Dear Affiliate Partner:

To assist you in complying with the reporting requirements for children's television and the requirement that stations air "core" children's programming, we are providing you with episode-specific descriptions (the '**NBC Kids**' educational and informational programming block) as set forth in the attached Community Relations Quarterly Children's Programming Report for the 4th quarter of 2013. The report includes information to help prepare FCC Form 398. Please note that we have not included the specific dates and times for each of the programs as that may be station-specific.

This report is divided into the following categories:

1. Educational Objectives: NBC Kids for both 4th quarter 2013 and 1st quarter 2014.
2. Core programming: Regularly scheduled programming furnished by the NBC Network that is specifically designed to serve the early educational and informational needs of children 16 and under. Each of these programs is identified on-air as educational and informational with the "E/I" icon, and is similarly identified to the national listing services. To assist stations with the preemption report section of FCC Form 398, we have added specific episode numbers. Please note that the age target for NBC Kids programming is identified as 2-5 years old.
3. Other programming: Programming furnished by the NBC Network that contributes to the educational and informational needs of children 16 and under, but is not specifically designed to meet the educational and informational needs of children.
4. Public service announcements targeted to children 16 and under.
5. Non-broadcast efforts that enhance the educational and informational value of NBC Network programming to children.
6. Network on-air promotional efforts, which include a schedule of NBC on-air promos for NBC Kids programming.

Except as set forth below, the regularly-scheduled children's programming and promotional content furnished to you by the NBC Network during the 4th quarter of 2013 complied with the commercial limits of the Children's Television Act, and 47 C.F.R. §§ 73.670(a)-(d), provided that you broadcast and distributed such programming as furnished to you by NBC, and did not add any promotional or advertising content thereto other than as directed by NBC via weekly postings on APT.

On October 12, 2013, the closing credits for "Lazytown," an educational and informational program supplied to the NBC Network by Sprout for the "NBC Kids" Saturday morning E/I block, inadvertently included a fleeting (one-half second) display of the URL for a web site (www.lazytown.com) that did not conform to the FCC's commercial limits rules for web site displays in children's programming. Even though the display of the URL was fleeting, and therefore barely discernible by viewers, it is possible that the FCC would consider this a violation of the commercial limits rules.

The NBC Network takes precautions to avoid any potential violations of the FCC's web site rules. Specifically, each episode of the "NBC Kids" Saturday morning E/I block is reviewed by

Sprout, whose policy is to remove all URLs from program materials. In this case, however, the display of the URL in the closing credits was so fleeting it was missed during the review process. The NBC Network is working with Sprout to develop and implement additional procedures to minimize the possibility of a re-occurrence of this isolated incident.

4th QUARTER 2013 EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

In compliance with the Children's Television Act regulations that became effective January 2, 1997, the **NBC kids** programming block features an on-air icon (E/I) indicating that each program is "educational and informational" for children. **This icon is displayed throughout each program.** Also, in compliance with the regulations, the following document, which includes "early educational and informational" objectives of **NBC kids**, must be placed in your public file.

The **NBC kids** programming block also meets the requirements for video described content, as established by the Twenty-first Century Communications and Video Accessibility Act, effective October 8, 2010. Full-power affiliates of NBC that are located in the 25 television markets with the largest number of television households must provide video-described content at any time they are providing children's programming. Each episode of content can be aired no more than twice in the calendar year.

Each of the programs listed below, which make up the three hour **NBC kids** programming block, is specifically designed to serve the early educational and informational needs of children ages 2-5. All of the programs have educational objectives and messages that are core to the content and appropriate for the program genre.

From October 5, 2013 – December 28, 2013, **NBC kids** aired five shows returning from the 3rd Quarter 2013. These are: **Justin Time, Lazy Town, Pajanimals, The Chica Show and Tree Fu Tom.** The sixth show, **Make Way for Noddy** premiered October 5, 2013.

All six shows were developed specifically for a target audience composed of children ages 2-5. All of the shows have a narrative format. Four use elements of fantasy and imagination to develop the educational content. These shows are **The Pajanimals, Justin Time, The Chica Show and Tree Fu Tom.** **Tree Fu Tom** and **The Chica Show** combine live action with animation; **Lazy Town** is live action with puppets, and the remainder of the schedule is animation.

The Chica Show features a five-year-old "baby" chick who spends her days with her parents in their costume shop, the Coop. The shop's one employee, Kelly, doubles as Chica's nanny and the ensemble is rounded out with Bunji, a large floppy eared rabbit and Stitches, a straw mannequin that sits in the window. In each episode Chica develops or encounters a problem that she cannot immediately resolve. Usually her issues involve impulse control, distractibility, judgment, and inter-personal behaviors. She and Kelly usually work on the problem through an adventure—a fantasy transformation to animation-- where Bunji and Stitches come alive and join Chica and Kelly for the problem solving process. The core educational content is primarily socio-emotional development, and Chica learns how to express herself properly, think before she acts, and interact with others effectively. She often learns that it takes hard work and practice to become proficient at different skills.

Pajanimals are a group of four preschool aged puppets that live together in a house with their off-screen mother and father. They reside primarily in their bedroom, a dormitory of sorts, where they complete their nighttime routine of brushing teeth and conversing quietly before falling to sleep. The quiet time always turns into a discussion that results in a dream-like adventure to solve a problem, such as overcoming shyness, making a new friend, or dealing with a bully. The adventure takes place in several nighttime dream locales where special friends help them work through the social/emotional problem of the day. Specific approaches to managing the problem are demonstrated and practiced throughout the adventure.

The children return home in time to get ample rest, confident about-facing their issues when they awaken the following day.

Justin Time features a little boy, Justin, who wants very much to master his destiny, have great adventures, and solve problems. He begins with a problem that vexes him and daydreams his way into an adventure that takes him to different places around the world, providing him with an experience to help solve his problem when he returns home. Justin is accompanied by two imaginary friends throughout his adventures; Olive, a knowledgeable playmate, and Squidgy, the morphing flying sponge, who provides commentary and comedy along the way. Some examples of Justin's lessons involve learning that it takes focus to achieve success, our failures can teach what we need to do to succeed next time, or when one path to solve a problem doesn't work, you can find an alternative way to achieve your goal. Justin promotes self-directed learning from the young child's perspective and imagination.

