**Hugh Evens** Founder of Global citizen which was born from the desire to overcome extreme poverty in the world by seeking more equitable distribution of resources to all people of the world. Mr. Evens is asking that countries like the United states step up to do more for the people of the world who may not have as much, especially those in underdeveloped counties.

**Sunday July 23, 2023 6:00 AM – 6:30 AM**

This Tuesday is national hire a Veteran day. We are joined by **Cole Lyle**, executive director of Mission Rollcall, a national advocacy program that focuses on providing mental health assistance to Vets to help with suicide prevention, job placement and general family stability. He talks about the programs available for our returning veterans as they transition back to civilian life.

**Sunday July 30, 2023 6:00 AM – 6:30 AM**

**Jarred Norrell** and **Mark Morgan** with Southern Preparatory academy join us to talk about educational alternatives in the state of Alabama for kids

who may not be living up to their full educational potential and what can be done to better meet their needs.

**Sunday August 6, 2023 6:00 AM – 6:30 AM**

The National Association of Black Journalists are holding their annual convention in Birmingham and iHeart Journalist **Tyrik Wynn** stops by our Birmingham studios to share some of what he has learned and what issues are being addressed at the conference. Also JT talks with **Senator Tommy Tuberville** about his farm bill. He says there are provisions in that bill that will provide for a better way of life for our farmers.

**Sunday August 13, 2023 6:00 AM – 6:30 AM**

**Brian Stern** Founder and CEO of Project Dynamo, talks about his mission to provide assistance to those impacted in disaster areas and conflict zones throughout the world. Project DYNAMO was stood up during the troop withdrawal from Afghanistan when the U.S. government left American civilians behind. More than a year later they would see a need to help rescue Americans and civilians from conflict and disaster regions around the world.

**Sunday August 20, 2023 6:00 AM – 6:30 AM**

Harry W. Crocker III author of the new book Robert E. Lee on Leadership shares the lessons that can be learned by the study General Lee. Crocker's historical perspective also unearths profound facts and nuance that made both Lee, Grant, Lincoln any many other leaders of that time the men who shaped America for 160+ years.

**Sunday August 27, 2023 6:00 AM – 6:30 AM**

Thomas Tighe Founder of Direct Relief, a humanitarian aid organization to improve the health and lives of people impacted by poverty or emergencies including events like what is unfolding now in Hawaii.

**Sunday September 3, 2023 6:00 AM – 6:30 AM**

Suicide continues to be a problem among Alabama Veterans. September has been designated as suicide prevention month. Army Vet **J.P. Lane** tells history of overcoming depression, and how close he came to taking his own life 12 separate times. He also highlights organizations like Semper Fi that help vets overcome depression.

**Sunday September 10, 2023 6:00 AM – 6:30 AM**

Laure Clemons, the executive Director of Extended Family talks about their mission to serve the families of people who are incarcerated, and the work they do to support those families while their loved one is in jail, and also to navigate their transition back into life on the outside.

Then Alabama Congressman Gary Palmer joins us to talk about what he is working on as he returns to Washington for the legislative session this fall.

**Sunday September 17, 2023 6:00 AM – 6:30 AM**

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Birmingham announces the kickoff of “It Takes Little to be Big”. It’s a recruitment campaign aiming to recruit mentors for youth in need across the state. Jatava Burns along with Kiranda Robbins join JT to tell our listeners how they can both support the mission of BBBS and how they can participate as well.

**Sunday September 24, 2023 6:00 AM – 6:30 AM**

The President and founder of Intelligent Media Design Interactive Drayton Cosby tells us about his local non-profit software development company that is creating free content for kids and teens to teach positive life lessons using immersive 3<sup>rd</sup> player software that is developed here in Birmingham Alabama.
