9/18		A Republic resident was injured Sunday afternoon in a two-vehicle crash in Ishpeming Township. A 25-year-old Marquette man struck a

56-year-old motorcyclist. The cyclist was taken by ambulance to UPHS-Marquette for non-life-threatening injuries.