Tree Fu Tom, is a live action/animated series about a little boy who lives in a rural area and has a rich fantasy life in the woods behind his home. Tom uses specific movements to summon up magic powers that permit him to morph into an animated hero and fly around in Treetopolis, the fantasy version of his woods. While in Treetopolis, Tom and his friends, Ariella, Twigs, Squirmturn and Zigzoo will invariably run into a problem or disaster that needs fixing. Tom calls upon the audience to practice original dance moves that will bring him "Big World" magic so he and his friends can resolve their challenge of the day. Educational messages reinforce positive socio-emotional content, with examples that model: being loyal to good friends, knowing how to ask for help, doing the right thing instead of what is convenient, making the effort to share rather than being selfish or relying on teamwork in order to accomplish a goal.

Lazy Town encourages fitness and healthful habits for preschool children. In the imaginary setting of Lazy Town, characters' eating and fitness habits are linked to problem solving in their world. The lead character is Stephanie, a young girl who guides the audience through the story as she and her friends ("human" puppets) and her Uncle (Mayor Milford Meanswell) navigate life within Lazy Town. Robbie Rotten, the underground spy and influencer who personifies the ethos of Lazy Town, is determined to ruin the health and fitness practices of Stephanie and her friends. When the kids have difficulty with Robbie Rotten, Sportacus, a gymnast/athlete prepared to answer any call for help, comes to the rescue from his home in a zeppelin-like aircraft that hovers over earth. The underlying themes of Lazy Town stress the importance of eating "sports candy" (aka fruits and vegetables), always obtaining sufficient sleep, and going outside to engage in a wide range of physical activities including playing games, competing athletically, and even building forts and play structures.

Make Way for Noddy is based on a recurring character in the Enid Blyton book series for very young readers. Noddy, a boy doll, lives in a little cottage in the village of Toyland. He tools around in his sporty convertible, delivers the mail, and is a friend to all. Because he is very kind to others, he invariably is asked to help solve problems. But because he doesn't know everything, he also has a lot to learn. In each episode Noddy actively finds a way manage a project, soothe hurt feelings, settle arguments, or learn how to do something new by following directions. The examples in each episode are age appropriate challenges for children in the target audience and model clear and concrete solutions to problems.

1st QUARTER 2014 EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

Noodle and Doodle will be returning to the schedule for Q1, 2014, replacing Pajanimals.

Noodle and Doodle, an instructional series, features creating art projects and cooking projects around a specific theme. Host, Sean, drives around in a double-decker bus fully equipped with art supplies and a kitchen, ready for any assignment. The projects encourage parent engagement and often feature families working together to make something to display within the child's home. Sean's side-kick, Doggity, is an ever-faithful beagle who transforms into an animated character during interstitial trips to a parallel universe, set in a kitchen full of prank playing animated characters. The art projects typically promote utilizing recycled materials in order to demonstrate that creativity can transform something intended for one purpose into something that achieves a completely different goal.

4th QUARTER 2013 SHOW SUMMARIES

The Chica Show features a five-year-old "baby" chick who spends her days with her parents in their costume shop, the Coop. The shop's one employee, Kelly, doubles as Chica's nanny and the ensemble is rounded out with Bunji, a large floppy eared rabbit and Stitches, a straw mannequin that sits in the window. Chica's parents were formerly entertainers in the vaudeville tradition and they regale the audience with stories and songs from their theatrical past. They enjoy and indulge Chica, who sometimes acts younger than her age and gets into all kinds of predicaments. Kelly uses fantasy play to transform herself, Chica, Bunji and Stitches into animated characters in another universe, who are struggling with a problem similar to the one Chica experienced in the Coop. Without fail, they find the problem can be solved and they carry that knowledge back to the Coop to use on another day.

Pajanimals focuses on teaching bedtime routines and practicing them consistently so children can get a good night's sleep. In each episode one of the main characters—Apollo the dog, Squacky, the duck, Sweetpea Sue, a horse, and Cowbella, a purple and white cow—has difficulty sleeping or faces a problem. They all pile onto one of the beds and are whisked off to a land of adventure that offers solutions to their problems. Each bed travels to a specific place for the adventure: Squacky's bed goes to Ellie the octopus who lives in the Big Blue Sea and to Coach Whistler who lives in Land of Play; Cowbella's bed goes to Edwin, who lives in Storybook Land and to Jerry Bear, who lives in the Big Friendly Forest; Apollo's bed goes to the Moon who is in the Night Sky, and Sweetpea Sue's bed goes to Mr. Happy Birthday, a porcupine who resides in Birthday Land, and Bedtimes Bunny who lives in the Land of Hush. Each show ends with the problem resolved and the Pajanimals tucked into their beds for a good night's rest.

Justin Time is an animated show specifically directed to the preschool audience and always conveys an embedded lesson; it is possible to understand and manage any problem you have by thinking about it creatively. Justin is a little boy who has two imaginary playmates, **Olivia** (who meets him on his travels) and **Squidgy** the sponge (who also lives in Justin's bedroom). When Justin has a problem or doesn't want to do something his mother has suggested he daydreams his way into an adventure that takes him to places all around the world. On these adventures, he meets Olivia who guides him through an experience that demonstrates to Justin how he can solve his problem. The show provides many facts about the context the characters visit while on the adventure, but the central point is to teach a lesson about a social/emotional dilemma universally experienced by preschool children.

Tree Fu Tom focuses on the amazing adventures of a young boy called Tom who, with the power of ‘movement magic’ called ‘Tree Fu’, can transform into a tiny but mighty magical super hero and travel to a wondrous enchanted kingdom called Treetopolis that exists in a tree in his backyard woods. During each program he calls upon the audience to follow his moves to send him the “Big World” magic he needs to solve a problem encountered by Tom and his friends. These include Ariella, a butterfly who is also a rancher and has rope lassoing skills; Twigs, an acorn sprite who folds himself into an acorn when he’s frightened, Squirmturn, a pill bug who looks like a large and imposing coal miner but is often timid and fearful, and Zigzoo, a green tree frog and the resident genius inventor. In each episode there are an action adventure sequences that are key to resolving the challenge of the day.

