The first locally-produced, early morning news program in the market, GOOD MORNING EASTERN NORTH CAROLINA, is hosted by Anna Bulszewicz along with Meteorologist Les Still. The show provides 120 minutes of overnight local and national news, sports weather, financial and agri-business updates, as well as regional feature reports about the people, places and events of interest. GMENC began broadcasting in high definition Monday, June 27, 2010 as the first morning newscast in the market in HD.

DR. OZ

Beginning September 14, 2009 Dr. Mehmet Oz joined the lineup with a multi-topic, multi-segment health and wellness show offering topical, newsworthy information and inspiring stories in an upbeat and entertaining hour that features Dr. Oz's unique point of view and experts in various fields.

Broadcast: Mon. through Fri 4:00 – 5:00 PM

NEWS CHANNEL 12 AT NOON

Anchor Anna Bulszewicz along with Meteorologist Les Still provide current news, weather and sports. A regular major feature of the program, Family Health Watch, provides news and information of medical concerns.

The Noon newscast began broadcasting in high definition Monday, June 27, 2010 as the first noon newscast in the market in HD.

NEWS CHANNEL 12 AT FIVE

Premiering Monday, April 13, 1992, NewsChannel 12 News At 5 offers headlines of the day and entertainment news with Anchors Wes Goforth and Valentina Wilson, and weather with Chief Meteorologist Skip Waters. The format of the program is lighter than the 6:00 PM newscast, but still offers the day's top news. The 5 PM newscast began broadcasting in high definition Monday, June 27, 2010 as the first 5PM newscast in the market in HD.

CHILDREN'S PROGRAMMING

The following programs are not broadcast within the core programming time period, and will not be considered as part of WCTI's children's core programs. However, because of the content and educational purpose of the programs, we submit them as part of this report to show good intent.

TELESTORY TIME

Hosted by local librarian Miss Elinor Hawkins, the program is specifically designed for children 2--11 years of age. Each week, Miss Elinor reads several story books that deal with basic moral and ethical qualities desirable in young children. The program is a local entity, having been on the air now for 50 years, and satisfies the requirements for the Children's Television Act, as it has since its inception. The program is edited for a maximum of 4:00 available commercial inventory for the 30-minute time period, and is generally filled with public service and promotional announcements.

Broadcast: Saturday 6:00--6:30 AM.
