Public Affairs Programming Topics for Quarter 1 2021

January 3rd 2021 – 11:30PM - 30 Minutes

We talk to US Surgeon General **Dr. Jerome Adams** for an update on the distribution of the Vaccines, and explore how long it could take before enough people have been vaccinated that we achieve “herd Immunity.”

An ER doctor **Dr. Jason Wilson** and front line worker shares his experience receiving the Pfizer vaccination. He explains the science behind the vaccine and why he knows its safe.

Finally we wrap up the show talking with **Dr. Richard Pfeffer** the chief medical officer with Genesis Healthcare, On the Impact the virus is having on nursing homes and long term care facilities. He addresses how this effects not just the residents and worked but the families of the residents and workers.

Rear Admiral **Dr Felicia Collins** Deputy Assistant Secretary for Minority health with the Department of health and Human Services and Director of the Office of Minority Health policy and Inclusion enforcement joins Ryan to talk about the Health disparities faced by people of color in America. She also addresses the role that systemic Racism is playing in the unfair way medical resources are distributed within racial and ethnic communities with regard to the role out of the Covid-19 vaccine. They are particularly involved in working with the NIH to insure fair and equitable treatment of Covid-19 in underserved Minority populations.

With this being the weekend of the Martin Luther King Day holiday, **Trevon Williams**, the Vice President of Marketing and Communications with the NAACP joins Ryan to explain that while the Dream is still alive, America has a long way to go to eradicate the scourge of systemic racism and White Supremacy that is still raging in America today.

January 24th, 2021– 11:30PM - 30 Minutes

With a new administration in Washington, President Biden's has a lot to tackle with vaccine distribution for the Corona Virus. **Dr. Celine Gounder** a new advisor to the president and infectious disease Expert explains what their first priorities will be in the first hundred days

Then **Dr. Jason Wilson** at Tampa General and Professor at USF answers common questions about the two vaccines that are being administered right now to prevent the spread of the corona virus.

Historian **Kenneth C. Davis** talks about “the first Hundred days” and how it became a metric by which we judge a new incoming administration.

The CEO and Chief investment Strategist **David Waddell** from Waddell and associates joins us to talk about recent stock market volatility surrounding stocks like GameStop, and the role played by Hedge fund managers who use a method called “Shorting the stock” to bet on price trajectories to take a quick profit.

The Pandemic Action Network's **Carolyn Reynolds** provides a rundown on the vaccine's efficacy against the Covid Variants that are now beginning to spread.

Can animals Contract and spread Covid-19? The News Editor of Science Magazine **David Grimm** Says yes, and explains that this virus has been as bad for your pet as it has for you.

Dr. Peter Marks Director of the Center for Biologics evaluations and research at the Food and Drug Administration gives an update on the efficacy and continuing roll out of the Covid Vaccine.

Why are some Americans still refusing to get vaccinated? **Dr. Patricia Whitley-Williams**, President of the National Foundation for Infectious Diseases and associate Dean of Inclusion and Diversity at Rutgers University's Robert Wood Johnson Medical School joins us to explain why many minorities have legitimate concerns about the safety and efficacy of a vaccine that may not have been developed with proper screening protocols to insure racial equality for all participants and the trials.

Margret Laws President and CEO of Hope Labs, an organization focused on the mental health and wellbeing of Youth and young adults. They work to develop tech products to improve on the health and wellbeing of young adults. They are now focusing especially on the health and development of members of the LGBTQ+ community. They are also working to create Identity formation, skill building and support for an individual's sense of self, and helping them re-enforce their own self-awareness and self-worth.

CEO of Big Brothers and Big Sisters of America **Ardis Stephens** joins Ryan to address the new challenges they now face serving the community of color and reaching a more diverse group of volunteers.

Carolyn Cawley the President of the US Chamber of Commerce Foundation introduces their “Sharing solutions initiative” as they roll out their emanative focus on substance abuse and opioid epidemic. Carolyn explains why she seeks business inclusive platforms and solutions to non-traditional paradigms of need-cohorts.

The President of the Child-mind institute, **Dr. Herold Koplewicz** talks about resources for parents who are trying raise and teach children in the midst of the pandemic.

Dave Fuehrer researcher and Cofounder of Grit Health talks about his work and how his organization helps the community through things like the “Covid exchange” He seeks to help be the voice for patent advocacy in times of healthcare uncertainty.