Lazy Town is a show featuring the importance of health, fitness, and being good friends. Set in a fantasy world known as Lazy Town, which is populated by inactive residents, we meet a visitor named Stephanie who is determined to coax her friends and relatives into adopting a healthful, active life style. She wins over her new friends, Ziggy, Stingy, Trixie and Pixel, convincing them to leave their gaming consoles and candy stashes at home so they can go outside and play. She persuades her uncle, Mayor Milford Meanswell, and his friend Ms. Busy Body to support her efforts. Robbie Rotten, who lives underground, and is determined to return Lazy Town to its former state of inactivity and quiet, constantly foils the characters’ efforts. Coming to the rescue is the athlete Sportacus who lives in a zeppelin-like aircraft and receives signals from the kids or the Mayor whenever they need help. Sportacus has two goals, to keep the peace and to promote healthful, positive living. When Robbie Rotten is discovered and contained through comic pratfalls, he returns to his underground lair and all is well in Lazy Town, until another day and another time when Robbie will rise again.

Make Way for Noddy is based on a recurring character in the Enid Blyton book series for very young readers. Noddy, a boy doll, lives in a little cottage in the village of Toyland. He tools around in his sporty convertible, delivers the mail, and is a friend to all. Noddy is surrounded by a large cast of other toy characters some of whom are mentors, and a few others who are mischief makers in Toyland. In every episode of Noddy, there is a challenge experienced by Noddy or someone else in Toyland that lends itself to a humorous and lighthearted resolution. Whether it’s Martha the monkey getting her undoing for her selfish ways, Mr. Wobblyman learning to play soccer with no legs, or Noddy trying to assemble a kite, the characters in Toyland work out their issues and live together in harmony.

1st QUARTER 2014 SHOW SUMMARIES

Noodle and Doodle will be returning to the schedule for Q1, 2014, replacing **Pajanimals**

Noodle and Doodle is a live-action show hosted by Sean Roach that also blends animation and puppetry into the overall format. **Sean** drives a double-decker bus into various communities to meet children who have written to him with a problem that they would like to solve using an art and/or a food experience. Sean is accompanied by **Noodle**, a puppet character and **Doodle**, a digital character that lives inside a tablet computer, and **Doggity**, a faithful beagle. Doggity has a mini-show of his own through an animated alter ego that appears during diversionary segments set in a restaurant kitchen. The show demonstrates how recycled materials can become art and how food, art, and problem solving can be combined to create a fun experience in everyday life. Every episode can be replicated at home with ease by parents and children playing together.

THE CHICA SHOW

VROOM, VROOM CHICA [ETCS112DH]

Chica is frustrated when she is "it" for a game of freeze tag because she is not fast enough to "tag" anyone and make them freeze. When the shop closes and she and Kelly go on their fantasy adventure, Chica, Kelly, Bunji, and Stitches are in an Indy 500 type race. Though she is in last place Chica perseveres and keeps going when her friends have to drop out of the race. She ultimately wins the race because she didn't give up when others had to quit. She tries her skill on Kelly when they return to the shop and she's able to catch Kelly at an opportune moment and tag for a "freeze."

[Educational Message: Sometimes a game is won based on perseverance, not by speed. Just take things at your own pace and eventually others will have to slow down or stop. Then you can move ahead and achieve your goals.]

CHICA, THE BOCK-A-DOODLE BUILDER [ETCS112DH]

Mrs. C is taking a customer on a tour of the shop, recounting her famous costumes. Chica enters in a self-made airplane and announces that she wants to build an airport inside the shop. Despite being told by Kelly that an airport is too big for the shop, Chica persists in trying to do something BIG. She doesn't accept the idea that "small is beautiful" too. While on their fantasy adventure Chica is the "boss" of a building company, and builds Bunji a HUGE house just to fix a broken roof shingle. Bunji finds the new house overwhelming. Chica has to tear it down and return to building something much smaller. Upon her return to the shop, Chica draws plan for new shingle for Bunji's cage.

[Educational Message: A large size isn't always the most important thing you can do to make an impression. Sometimes the small things are more appropriate and just as appreciated.]

PAJANIMALS

LET'S PLAY TOGETHER [EPAJ116DH]

Apollo and Sweetpea Sue invite the others to play, and then decide to exclude them because it's a "big kid's game." At bedtime, Squacky and Cowbella are so mad that they cannot fall asleep. The Pajanimals take an adventure to the Land of Play to see Coach Whistler. He reminds them that excluding your loved ones is hurtful and everyone should be included. Apollo and Sweetpea apologize and the Pajanimals return to bed feeling better and have a good night's rest.

[Educational Message: Always include friends in every game because it's not nice to tell someone they cannot play.]

TEAM FORT [EPAJ116DH]

Apollo and Squacky ask the girls for their blankets to build a fort, but when they see how great it is they decide to take their things back and build their own. Their fight gets so big that they stop sharing everything and give each other the silent treatment. The Pajanimals decide to visit the Land of Build It to help fix their problem. Frank and Hank teach them that working as a team helps you work better and faster and work together.

[Educational Message: When you play together you have to share, listen and work as a team.]

JUSTIN TIME

TOWER OF JUSTIN [EJTM114DH]

Justin is building but his towers continue to fall down. Squidgy wants to help, and they plan to make the tower very tall, but it still falls down. Justin enters his imaginary world where they are all construction builders in New York City. They learn to consider many factors and to have a plan when constructing a building. Once they realize they need to plan for each step and think ahead they are able to succeed.

[Educational Message: It is important to plan ahead in order to succeed.]

THE THIRSTY GARDEN [EJTM114DH]

Justin's mom asks him to water the flowers. When the water flow stops, they have to figure out why. Justin travels through his imagination to meet Olive in Babylon's Hanging Gardens. When the water stops in those beautiful gardens, they follow the water's path to find the problem. Along the way they meet many friends in need of the water, and so they keep going to find the water wheel is jammed. They are able to fix the problem and the gardens are watered again. Justin returns home and follows the hose to find the problem and untangle it, so that he can finish watering the flowers.

[Educational Message: When problems arise, it is important to follow them to the source, instead of giving up.]

TREEFLE TOM [ETFT115DH]

The friends discover "treefles" and go mad for their delicious taste! Zigzoo invents a machine to sniff out the treefles, but they destroy it in their greedy madness. They each become selfish and determined to gather all the treefles for themselves. When everyone is trapped in a cavern, they must work together to save themselves from disaster. But it is more difficult than they expect, they have to earn each other's trust to guide each other through unexpected adventures.

[Educational Message: It is best to share with friends instead of being selfish; if you find yourself being self-centered you will have to make up your mind to work together and share.]

