ISSUE	PROGRAM	DATE	SUBJECT
Shooting in downtown New Bern outside courthouse	NEWS	7/12	We had team coverage on a shooting that occurred in downtown New Bern. Two people were shot on the sidewalk outside courthouse. Both died. We broke down the facts, spoke with witnesses and businesses who sheltered in place while police tracked down the shooter. We also looked into suspects criminal history and our ITEAM gave viewers the latest information on the person police were searching for and eventually arrested.
Sex Assault Kit Folo	NEWS	7/14	Our investigative team followed up on a previous story about the backlog of more than 16 thousand sexual assault case. Today the Department of Justice launched a new online database to add a layer of accountability and transparency. We also learned that more than 80 percent of the kits requiring testing had been tested.
ECU Announcement on new Mental Health facility	NEWS	7/19	A new state-of-the-art facility is meant to decrease the number of people with Mental Health issues that are placed on ENC jails. In Pitt County we found out there were 20 inmates who need to receive help for mental illness and not be locked up. The new facility will also help families with children who are currently driving 75 miles to receive care.
Shark Research in ENC	NEWS	7/19	With Shark Week coming up we checked in with researchers at one of the top labs in the country, right here in Morehead City. Reporter Lucy Nelson learned they are working on cutting edge research by tagging and tracking sharks to discover trends and traits. They also found that as the waters get warmers it's attracting more bonnet head sharks to the area.

Wayne County Deputy Killed and two others injured	NEWS	8/2	We kept the community up to date with the latest information on the Wayne County deputy who was shot and killed and the recovery of two other deputies who survived. We broke down the latest information on law enforcement deaths nationwide and statewide. We showed viewers the memorials going up and told them how they could help all the families impacted.
How Safe are Schools?	NEWS	7/28	The school shooting in Uvalde, Texas sparked conversations across the country about how safe schools are. ITEAM reporter Kate Hussey reached out to every school district and every sheriff's office in our area to find out what they're doing to protect students.
School Security Folo- School SROS's	NEWS	8/16	We continued to look into safety measures in schools across our area and found a critical shortage of school resource officers in many of our districts. While all 15 counties in our area stepped up efforts by performing school auditions, lockdown drills and active shooter training at least 8 of our districts were having a hard time these officers
Rebuild NC	NEWS	8/18	We continue to uncover more problems for the state-run program called Rebuild NC. The state is now investigating flooding victims' claims that they were misled and lied to. We first did the story back in May and since then many more victims came forward. Legal Aid NC believes the program designed to help low income families has deep flaws, harming the poor, primarily minorities.
