Station WCTI, Greenville, New Bern, Washington, NC, aired over 1,300 public service announcements this year, covering several topics that range from education, health, public safety, etc. These public service announcements air at various times and may run anywhere from 0:05 seconds to 0:60 seconds in length. Station WCTI regularly airs public notice announcements notifying the public about the availability of children's programming, equal employment opportunity, and public file reports. Weather alerts and announcements are regularly broadcasted and posted on WCTI on an as-needed basis. Station WCTI is a participating station in our area's Emergency Alert system.

ISSUE	PROGRAM	DATE	SUBJECT
Long Term Beach Damage	NEWS	10/5	Following the passing of the remnants of Hurricane Ian along the Crystal Coast community leaders in several coastal communities assess long term environmental impacts to the beach front from the storm. Community leaders are concerned after the multi-million dollar beach renourishment in year prior and the long term damage moving forward.
Neighborhood Geese	NEWS	10/18	Members of a neighborhood in New Bern came to us concerned about the number of geese and other waterfowl taking up residence in community ponds. They are experiencing issues with the animals congregating in yards and blocking traffic. We took their concerns to city leaders.
School Nutrition Program	NEWS	10/4	Our reporter profiled a program through the state Education Department to supply healthy snacks including fresh fruits and vegetables to students in low performing schools. One of the schools participating in the program in Eastern North Carolina I Ben D. Quinn Elementary School in New Bern.
NC Nursing Shortage	NEWS	12/7	Our reporter profiled the struggle at many hospitals and medical centers in Eastern North Carolina to fill staff positions while being impacted by rising numbers of flu and COVID cases. A North Carolina Nursing organization estimates a shortage of over 12-thousand nurses in the next 10 years in North Carolina. The story focused on UNC Health Lenoir which is a smaller rural hospital struggling to maintain care with fewer nurses.

ISSUE	PROGRAM	DATE	SUBJECT
NC Power Grid Security	NEWS	12/5	After the attack on an electrical sub station in Moore County, NC, we raised questions about the safety and security of the state's electrical grid. We talked to an ECU professor who is an expert in security about what should be done to prevent future attacks.
Kinston Crime Meeting	NEWS	12/15	In the wake of a string of shootings in the city of Kinston, we cover a series of community meetings between the public, police and city leaders to address the problem and find solutions. We talked with community activists who say more needs to be done as well as the new police chief who is dealing with severe staffing issues.
Changes to School Search Policies	NEWS	10/6	After a concerned parent came to us over the summer after her daughter was subjected to a pat down search from a male school administrator, we have been inquiring about the search policies at Eastern North Carolina schools. Our stories resulted in a state legislator introducing legislation to standardize search policies across the state.
Rebuild NC	NEWS	12/8	We continue to uncover more problems for the state-run program called Rebuild NC. The state is now investigating flooding victims' claims that they were misled and lied to. We first did the story back in May and since then many more victims came forward. Legal Aid NC believes the program designed to help low income families has deep flaws, harming the poor, primarily minorities.
