Weather

Deadly Storms Pummel Several States

Severe weather took at least 31 lives and ripped apart homes in the south and is now pummeling states in the north. From Texas to South Carolina, reports of at least 40 tornadoes spanned more than 1200 miles. Emergency officials urged people to put sheltering from the storm above the need to maintain social distancing due to the coronavirus. Hamilton County Emergency Management says they have had a lot of debris in the roads and it was hard for first responders to get in but the help of public works allowed them to get through. Some 12 million people along the East Coast have been under a tornado watch today.

Hail Causes Damage in Tulsa

Hail caused all kinds of problems this morning as storms moved through just after sunrise. Viewer Joe Denton sent in pictures showing cars parked in west Tulsa, near 21st and Yukon, where the hail really came down hard and knocked holes in the windows. Officials say the road between Highway 97 and where Avery Drive meets W 21st Street buckled from all the rain, too. To protect drivers, crews blocked off the road entirely in the area near Chandler Park. Tulsa County officials will work to make repairs as quickly as possible as weather allows.

Tornado Claims 2 Lives

Cleanup and recovery began today in Madill, Oklahoma after an EF-2 tornado tore through the town. Madill's manufacturing plant Oklahoma Steel and Wire bore the brunt of the damage, with most of the structure ripped apart. The owner says she had nearly 100 employees inside the facility at the time of the storm, but all are safe and accounted for. Officials say a truck driver outside the facility was hit by the debris and died at the hospital. Governor Stitt visited the town Thursday to survey the damage and making sure crews had what they needed to rebuild. On the other side of the town. J&I Manufacturing reported one of their employees died while driving nearby.

Near the county courthouse, the manager of the Allred 5 Theater says the building now has roof damage, enough to cause rain to leak into the building during the storm. Muskogee County Assesses Storm Damage

Muskogee County Emergency Management is out tonight surveying damage left behind from storms earlier today. Metal sheds torn apart, trucks buried under debris, and torrential rain flooding several roads were the impacts seen today in Muskogee county. Director of Emergency Management Jeff Smith says an initial search found damage in the Wainwright, Oktaha, and Keefeton areas. Power companies working as quickly as possible to restore electricity while first responders searched to make sure no one was trapped in flooded water or debris. A task force from McIntosh County also came in to help. By Friday afternoon, flood waters had still not receded enough to open roads.

Anniversary of Deadly Tornado

It's been seven years ago today since a large and extremely powerful tornado hit Moore, Oklahoma. Since then, there hasn't been another EF-5 tornado in the United States. Peak winds during the tornado hit an estimated 210 miles per hour. The storm claimed 24 lives, including seven children at Plaza Elementary School and left more than 200 injured. The tornado touched down in Newcastle and stayed on the ground for more than seventeen miles, running right through a heavily-populated area of Moore.

This week, TCC launched wifi in the parking lots on campus. On the Metro campus downtown, the public can access free wifi in lots 1,3, and 4. Metro lots 5&6 are also set up with outside wifi, as well at the Northeast campus student union parking lots 8 and 9. TCC plans to credit a portion of student fees since some school services are limited this semester. Students will get a \$10.80 credit per hour.

Home Invasion Leads to Shooting

Tulsa Police are investigating a home invasion and gun battle that left one man in bad shape at a local hospital. Lt. Brandon Watkins says the home where it happened, at the corner of 4th Street and 70th East Avenue, has been a problem for officers lately. He says it began on Monday around 11am when a group of people reportedly showed up to the home and kicked in the door, and that's when both sides started firing. Watkins says no one inside the home was hurt but an hour later, a shooting victim who police believe could have been one of the home invasion suspects showed up at the hospital. No one has been arrested as of yet, and the people who live in the home have been cooperative with the investigation.

Officials Search for Stabbing Suspect

Tulsa Police are searching today for a suspect in a stabbing and are asking for the public's help by calling CrimeStoppers if they have any information. They say that due to the pandemic, having people call in is a safer option than going from place to place. Lt. Brandon Watkins says Jimmy Johnson was stabbed to death late Sunday night and that he knew the suspect, Mitchel Folsom. Police had a warrant in hand for Folsom's arrest by Monday morning, but things are a little different due to the pandemic. Officers usually canvas a neighborhood by going door to door, but since they know who the suspect was, they are not risking the manpower to expose themselves to illness. A lot of employees at the detective division are working from home right now, but CrimeStoppers is still up and running and they are checking it often.

Police Investigate Homicide

Tulsa Police are investigating after a man was shot and killed in north Tulsa today. Officers have now identified the man found near 59th and north Garrison as 27 year old Marcus Jordan. They say the crime scene was unusually quiet today, and that it took almost 3 hours for any kind of witness or family member to come forward. Officer Danny Bean says Jordan's body was found in an empty lot by a city worker at 11 am. Police had no recent shots fired calls when they found the body, but neighbors say they did hear gunshots in the overnight hours which could be the shots that killed him. Officers say the man didn't have a wallet or ID on him, and they struggled to identify him early on. Now that they've figured out who he is, they can start to figure out who pulled the trigger. Detectives are interviewing family members and witnesses to try to identify a suspect and a motive. They are urging anyone with information to call CrimeStoppers.