LAZY TOWN

ROBOTICUS [ELZT301DH]

When Sportacus saves the day again, Robbie Rotten decides to order a robot that is faster and stronger than Sportacus to be the town's one and only superhero. While Sportacus retreats to get faster and stronger and regain his position, "Roboticus" and Robbie Rotten prevent the children from having playtime. The kids decide to challenge Roboticus as a team. During the challenge Roboticus uses many obstacles to cheat and prevent the kids from winning, while Robbie traps Sportacus underground so that he can't join the kids' team. Sportacus breaks free and joins the team, as the kids use teamwork and their wits to get through the race, with a little help from their true hero, Sportacus. When the kids and Sportacus win, Robbie Rotten's role as Roboticus' sponsor is revealed.

[Educational Message: When there is a challenge, you can work hard as an individual to prepare yourself and then as a team work together to succeed.]

SHELF HELP [EMWN101D]

Noddy wakes up ready to face the day all by himself. But when he can't open a jar he immediately drives over to Big Ears' house for help as though he had an emergency. He continues to interrupt Big Ears for every little thing until finally Big Ears puts on a disguise and tricks Noddy into learning now to help himself. Noddy later actually assembles his kite without any help from Big Ears.

[Educational Message: If you can think problems through by yourself, you will be able to do things on your own.]

NODDY'S SPECIAL TREAT [EMWN101D]

Mr. Claude is naming a winner for a trip to the seaside. Little Skippy Skittle really wants to go because he missed the family vacation due to an ankle injury. Noddy wins the train trip and Martha Monkey tries to coerce Noddy into taking her. Then Mr. Jumbo pesters him too. But Big Ears advises him to think about who he would like to travel with, and Noddy's better judgment prevails. He takes Skippy Skittle to the shore for a holiday.

[Educational Message: Be a good judge of character and don't let others sway your feelings. Your true friends will be glad you've made the right decision.]

THE CHICA SHOW

FARMER CHICA [ETCS113DH]

Something is shaking up the costume shop as though an earthquake is occurring. It turns out that the shaking is the crunch of Jet biting a carrot. He has food from the farmer's market to share but Chica has no time to eat fruits and vegetables. She wants to quickly eat a bag of chips and continue playing in her farmer costume. She tires early because she didn't eat properly and on the fantasy adventure, the problem repeats itself. Chica won't eat a good breakfast and gets so tired she can't even feed her horse. When they return home, Chica eats some healthful food so that she and Kelly have enough energy to walk home and make dinner with Mr. and Mrs. C.

[Educational Message: You have to eat healthful food like fruits and vegetables to have enough energy to do all the things you want to do everyday.]

BOCK-A-DOODLE DOO, I LOVE YOU! [ETCS113DH]

Chica's parents are so nice and Chica wants to do something special to show how much she loves them. Chica and Kelly open a spa for Mrs. C and build a hammock for Mr. C. When an order comes in for a Yak costume, Chica assumes she can fill the order (so her parents can rest), but alas, while the costume is a Chica original, it is not a Yak. Chica feels she totally let her parents down and they won't love her anymore. On their fantasy adventure, Chica and Bunji are parents whose children, Kelly and Stiches accidentally toss Bunji's perfect carrot cake into the air. She suggests flowers. Mr. Wobblyman suggests a birthday cake is really the most important gift but he eats most of the batter leaving Noddy with just enough for a cupcake. Sly and Gobby tell Noddy to give her jewelry and then trick him, stealing his car with the cake and flowers. In the end, Noddy gets his car and goes to sing to Tessie. It turns out this was the best gift she ever had from anyone.

[Educational Message: The perfect gift doesn't have to look or seem perfect to others, it needs to come from the heart and makes someone feel very special.]

So they move on to Chica's magic trick to make Stitches disappear and it is a failure too. Kelly tells her to just have confidence and believe in herself. Chica tries again and Stitches disappears, and she makes him reappear. The audience is very pleased.

On the fantasy adventure, Chica and Kelly go to a Halloween Party and Chica changing her costumes so frequently she misses the party activities. Kelly tells her that she has to make a decision and if she sticks with it she will have the time to go have fun with everyone. She decides to dress up as a Kelly look-alike for Halloween.

When the clock strikes noon, Noddy starts calling off all the obligations he has and realizes things are going to go all wrong for six people he promised he'd help. He realizes he cannot help everyone all the time and everyone decides to do their own chores.

[Educational Message: When you try to help everyone, you sometimes cannot be effective because you are trying to do too much.]

On their fantasy adventure, they go to a ranch where Chica is the boss and suspends all the rules. Soon there are lots of problems; Stitch and

Bunji fall off a fence they've climbed, and the noise Chica and friends make sends horses bolting from the barn. When they return to the Coop, Chica resolves to follow the rules.

[Educational Message: Rules are made for a reason and are there to ensure that everyone can be safe, courteous and orderly.]

ICKY, STICKY, CHICKY [ETCS103DH]

There's an emergency at the Coop; Kelly can't find a costume for a customer who wants to be a caveman. Kelly and Chica disappear into a "cave" deep beneath the clothing rack. Mom and Dad then decide they need to figure out a way to better manage inventory so Chica makes signs that illustrate the types of costumes. However, she doesn't want to wash off the glue and other decorations that got stuck in her feathers. During the fantasy adventure, Kelly and Chica are outside in a prehistoric forest and get really dirty with mud. After bathing in a pond, the group plays again when they are clean and realize it feels pretty good to not be messy and dirty.

[Educational Message: When you get icky, sticky, and dirty from playing or doing a project, be sure to clean up the mess you made, including the mess that gets left on yourself.]

A LAUGH A MINUTE [EPAJ124DH]

Squacky is trying to do a magic trick but when it doesn't go right, Sweetpea Sue laughs at the tricks and hurts his feelings. Squacky's is sad, so the Pajanimals visit Bedtime Bunny who explains that it is not nice to hurt your friends' feelings by laughing at them. Sweetpea apologizes to Squacky and they return to home to rest.

[Educational Message: It is fine to laugh with your friends but never at them.]

NO MORE BULLIES [EPAJ124DH]

When Apollo loses the game of "Cowbella Says" he feels badly and decides to quit. He tells them that the bigger kids at school said he is bad at playing games and has big ears. The Pajanimals try to cheer him up, but Apollo decides he's not going back to school because the other kids are mean. They visit the Friendly Forest for advice, and Jerry gives Apollo a plan to deal with bullies. Apollo feels much better and is ready to go back to school with the plan.

