THE PROGRAM IS A LOCAL ENTITY, HAVING BEEN ON THE AIR FOR OVER 50 YEARS, AND SATISFIES THE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CHILDREN'S TELEVISION ACT.

ENVIRONMENT	NEWS	6/15	A raw sewage leak is reported at a local apartment complex. Management was not doing anything to clean it up until our reporter started making calls. Within hours, the leak was stopped and cleaned up and environmental officials were on scene to assess.

GOVERNMENT	NEWS	6/4	Legislators work on a bill to allow new teen drivers to get their temporary license without taking the on the road driving test. This is because that test is halted currently due to COVID. The bill goes into effect in July.
GOVERNMENT	NEWS	6/15	The US Postal Service announced it will be out of money by September if it does not receive \$75 Billion in emergency funding. This comes as millions are expected to mail-in their ballots for November's elections due to COVID concerns.
