Julie and Mary Beth accompany Kristy to a self-defense class, where they learn to take precautions to avoid dangerous situations. But when Kristy must practice her self-defense skills on the padded "faux mugger," she chickens out. Not until she arms herself with pepper spray does Kristy feel safe. With a false sense of security, Kristy ignores the "buddy" rule taught in self-defense class and again walks alone at night. When Michael walks up behind her, Kristy is startled and sprays him directly in the face, burning his eyes and injuring herself in the process. Kristy realizes that the key to safety is avoiding dangerous situations rather than relying on the false security you get from carrying a weapon. Meanwhile, Rico, Silk, and Hammer butter Coach K up hoping to score his other ticket to the Pacers/Lakers game. **[Educational Theme: Don't substitute a weapon for common sense. The best way to prevent becoming a victim is to take the right precautions and avoid dangerous situations.]**

When Jamal is left alone to close up the diner, an intruder robs him at gunpoint. Back at school, Jamal downplays the buzz on campus, claiming he wasn't that scared. Noble suspects he's covering and suggests he see a trauma counselor. Jamal insists he's okay, but moments later confronts Al about buying a gun. Chris and El Train overhear the request and argue that guns are more trouble than they're worth. Al agrees and tells Jamal he "doesn't do guns." But Jamal doesn't want to feel defenseless ever again and finds another source. But when Jamal is closing up alone again and hears someone at the door, he immediately fires at the intruder, only to discover that he's almost shot his own father. Jamal breaks down. With Mr. Grant at his side, he goes to see Noble about the trauma counseling. Meanwhile, Cassidy is assigned as a "student chaperone" to the son of a foreign dignitary. WNBA in Brazil: International Ambassadors

WNBA players visited Brazil where they provided clinics and scrimmages. They also played the to basketball club in Brazil and beat them by 5 points.

Wilt Chamberlain

Chamberlain was the first of the physically imposing and dominant centers in the NBA. He is a Hall of Famer and one of the NBA's 50 greatest players. He averaged 50 points/game one season. He started his career as a teenager playing against the professionals in Philadelphia. He was the holder of many records including scoring 100 points in a single game.

Lenny Wilkins: Hall of Fame Player and Coach

Wilkins is in the Hall of Fame as a player and as a coach. He has the most wins of an NBA coach, 1120. Wilkins attributes his success on both sides of the game to different things. As a player he understood his strengths and weaknesses. Early on he wanted to help his teammates be better players, so he had the opportunity to teach as a Sonics player-coach. As a coach he attributes his success to patience and the willingness to adapt.

Mark Scoggins: Vendor to Vice President

Scoggins started his association with the Lakers as a peanut vendor in the Forum. He took his job seriously and worked hard. Over time he has become Executive Vice President of Marketing for the Lakers. Even though he has not played a single game he has been associated with the Lakers and the Forum for over 20 years.

Shooting Sparks League

The Sparks League involves 1,500 girls ages 8 to 18 in a basketball program. Each team is named after a Sparks player. The girls meet WNBA players and learn about the game of basketball. The Sparks players use this opportunity to encourage the girls' education through reading and computer literacy.

Wheelchair Basketball

The Cleveland Cavaliers sponsor wheelchair B-ball. Through this league disabled athletes learn how to play wheelchair basketball. The speed and maneuverability of the wheelchair is an advantage compared to the height of taller players. Members of the league sometimes play during the Cavs' half time show.

As their punishment, they must do forty hours of community service at a hospital. Ben and Neal resent the assignment—until they meet the beautiful doctor who will oversee their duties. And when the boys find themselves trapped in an elevator with a pregnant woman, the doctor talks them through the delivery. Meanwhile, Marci turns her stint as candy striper into a money-making opportunity, supplying her ulcer patient with junk food and cigars for a price. The 80's Lakers and Showtime

The Los Angeles Lakers appeared in eight of 10 championships in the decade of the 80's. During that decade they won five championships. The arrival of Magic Johnson provided a new and winning personality for the Lakers. Kareem Abdul Jabbar was MVP in the championship win over the Celtics in the Boston Garden. The Lakers were the first team to repeat a championship win in two decades.

'89 & '90 Pistons

With reliance on a physical style and on stifling defense the Pistons closed out the era of the Showtime Lakers, winning the NBA championship in 1989. The Pistons repeated their win in 1990 retaining the title for the city of Detroit.

'83 Sixers

Moses Malone, a dominant center plus Julius Erving added up to winning the NBA championship for the Philadelphia 76ers after three misses over a 6-year period. The 76ers swept three of four rounds, 4 to 0, including the championship series.

Boston Celtics Dynasty

The Celtics won eleven NBA titles in thirteen years, including eight in a row between 1957-1967. The dynasty began in 1957 with the arrival of Bill Russell with Red Auerbach as the architect of Celtic pride and hard work. The Celtic philosophy under Auerbach was that if the players did their job, the Celtics would keep them on the team without trading. The Celtics continued their dynasty winning two more championships in the 70's and three more in the 80's.

Since 1970 Tomjanovich has been with the Houston Rockets either as, a player, scout, assistant coach or now as head coach. He has won 2 NBA championships as head coach. Tomjanovich prefers to go unnoticed in public but this is difficult after his years of success.

In all, the storm took more than 200 lives and caused hundreds of millions of dollars in damage. Weathermen called it the "storm of the century" but it was nothing more than an extreme example of storms that occur thousands of times each day. This special demonstrates what causes storms, how we have learned to predict them and what scientists think will happen in the future.

"To supplement and enhance the educational value of the network's "Teen NBC" programs, NBC has a website (www.nbc.com/tnbc) specifically dedicated to teens. The design of this site not only brings teens to the website for entertainment, but provides a valuable means of amplifying the educational content of the shows by bringing teens to a new level of exploration for the subjects presented in the shows.

Highlights of the website include the feature "How Do You Rate?" which allows viewers to explore in depth many of the difficult issues TNBC characters face each week, include substance abuse, sexual harassment, peer pressure, competition, violence, conflict resolution and many critical family issues. Teens take quizzes and surveys to see how they would handle these situations, and through video clip, compare their responses with each show's resolution. "How Do You Rate?" will also collect data and allow teens to see how their answers compare with other teens on the site.

Other features of the website include the "Take A Stand" section which encourages teens to get involved in community service by profiling teen volunteers and voluntary organizations across the country, and the "College Connection" section which features links for teens to get information on college scholarship opportunities."

THE MORE YOU KNOW

In addition to NBC's **THE MORE YOU KNOW** on-air component, the campaign also ties into a comprehensive community outreach effort designed and distributed to our affiliate partners across the country. **THE MORE YOU KNOW** campaign highlights important issues facing youth today such as substance abuse, smoking and staying in school. The most significant element of this year's campaign is the major emphasis on partnering viewers with referral organizations through toll-free 800# hotlines featured in respective PSAs. The viewer call-to-action, in conjunction with agency partnerships, assures the PSA not only delivers the message, but also steers them to a local organization for immediate help and information. Related print materials were provided to stations for developing local tie-ins along with referral information to help them form partnerships with social service agencies. Additionally, "The More You Know" website (www.nbc.com/moreyouknow/) features actual video clips from the award-winning public service announcements, a general campaign overview, and "The More You Know" stars bios with links to their respective shows. It also includes referral information for the organizations referenced in the PSAs.