[Educational Message: If you are being picked on ask them to stop, and if that doesn't work walk away and tell a grown-up.]

They want to dress up in a lion costume, and Mr. Li teaches them the moves to make a wonderful lion dance even from an old costume. They enjoy performing the moves at the festival, even though their costume is not as amazing as the Lion Dance Twins.

[Educational Message: You might not always have the most amazing equipment, but you can be creative, practice, and use teamwork to put forth an amazing performance nonetheless.]

[Educational Message: Pollution causes great harm to the environment.]

In the meantime Sportacus and Robbie Rotten have both fallen into an underground recycling pit designed to crush recyclables. While Sportacus was able to toss Robbie Rotten out of the pit, the kids have to eat sports candy (apples and carrots) and work like a coordinated team to save Sportacus from the crusher. They all recognize the benefit they got from their food fuel and their teamwork in saving their Superhero Sportacus.

[Educational Message: Working together as a team, and using healthy foods and exercise, you can accomplish your goals.]

He wants to figure out how to have a family tree. Big Ears tells him that while he may not have a family tree, he should think about all the people who love him and care about him. Noddy still wonders about the possibility of having a family and ends up getting

tricked by Sly and Gobbo who take him into the Dark Woods to point out his “family tree” only to abandon him and take his car. In the end, when Noddy realizes that everyone in Toy Town was willing to go into the Dark Woods to rescue him as though he were their brother, he realizes he does have a family of friends after all.

[Educational Message: A family tree is actually just a chart of all your relatives; it does not include all the people who love you like family. That’s why we can often treat our friends who love and care about us as though they are family.]

GOOD NEIGHBOR NODDY [EMWN106D]

Noddy plans to have a wonderful day fishing with Big Ears, and he doesn’t let the Skittles or Mr. Jumbo distract from his goal. When he arrives at Big Ears’ cottage, he finds out that the fishing trip will be delayed because Big Ears has a obligation to help Mr. Sparks paint a wall. Noddy doesn’t want to help Big Ears but finally agrees to help and even finds a way to speed up completion of the project so the three friends can all go fishing.

[Educational Message: When we have an obligation to complete a project, it should be done before going out to play. You can even help your friends complete their work if it means all of you will get to play when the work is done.]

When Chica finds him Bunji says he will always watch where he is going.

[Educational Message: The first rule of being safe is always to watch where you are going so you don’t bump into anything or anyone.]

After a customer comes into the store for a Viking costume, Chica wants a Viking costume of her own. Her mother tells her it is possible to make one, and Chica immediately starts gathering materials for her own costume. She sees two large curved carrots that she could use as decorative horns for her helmet and with glue from Kelly, completes her project. However, in the process of rushing around, Chica wasn’t considerate of others, including bumping her father in the head as she pushed him out of the way to dig for supplies. Her Dad reminds her about being courteous and also to feed Bunji before she leaves at the end of the day. Chica realizes she has a problem because she used the carrots meant for Bunji’s dinner. After going on a fantasy adventure with Kelly she meets two rude and obnoxious Vikings she convinces to have better manners.

[Educational Message: Having good manners shows others how much you care about their comfort and sense of well-being.]

HOUSE OF PANCAKES [EPAJ101DH]

The Pajanimals hop on Cowbella’s bed and visit Storybook Land for advice. Edwin shows Sweetpea Sue just how fun things can be when you try something new, like waffles for instance. They head back to bed and Sweetpea Sue vows to try new things from now on.

[Educational Message: If you never try to do something new, you will miss out on really wonderful things.]

MISSING MOM AND DAD [EPAJ101DH]

After hurting herself at the park Sweetpea Sue is worried that something may happen to her at night while Mom and Dad aren’t in the room to help her. The Pajanimals reassure her that their parents are just a call away, but she tries to sneak out and sleep in their room anyway. The Pajanimals hop on Apollo’s bed and travel to the Moon to get some advice. Moon suggests that Sweetpea find other things that help her feel safe and promises that he is always there watching over her.

[Educational Message: When you’re in your bed at night you’re safe and sound, because mom and dad are always close by.]

When they arrive to the party, they admit that they gave everything away along the journey, and Chief Wolf celebrates the sharing which benefitted everyone. When Justin returns home he is confident knowing his old toys will make a new child happy and donates the toys to charity.

[Educational Message: Giving to others when they are in need is very fulfilling.]

When Sportacus goes back to his gym to practice his moves, the kids decide they should figure out who has the invisinator and get it back. Big Ears explains how a chicken is different than a human and the bird should be returned home to live in his pen at Tessie Bear's house.

[Educational Message: Most animals must live in their own home and habitat. If you want a pet you should understand what that animal needs and not try to make the pet You should remember that when you pick up an animal and try to make it live the way you do. The arrangement probably will not work.]

LIE DOWN, MR. WOBBLY MAN [EMWN107D]

It's Mr. Wobbly Man's birthday. Tessie Bear and Noddy celebrate with him and spend the afternoon lying down and looking at the shape of the clouds in the sky. Mr. Wobbly Man cannot lie down because he is so rotund. Noddy and Tessie try to figure out how to help Mr. Wobblyman get in a prone position so he can see the clouds. After many efforts, Noddy finally realizes that while it was not possible to change Mr. Wobblyman so he could lie down, he could take Mr. Wobblyman for a plane ride and he could see the clouds from the air.

[Educational Message: Individual differences are what makes each of us special, so rather than trying to change a person to do things the way you do, you can the way something is done, so each person has the chance to participate.]

[Educational Message: If traveling far from home, enjoy the adventure of being in new places and you can take something familiar with you if it helps to keep you happy when you are away.]

A father and son come into the store and want an artist's costume. When the father shows his son's beautiful painting, Chica is prompted to share her picture of a cow. Kelly doesn't realize it's a cow, nor does she lavish as much attention on Chica's picture, which makes Chica feel less confident about her work. On their fantasy adventure, Chica, Kelly, Stitches and Bunji go to a museum where Stitches and Bunji pose for Chica next to a bowl of fruit and vegetables for a painting. Kelly (as Lavender Lilac) is an art patron who delights in Chica's work and purchases her Still Life. When they return to the store, Chica is confident enough to give Kelly a drawing she made of Bunji and Kelly notices something special; Chica's special signature of polka dots.

