Section 01 Issues 1st Quarter 2024 I&P Report for KVRW:

- **COVID-19:** S.W. Oklahoma continues to have climbing rates of infection from the Coronavirus. Informing public of infection rates by county/city and providing details on all current CDC guidelines and recommendations to combat the virus.
- **City Government:** The need to relay detailed information on all city emergency proclamations. Keeping the public informed of all updates and changes throughout the pandemic. Clarification on state and local mandates that affect both individuals and businesses in the community and surrounding area.
- Military: Provide details of services for employment opportunities, education, housing, child care, financial services, activities and other assistance for service members and their families. Ft. Sill and the Military is a large portion of our community. With the constant influx of new families moving to the area there's always a need to inform and advise where services and assistance can be can be obtained. Especially during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Health & Wellness: Lawton and Southwest Oklahoma have struggled with the spread of COVID-19 and have seen increased infection rates. To help stop or slow the spread of the virus more education on CDC recommendations was needed. From discussing facemasks to washing hands to social distancing practices.
- Education: Lawton has a significant high school dropout rate and a large population of undereducated residents who remain in the workforce at minimum wage positions due to education and vocational skill level. Local government and state educators are working to reduce dropout rates and assist with college and vocational education needs. During the pandemic providing details on state and local plans to deal with distance learning and how families can get assistance.
- **Public Assistance:** We have a large portion of our population that are underemployed, near poverty or homeless. Informing local and area residents where they can find assistance for shelter, food, clothing and other services that are available at little or no cost is critical. It has worsened with COVID-19.
