### FUNERAL FOR OFFICER ALEXANDER THALMANN

On Friday, April 4 WCTI provided live coverage of New Bern Police Officer Alexander Thalmann's funeral services from 1:45 – 3:27 PM. WCTI provided live pool coverage of the funeral services for area television stations including the officer's arrival at Temple Baptist Church in New Bern, the funeral service, and departure of the casket on a horse-drawn caisson.

#### SEVERE WEATHER COVERAGE

On Monday, April 7 severe weather raced through Beaufort, Hyde and Washington Counties with violent tornadoes with wind speeds of 111-135 MPH and touchdown of an EF2 tornado. WCTI provided live weather coverage from 4:19-5:08 PM and continued with coverage during the 5:30 and 6:00 PM newscasts.

Again on Friday, April 25 from 4:28 – 6:06 PM and 7:11 – 8:34 PM WCTI kept viewers informed of severe weather in Beaufort County with live coverage of tornadoes that included the first EF3 of the year nationwide according to the National Weather Service.

## U.S. SENATE REPUBLICAN CANDIDATE DEBATE

Saturday, April 26 at 7:00 PM WCTI aired a 30-minute debate of the leading Republican candidates for U.S. Senate. The debate was tape-delayed from the live event on Wednesday, April 23, 2014.

The program is edited for a maximum of 4:00 available commercial inventory for the 30-minute time period, and is generally filled with public service and promotional announcements.
