#### Education

Monnie helped judge the 2018 Trio Dinner hosted by the Myrtle Beach Area Hospitality Association on April 16<sup>th</sup>. The Trio Dinner is a culinary arts mentorship program that pairs up two students, one high school and one college level, with a professional chef to create a unique dish. A portion of the proceeds from this event go to MBAHA scholarship funds towards Hospitality & Culinary Education.

We partner with Grand Strand Humane Society, Waccamaw Animal Rescue Mission, Saint Francis, North Myrtle Beach Humane Society and the Love Pet Clinic.

Book Buddy with Monnie – Every Tuesday Monnie meets with an elementary school student at their school to help them with reading and writing skills.

Palmetto Giving Day- Held on May 1<sup>st</sup> Palmetto Giving Day was a 24 hour on-line fundraising event for 54 Georgetown County Non-profit organizations. Donations made during this event went towards the 2018/2019 Apostles Build House for a single mom and her son to provide them with a healthy and safe place to live. Humane Society of NMB Dog Adoption- Held on April 8<sup>th</sup> at Petco in North Myrtle Beach this event needed volunteer dog walkers. Monnie attended this event as well as promoted even and need for volunteers on air.
