911 Accuracy	NEWS	10/14	In an investigative piece we tested the new 911 system for accuracy. North Carolina recently
			upgraded its statewide system to make it easier to locate 911 calls from cell phones. Our investigation revealed if you called 911 from right outside the 911 center it showed the caller was one mile away which was not correct. But we also learned within seconds, the telecommunicator pinpointed the location with a secondary locating system called Rapid SOS.
Emerald Isle Car Chase	NEWS	10/14	A Newport man was charged with leading police and deputies on a high-speed chase through Emerald Isle. It started when police say Dylan Norton tried to steal a rifle. Employees were able to wrestle it away from him but then he led police on a chase. We spoke to people who witnessed the chase and law enforcement providing the public with the latest on the case. We later would do an ITEAM piece featuring Norton talking about mental illness.
COVID Hospital Policy Controversy	NEWS	10/15	A Carteret County woman reached out to us for help after she says her children were denied to the chance to say goodbye to their father before he passed away from COVID because of the hospitals visitation policy. We reached out to other hospitals in the area to compare policies and learned they have similar policies, but all make exceptions for family members whenever possible. The woman hoped by sharing her story would bring change to hospitals.
Greenville Bar Ordinance	NEWS	11/9	Greenville City Council members are looking to change an ordinance that limits the numbers of bars and nightclubs in the city. In past bars and night clubs had to be 500 feet apart from each other. Council wants to look at these permits on a case by case basis and see if an exception needs to be made. Businesses in the area support the change in an attempt to continue to grow the downtown area.

Mental Health Concerns	NEWS	11/26	In October we covered a high-speed chase that led to the arrest of 19-year-old Dylan Norton. We later learned his extremely bizarre behavior that day is symptomatic of what his mother describes as severe mental illness. Through our investigation we learned his mother repeatedly sought help for her son only to find the state mental health system, as she described it, broken. Our ITEAM looked into the states system and found it had a D minus rating saying North Carolina does not have a tool-kit to help people with mental illness.
Waitress Altering Tips Investigation	NEWS	12/7	A Snapperz Bar and Grill employee is arrested and charged for altering tips. We sat down with the owner of the restaurant who says he wants to right the wrong and is paying customers who were cheated back. We spoke with the Better Business Bureau to tell viewers what they can do to protect themselves against something like this in the future, including putting a \$ sign before the one or beginning of your tip. This is a good way to make sure there is no space for a tip to be altered.
FED Ex Package Dumping	NEWS	12/14	A FedEX driver is arrested and charged after authorities say he dumped a truckload of packages into the woods behind an apartment complex in Greenville. Police contacted FedEx and they sent another driver to pick up the packages and deliver them to more than 70 different locations.
School Shooting Threats	NEWS	12/15	We had a number of school threats. In Onslow County the BOE held a special meeting to discuss the number of threats. We covered the meeting but also spoke to a local expert on school threats to give perspective to viewers on what we're seeing. She explained that anytime after you have a recent school shooting like in Michigan, threats increase. She said add that with the holidays and end of semester exams that it creates the perfect storm.