[Educational Message: Being a good artist is about enjoying the process of expressing your vision and feelings through painting and drawing. Develop your own style because your vision is what's most important.]

Sweetpea Sue gets up the courage to speak to Ellie the Octopus and learns that her scary legs are not for scaring them at all but are great for giving hugs. The Pajanimals make a brand new friend and head back to bed.

[Educational Message: Sometimes you may be fearful of things you don't know much about, but once you get to know them you will see you can make new friends.]

When they finally get a rescue call, they are needed to rescue a family of ducks. Justin isn't impressed. They rescue a kitten and again Justin isn't satisfied. Olive reminds him that sometimes it is a big rescue and sometimes it isn't. Justin thinks he gets to make a big rescue, when the next call is actually smoke from birthday candles on a cake. Everyone they've rescued is there to celebrate, and he is a hero to each of them. Justin returns home and "rescues" the flowers by watering them for his mom.

[Educational Message: Every rescue doesn't have to be amazing – many times the people in our lives need help with small things that are also very special.]

Noddy accepts Dinah's advice and gets well as shortly after taking his medicine.

[Educational Message: Going to the Dr. and taking medicine might not be fun or tasty, but it is nothing to be afraid of, it will help you feel better.]

NODDY LOSES HIS BELL [EMWN108D]

When Noddy wakes up he takes his taxi around Toy Town to perform his daily duties; providing a ride to customers, and picking up packages for delivery. When he makes a quick stop, he realizes the bell on his hat is missing. He has to figure out how to find it and begins to search frantically all over Toy Land. Finally Big Ears advises him to look only in each place he had visited earlier in the day and Noddy backtracks his day to find his bell in his own front yard.

[Educational Message: When you lose something retrace your steps by going backwards to each place you have been. It's very likely you will find your lost object.]

Mrs. C has a serious case of the Hiccups and Chica, Mr. C and Kelly try a variety of approaches to help her. Chica manages to "scare" the hiccups out of her mother leaving her very proud of her singular accomplishment. Her approach to the hiccups was "better" than everyone else's. Later, after a little boy comes to the shop for a baseball costume, Chica dresses up like a ball player and she and Kelly attempt a game of catch. Chica is unable to catch the ball and feels like giving up because she is not the best, despite Kelly's urging to practice. On their fantasy adventure Chica takes a chance and tries three new games and is really good at just one. She realizes that fun is just as important as being a winner. When they return to the store Chica is willing to give baseball a new try.

[Educational Message: You can have fun at games even if you don't win or perform the best. The most important thing is that you give games a try and to that you have fun, win or lose.]

SUPER CHICA! [ETCS106DH]

Chica feels badly because Bunji has gone missing because she left the cage door open while getting Bunji's food. Chica accepts responsibility for Bunji being lost, but everyone pitches in to find the rabbit. After her parents and Kelly help out, Dad finds Bunji sneaking a nibble of the food left on the floor. Chica is glad Bunji was found, but really wanted to be the one to undo her own mistake. On the fantasy adventure, Chica, Bunji and Kelly are "super heroes" in a city where Mr. Bubledoodoo (Stitches) is blowing so many big bubbles he is a nuisance. In order to stop Mr. Bubledoodoo, they have to work as a team and Chica understands that in some cases, it takes teamwork to solve a problem.

[Educational Message: It is not always possible that one person can be the super problem solver. Sometimes it is necessary to work with a group in order to get the job done and the problem solved.]

Bedtime Bunny explains that Blankie is special because it reminds Squacky of his Mom, so he should try and find something else that reminds him of his mom to cuddle with in the meantime. The Pajanimals take her advice and return to bed for a good night's rest.

[Educational Message: If your special toy every has to go in the laundry, don't worry it will be back before you know it. In the meantime you can find something else you love that is special.]

They utilize the three different tugboats with three unique abilities to carry out the task. They were able to succeed because they worked together using different strengths. When Justin returns home he works with Squidgy to put away his toys.

[Educational Message: Big jobs require teams of people using their unique skills.]

MADE IN THE TRADE [EJTM122DH]

Justin really wants Squidgy's new "Jupiter Storm" marble, and so he offers to trade. They meet Olive in Lothal, India, a major trading port where they help her make trades. Ravi teaches them to make good trades, which are those that make everybody glad. They learn they sometimes need to make multiple trades to make everyone happy by getting whatever it is they want or need. goblins were being selfish and mean, even though they said “please” when they asked for a free ride. Noddy tells them a very firm “NO” the next time he is approached for a free ride.

[Educational Message: You can stand up to people who are being demanding and selfish by saying "NO."]

Noddy considers moving as Master Tubby Bear suggests he might be happier near the center of town where all the excitement is. Noddy tows the house to a new location where he thinks he will be happier. Noddy moves next door to Tessie and her chickens come inside looking for corn. Noddy tows the house to another location next to Mr. Sparks. The noise from the shop is maddening. He then moves to the Town Square where he can see his friends right outside his window. Noddy finds this won't work either and finally heads back to his own space in the “suburbs” of Toy Town, convinced this location is really the best place for him to live.

She has definite ideas about how to manage the circus and it doesn't include listening to the ideas of others. No one's act is satisfactory, according to Chica. On the fantasy adventure with Kelly, Chica finds herself as ringmaster to another circus. She enforces a roll call, and pronounces that HER circus is great, but it needs to become AMAZING. Each performer must change their act. Chica's expectations are too high and the new acts do not work. The performers all quit and Chica realizes that she should have listened to her performers and let them do what they do best.

[Educational Message: When you are the leader, it is important to listen to ideas from your team so you can figure out what they can do well and help make your project a big success.]

With each new act they make mistakes and have to take small steps towards mastery. They learn the lesson and are able to join Yuri and Sasha for a performance. When they return home they continue to practice juggling and have learned to enjoy the mistakes they make.

[Educational Message: It is okay to make mistakes when you are learning something new. A mistake becomes practice for later success.]

When Tessie Bear spills lemonade on her dress, Master Tubby Bear calls her a name : "messy" bear. Then when Noddy tells him it is mean to call names, Master Tubby calls him "nutty" rather than Noddy. When Big Ears eats his sundae in one slurp, Teddy calls him "big mouth". Teddy then moves on to call Mr. Wobblyman, "wishy washy" because he is indecisive. A visit to Mr. Sparks results in him being called Mr. Honks, Clown gets called Frown, and Jumbo becomes "jump-back." But when the Skittles called him "stubby" bear when he is stubs his toe, he realizes that the words he used to describe his friends probably hurt their feelings. Master Tubby Bear arranges to apologize to everyone at the ice cream shop.