Suspect Shoots Three People

Police are searching tonight for a suspect in a shooting in north Tulsa that injured 3 people. Police say when they arrived on the scene near 49th and Boston avenue, they found 3 gunshot victims. The shooting happened right in the neighborhood. Police have been here for hours investigating, gathering evidence and talking to witnesses. Right now they don't have any information on a suspect. A white car is shown in video but it's unclear what the car has to do with the scene. Officers have towed it for further examination. All 3 victims have been transported to local hospitals in stable condition.

Officer Involved Shooting in Broken Arrow

Broken Arrow Police have now arrested two men in a situation that led to the shooting of an officer. Officers say the suspects knew each other and after ongoing harassment issues, Hayden Payne reportedly fired a gun at Dean Black outside a home on Galveston street. Later, officer Cody Statton went to knock on the door of the home, and that's when Black fired a gun through the front door and hit the officer. Black was arrested within the hour for assault with a deadly weapon. About 24 hours later, police found and arrested Payne near Cleveland. Officer Statton is in good condition and is expected to be okay.

Teenagers Suspected in Shooting

Just two days after a deadly shooting in north Tulsa that police say may have been gang-related, there was another shooting late this afternoon in east Tulsa that once again involved teens. Tulsa Police captain Shane Tuell said that the shooting started with an argument involving at least three people and two cars. He says at one point, the suspect got out and started to shoot, hitting two teenage boys, aged 14 and 16 years old. Neighbors say they may not have seen what happened, but they definitely heard the commotion. Police say the young men will be okay.

Officer Involved Shooting in Downtown Tulsa

Tulsa police were patrolling the area near 11th and Denver around 9pm Wednesday night when they heard shots fired. They saw two people running towards them and then found a victim near 11th and Cheyenne. When they spoke to the victim, he pointed out a man and said he was his father and had shot him in the leg. Officers asked the suspect to drop the gun, and shot the man once in the abdomen when he raised his gun after refusing to lower it. Officers were able to talk with the suspect, who says he shot the victim in self defense because he was ransacking his car. Police say if the man had put down the gun, police would not have shot him. Both men were taken to the hospital and are expected to be okay.

Robbery in Turley

Two men are seen on video robbing a Phillips 66 in Turley early this morning. Three customers were trying to leave the gas station when two men with guns approached them. When they got back inside,

the suspect forces the customers to their knees and continues to point a gun at them. Nearby the second suspect went behind the counter with the clerk, held her at gunpoint, and demanded money from the register. He grabbed some money and cigars and they both fled after that. Justin Green with the Tulsa County Sheriff's office says that the customers and clerk did exactly what they should do in this type of situation. The victims are shaken but otherwise okay.

A state trooper shot a man at a traffic stop today on the Will Rogers Turnpike south of Vinita. OHP Captain Paul Timmons says a trooper pulled over a car along the shoulder of the turnpike, and the female driver of the car was taken to the OHP patrol unit. The trooper went back to the car to speak with the male passenger and he was shot. It isn't clear how many shots the trooper fired. The male passenger was transported to a Tulsa hospital where he later died of his wounds. OHP investigators worked the shooting scene for at least 6 hours. OU Joins COVID Fight

Medical professors at the University of Oklahoma, with the help of the Mayo Clinic, are working to find a way to get the upper hand on the Coronavirus. OU doctor Jordan Metcalf says they will test a method discovered in China that involves transferring blood plasma from a recovered person to a person who is very ill. The hope is that a recovered person has immunity from the virus built up in their system and some of that immunity will help fend off the virus in a sick person. Just like with a normal blood transfusion, anyone getting a plasma treatment will have to have a matching blood type.

The State Health Department says 29 people have now tested positive for COVID-19 at Skiatook Nursing Home and have already had 5 deaths. Employees say the nursing home failed to act quickly enough to protect residents and staff. The health department said that 19 residents and 10 employees have tested positive, which accounts for about half of the total cases in all of Osage county. One employee says she asked for a test and was denied, and another says they had no masks or PPE at first and were told to reuse masks. The home's owner says that the facility has taken the threat extremely seriously, and all staff and residents have received testing. He also said residents who have tested positive are in a separate area and that all employees have full PPE and N95 masks.

Doctors Report Injury Spikes in Children

Beth Washington with SAFE KIDS Tulsa says with over 700,000 children out of school, they know they are going to see a spike in these kinds of injuries. Washington says to make sure your kids are wearing helmets when riding bikes or scooters, and make sure your home is childproofed if you have a little one. She also reminds folks to anchor furniture to the walls and make sure guns and prescription medications are put up out of reach.

EMT With Coronavirus Recovers at Home

A local EMT with one of the worst cases of COVID-19 is now home for the first time in nearly two months. 8 weeks ago, Ibeth Carpenter was admitted to the Hillcrest South hospital and tested positive for COVID-19. She was put on a ventilator in the ICU and continued to deteriorate until she was put on ECMO, which is the most aggressive life support treatment available. Hillcrest Medical Center says she is only the 2nd COVID-19 patient in the US to be successfully treated with ECMO. Carpenter said she was on

the edge of “no return” but the medical team did everything in their power to help her fight. Her nurses say it’s the other way around, with Carpenter refusing to give up on her life. Now she’s going home to continue her recovery with her family, but before she left the hospital staff honored her with a parade of cars. Carpenter says she’s determined to get back to her old self, and if still here because of everyone that supported and prayed for her.
