services Grant

Tulsa Public Schools has received a \$50,000 grant from the Morning Crest Healthcare Foundation. The great will help TPS teachers' pay for health insurance deductibles for mental health services. The current deductible is \$750, which is seen as a deterrent keeping teachers from getting treatment.

Oklahoma State Superintendent Considers Legal Action Over Alleged Books in School Districts

Oklahoma State Superintendent Ryan Walters says he is investigating claims that two Oklahoma school districts have pornographic books in their libraries. Tulsa Teacher Named Oklahoma's Teacher of the Year

Proposed Bill Would Prevent Special Needs Students from Receiving Corporal Punishment

Oklahoma lawmakers are divided over House Bill 1028, which would prevent administrators from giving corporal punishment to special needs students. The bill failed by two votes, sparking conversation

between lawmakers and parents. Oklahoma is one of 19 states that allows administrators to spank children without parental consent. The author of the bill plans to pursue the issue.

Oklahoma Lawmakers Pass Education Plans for Public School Districts

The Oklahoma House and Senate have both passed their education plans, which include budgets, school choice, and teacher salaries. Oklahoma Dept. of Transportation Announces New Projects for 2023

The Oklahoma Department of Transportation has announced several large projects for 2023. There are several improvement projects scheduled across Green Country, including a repavement plan for the Broken Arrow Expressway near Highway 51. Signs have already been placed to warn drivers about the construction crews and projects ahead of the Monday start date.

New Laws Bring Changes Involving Absentee Voting in Oklahoma

In the past, Oklahomans who preferred to vote with an absentee ballot were automatically sent ballots. However, a new law says that voters must request an absentee ballot from their local election board. The request must be made several weeks before the upcoming election. The next election is scheduled for February in Rogers County. Voters will decide on bonds for several school districts.

Multiple Turley Firefighters Resign Over Accusations of Wrongdoing

Six members of the Turley Volunteer Fire Department have resigned, effectively cutting the force in half. While the firefighters have not given an explicit reason for resigning, many have pointed to wrongdoing and unfair conduct within the department. Members of the community are concerned, as the mass resignation leaves many people at risk. The County Commissioner told FOX23 that Turley doesn't fall under country jurisdiction, but Tulsa County firefighters will assist if needed.

U.S. Department of Transportation Announces Plans to Tear Down Leg of Tulsa's IDL

U.S. Department of Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg traveled to Tulsa to discuss grants and improvement plans for metro roads. One of the biggest projects includes tearing down the northern leg of the IDL, an extension of I-244. Buttigieg believes that the removal of the northern leg will help revitalize the economy around the Greenwood district. The DOT will receive community feedback before making any decisions on the removal.

Oklahoma Voters Prepare for Upcoming Election on Legalizing Recreational Marijuana

FOX23 was invited to a meeting hosted by "Yes on 820," a group aimed at legalizing recreational marijuana in Oklahoma. During the meeting, advocates say legalized marijuana could bring additional tax revenue to the state, which in turn could benefit education and roads. If recreational marijuana is legalized, it would be taxed at 15%. However, those against legalization say there are already too many issues and concerns surrounding medicinal marijuana and will attract more crime. The election is scheduled in March.

Work Begins on Creek Turnpike, South Memorial Interchange Project

Crews have begun work on a project that will overhaul the busy interchange at the Creek Turnpike and South Memorial in Tulsa. The new interchange will be called a Diverging Diamond, where drivers will "crisscross" between the left and right lanes, making it easier to make a left or right turn once you exit the highway. The project is expected to be completed in Spring 2024.

Tulsa's 911 Dispatch Center Reports Shortage in Employees

The Tulsa Public Safety Communications Administration says its 911 Dispatch Center is facing an operator shortage, which impacts thousands of Tulsans. When the center is fully staffed, there are 92 operators. Currently, there are 78. To help recruit new employees, supervisors have reduced the recruitment time and raised pay.

Drivers Share Concerns About New Speed Limit on Rogers County Highway

Drivers are confused about the speed limit for a new stretch of Highway 20 in Rogers County. The speed limit between Owasso and Claremore is 45 miles per hour. However, drivers say it was 55 before the construction, and it has not been raised following the completion of the construction project. ODOT

officials say the speed limit was not raised because of the road's design, which includes gutters and curbs.

Oklahoma Voters Say No to Legalizing Recreational Marijuana

Oklahoma voters have said no to SQ820, which would have legalized recreational marijuana. 61% of voters said no in the special election. Tulsa Police Investigate First Homicide of 2023

Teenager Faces Charges After Making Threats Against a Bartlesville School

Tulsa Police, Federal Agents Search for Tulsa Man Wanted for Sex Crimes Against Children

Local and federal investigators continue to search for Jimmy McGlothlin. McGlothlin is wanted for more than a dozen sex crimes against children. A warrant for McGlothin's arrest was issued in December, but he has not yet been found. McGlothlin is described as a white man, 5'3, weighs 140 pounds, and has poor hygiene.

Charges Filed Against Man Accused of a Double Murder in Tulsa

First-degree murder charges have been filed against a man accused of brutally killing two people in Tulsa. However, he is not yet in custody. Investigators are looking for Rodney Williams, also known as lucky, for the murders of Tiffany Culkins Sheets and Harry Leroy McElfresh. It is believed that another man, Roger Jackson, Junior, helped Williams with the murders. He is already in custody.

Broken Arrow Police Arrest Second Teenager Accused of Murdering a 16-year-old

Broken Arrow Police have arrested a second teenager in connection to the murder of 16-year-old Dacari Green. Green was shot and killed outside of a home near S. 145th Avenue and E. 51st Street South in January. So far, 15-year-old Ky'leigh Shaw and 15-year-old Ja'Cori Whitmore have been arrested and police are expecting more arrests in the coming weeks.

New Video Shows Suspect Involved in Fatal Officer-Involved Shooting in Tulsa

Surveillance footage shows the moments leading up to a fatal officer-involved shooting in Tulsa. Officers were responded to a burglary call at a home near the University of Tulsa. The video shows the suspect running away and officers saying, "he has a sawed-off shotgun." Officers say the suspect fired at them, so they returned fire. The investigation continues.

Tulsa Woman Accused of Having Sexual Relationship with Teenager

A Tulsa woman has been arrested and accused of having a sexual relationship with a 14-year-old boy. Investigators say the woman met the child while working as a volunteer at an early education program. The victim's mom called police when she found disturbing messages between her son and Carol Russell. Russell has been charged with multiple counts, including lewd molestation.

Report Shows Rise of White Supremacist Incidents in Oklahoma

A new report from the Anti-Defamation League shows a rise in white supremacist incidents in Oklahoma. Incidents have also jumped across the U.S., with more than 6,750 recorded incidents in 2021. Proposed Bill Would Guarantee Paid Maternity Leave for Oklahoma State Employees

Oklahoma State Senators have passed Senate Bill 193, which would provide six weeks of paid maternity leave to Oklahoma state employees. The leave would also cover adoptions. Study Describes Importance of Getting Good Sleep While Springing Forward for Daylight Savings