[Educational Message: Name calling can be very hurtful, perhaps more hurtful than hitting someone.]

Jett, the delivery man, stubs his toe in the shop. Chica feels that she wasn't important in helping Jett because she didn't have the right sized bandage and she managed to wrap Jett up like a mummy. Her mom, Mrs. C. had the right size bandage and fixed it. On their fantasy adventure, Kelly, Bunji and Chica are all doctors in Fairy Land. Stitches, also a fairy, cannot fly so he knows something is wrong. No one knows exactly what's wrong, but they all try to help Stitches "feel better." A drink of water, a Band-Aid, and a hug from all three "doctors" make Stitches improve Stitches' mood. Even though they did not have a real solution, they discovered how to make a friend feel better.

[Educational Message: Even if you are not a doctor, you can always make someone feel better by being helpful, kind and supportive when another person is hurt or sick.]

She explains that candy is a once in a while food and teaches Cowbella how to calm herself down so she can get some rest.

[Educational Message: Candy is a once in a while treat and too much before bed will make you feel bad.]

The goat will only go down with Olive, so Justin has to encourage her again to overcome her fear, just like she did when climbing up the mountain. [Educational Message: You can help someone overcome their fears by guiding them and encouraging them along the way.]

his yard. He has to develop a plan to find out who is taking the flowers. It turns out to be Bumpy Dog, Tessie's own pet, acting as Noddy's delivery service.

[Educational Message: When your plans to surprise someone get sabotaged, you have to act quickly to find out who and why someone is taking all the fun out of giving your gift. It may be that someone doesn't understand how important it is for you, or perhaps wants to improve upon your effort.]

Series Review

Title: *Taste Buds*

Episodes reviewed: Episode 103 – "Foods That Grow" and Episode 105 – "Foods That Fuel"

Program length: 30 minutes

Taste Buds is a hands-on series that encourages children to think about what they eat, be creative in the kitchen, and explore cool foods from the world around them. After reviewing several episodes, it is apparent that *Taste Buds* works as an educational tool for children 13-16 years of age by communicating a positive message about healthy eating, kitchen safety, and environmental responsibility. Providing teens with a deeper understanding about the foods they eat will lead them to make healthier and smarter decisions as they learn to make food choices for themselves. Each episode imparts different educational and nutritional lessons ranging from foods that smell, to foods that grow, and foods for the brain (to name a few).

In "Foods That Grow," viewers learn how greenhouses sustain vegetable growth during winter, common misconceptions about foods, and how to make healthy meals and snacks like veggie burgers and dip. This episode has educational value as it teaches children about where their food is coming from, as well as important facts about fruits and vegetables that we commonly misunderstand - for example: that avocados are actually berries.

"Foods That Fuel" is a useful educational tool as the episode is a great lesson in healthy eating through illustrating the importance of making smart choices with food. Topics covered include why sugary sports drinks do not provide as much energy as homemade power smoothies and fuel bars, and why our bodies need food in order to perform properly. Viewers are introduced to an Olympic gold medal hockey player who reiterates the importance of a balanced diet. Program: Animal Atlas

Program length: 30 minutes

Summary:

Animal Atlas continues its long series life by using technology to consistently improve the essential visual component of the episodes. The high definition video of the arresting animals and animal elements is well used to engage viewers and lead them through a sequence of valued and meaningful insights. One of the series strengths continues to be that it does not just present a list of animal facts but links a wide variety of information into sequences that make knowledge of the animal kingdom both simpler and easier to remember. The interstitial quizzes have become not just summaries of previous information but a lead-in to the next organized sequence of information. The tone of credited narrator Eric Schwartz is perfect for the target group of 13-16 year-olds. It is non-professorial and faux flip—again, ideal for the target mindset of self-confident adolescence. Yet the vocabulary is rich. It presumes the understanding of the words like "behemoth" and "adaptation" but gives enough context to add that word to young viewers' vocabulary without getting pedantic. Great information in a rich visual context

Episode: "To Tell The Truth" (910)

Animal Atlas is able to move nimbly between television idioms. Here, the tone masquerade as a game show ("To Tell The Truth") allows the examination of a variety of contradictory, confounding, and misunderstood characteristic of animals. These include why whales aren't fish, frogs aren't reptiles, spiders aren't insects and why octopi are closer to snails than fish. Like the series in general, the episode goes beyond listing of facts when, in a sly answer to the interstitial quiz, it states that snakes may have warm blood. When it explains that snakes are not warm-blooded but simply can have warmed blood from exposure to the sun (like all cold-blooded animals), it sneaks deep into the difference between temperature and a temperature-maintenance biological mechanism which is the real differentiator for animals. Facts like the 18 hours a day koala sleeps are blended into a look at nearly everything called a "bear", whether they are truly related or not—and then explains why not. The reviewed episodes offer excellent information on analogous traits in animals without touching on convergence. Finally, the explanation of why the camels' hump is not for water storage is another great use of misconception to explain the marvels of animal adaptation.

Episode: "Living Dinosaurs" (912)

A strong characteristic of **Animal Atlas** is consistently relating exotic animals to more familiar animals and locations to make them more understandable. In "Living Dinosaurs", the wingspan

of an Andean condor is measured ground-to-rim against a basketball goal—an ideal image for 13-16 year-olds to sense how large a ten-foot wingspan really is. Colorful images of dinosaurs are juxtaposed against those of barnyard chickens, making those exotic drawings of never-seen animals seem much less fanciful. The excellent exploration of birds of prey and their probable relationship to dinosaurs is compelling. Facts about these always-fascinating raptors include the eagle's 7,000 feathers, the reason for baldness in vultures, and the note that raptor talons can be stronger than the hand and arm of a man. These facts are all wrapped around the defining characteristics of birds of prey. The episode, like the series, has the very good sense of when to define a word and when to rely on context. "Paleontologist" and "apex predator" are defined by the narrator while "omnivorous," "herbivorous", and "omnivorous" and "predation" are left to be defined by the visual context which the program provides well. Balancing information and the viewer's own inferences is one of the enduring qualities of the program,

Education Summary:

Animal Atlas covers a range of educational enrichment when matched against the Common Core standards. The emergence of Common Core as the education blueprint for 45 states and 3 territories has made it easier to align content again standards taught in school. Common Core is an outgrowth of common state standards and is generally compatible with all states in the larger details. The match of Animal Atlas with Common Core builds on the standard met since last season.

