DESCRIPTION OF SEGMENT: With the summer chum run on the Yukon River predicted to exceed the lower end of its escapement goal of 500,000 fish, state and federal managers have announced a series of 24/7 opportunities to target summer chum, pink, and sockeye salmon using dip nets, beach seines, hook and line gear, and manned fish wheels. All chinook salmon must be released alive.
