Last month, the National Transportation Safety Board released a report saying that pilot, Ernest Rawls, didn't adequately conduct preflight planning, have inadequate inflight monitoring of the airplane's flight parameters, and fail to regain control of the airplane following entry into an inadvertent aerodynamic stall brought about the accident.