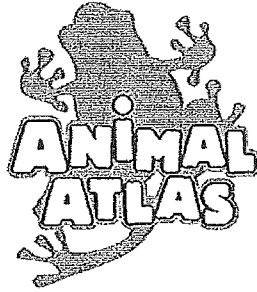

Series: Nature Adventures

Program Reviewed: 402 Grand Lake, Co: Gateway to Rocky Mountain National Park

Episode Length: @24 minutes

In Nature Adventures, Terri Lawrenz and Todd Magnuson take viewers with them as they explore nature. Just the two of them, and their camera man, Tom Orton. In the Episode: Grand Lake, Colorado: Gateway to Rocky Mountain National Park, Terri, Todd and Tom take us on an adventure throughout Rocky Mountain National Park.

Within this show, viewers will learn about the vegetation at the high altitudes in Rocky Mountain National Park. What adaptations the plants need to survive? There are many shots of the beautiful wildflowers that grow on the mountain sides and along the trails. Terri and Todd introduce us to elk and discuss the adaptations that allow them to survive in the harsh environment of the mountains. We learn about Prairie Falcons, Yellow Bellied Marmots, American Pikas, Gray Jays, Stellar Jays, Mule Deer, Moose and Osprey. There is also information about the Rocky Mountain Big Horn Sheep. Viewers will be fascinated by the fact that the Rocky Mountain Big Horn Sheep is the Colorado State Animal, even though they are outnumbered by Elk.

At higher elevations, Terri and Todd sit for lunch and point out to viewers that the food that they brought with them has changed a bit. Due to the lower air pressure, the food packages expanded! This will bring up some really good questions! Why does this happen?!? What a great way to introduce air pressure to students!

Terri and Todd mention that they are in the Rocky Mountains in August. Viewers may be surprised to see snow still on the mountain side in many of the shots seen throughout the show. As Terri and Todd travel to different elevations, the video footage of the scenery is breathtaking. It will make viewers want to take a vacation to Rocky Mountain National Park.

This show brings up a lot of important information that students need to know when it comes to ecosystems. It also addresses many of the new National Science Standards (NSS) for Middle School and High School. Examples of standards it covers are:


Life Science/Middle School: MS-LS2-2. Construct an explanation that predicts patterns of interactions among organisms across multiple ecosystems.

MS-LS1-5. Construct a scientific explanation based on evidence for how environmental and genetic factors influence the growth of organisms.

Life Science/High School: HS-LS2-7. Design, evaluate, and refine a solution for reducing the impacts of human activities on the environment and biodiversity.

HS-LS2-8. Evaluate the evidence for the role of group behavior on individual and species' chances to survive and reproduce.

This program is educational and is appropriate for grades 6 through 9. As a teacher, I especially like the use of scientific terms like flora, ecosystems, adaptations, and diverse. These are terms that every student in a science classroom needs to know.

Episode 302: The Little Wagon Train On The Prairie

Ride along with Terri and Todd as they travel on an old fashioned Wagon Train across the South Dakota prairie. On the wagon train they get a taste of life as early settlers experienced it. They discover the wildlife and history that lies within the prairies and realize how brutal life on the prairie can be.

Episode 303: Creatures of The Sand Hills Of Nebraska

The Sandhills of Nebraska are a unique habitat which makes a perfect home to many unique creatures and various reptiles species. Come along with Todd and Terri as they explore the Sand Hills Region in search of various lizard species and Ornate Box Turtles, but end up finding so much more!

Episode 304: A Week In Northern Minnesota

Terri and Todd attend the Minnesota Governors Fishing Opener at Lake Kabetogama where they visit with Governor Pawlenty about the Minnesota outdoors. They take in the sites and get a bird's eye view of the Canadian border. They encounter eagles, loons, deer, pelican, and find signs of moose nearby!



Episode 305: A Voyage To Isle Royal National Park

Terri and Todd visit Isle Royale National Park, where they encounter unique wildlife species such as Merganser Ducks, Snowshoe Hares, and get up close to a Moose foraging! They see evidence of the importance of wildlife to an area and what the area would look like if wildlife were not present.

Episode 306: Behind The Scenes At Reptile Gardens

Terri and Todd visit Reptile Gardens where they go behind the scenes and get 'hands-on' with various reptiles, including alligators, crocodiles, a Timber Rattlesnake, and more! Terri and Todd quickly learn that working at Reptile Gardens is hard work, and not all glamorous!

Episode 307: The North Shore Of Lake Superior

Come along as Terri and Todd visit destinations on the North Shore of Lake Superior. They also take a cruise where they get to enjoy the sites, wildlife, and get a lesson on commercial fishing. Terri hops on board a small plane for a birds eye view of the area!

Episode 309: A Nature Adventures Vacation to Ely MN

Terri and Todd visit Ely, MN and the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness where they kayak and take time to enjoy the trails, sites, scenery and wildlife. They explore the towns attractions and visit Kawishiwi Falls where they learn about the famous Ely Greenstone Formation.

Episode 310: The Best Of The Black Hills

Terri and Todd visit the Black Hills Region, where they explore the Deadwood area, Custer State Park and Roughlock Falls. They encounter many creatures including a Yellow Bellied Racer, Ruffed Grouse, Elk, Wild Turkeys, Big Horn Sheep, Antelope, Wandering Garter Snake, and a Sand Hill Crane!

Episode 311: Preserving Wildlife In Southeastern Minnesota

Terri and Todd travel to the Wabasha, MN area in search of the Blanding's Turtle! They visit the Weaver Dunes Natural Area, the National Eagle Center, and take a tour of the backwaters of the Mississippi River where they find egrets, herons, eagles, Sand Hill Cranes, and Canada Geese!

Episode 312: Road Encounters Of The Furry Kind

Todd and Terri showcase some of the different creatures they have spotted along the road in their journeys, including Sandpipers, Mule Deer, Coyotes, and a skunk! Outside the car, they are dive-bombed by Common Nighthawks and find Great Horned Owl fledglings that are just learning to fly!

Episode 401: Reptile Gardens: Friends Helping Friends

Todd and Terri visit Herpetologist Terry Phillip at Reptile Gardens, seeking advice on reptiles.
