Section I - Issues

The stations have identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

B. INFANT OPIOID ADDICTION – Our area, with Kentucky being ranked one of the highest states of substance abuse, is seeing a disturbing uptick in infants born with addiction, specifically to opioids. Medical professionals are desperately trying to assist these children with postnatal intervention remedies. Local health officials are also desperately trying to offer prenatal education to parents about the dangers of addiction and the potential impact on the unborn.

<u>C. TBI/CONCUSSIONS</u> – In the middle of summer, student athletes in the Tristate area begin their seasons for two competitive sports known for concussions and traumatic brain injuries. Those sports are soccer and football. To reduce the risk of serious injury and to protect students playing those specific sports, safety protocols have become top of mind for local school officials and medical professionals. For example – in one local school system, a child suffering even a small head injury must obtain a doctor's clearance before returning to the team. Plus, as an added precaution, a parent/guardian must be present at all practices and games for two weeks after the student athlete is cleared to return.

E: HEALING FROM TOXIC RELATIONSHIPS — A bad relationship can run the gamut of emotions- from feeling mentally exhausted by a relationship that seems impossible to get free from to being fearful for one's life. All too often women in the latter category, especially those with children, are reluctant to leave that abusive relationship and situation. One obstacle is that fact that, in many cases, the victims have no clear path to escape due to limited finances and resources. There are some facilities in the area, such as My Sister's Keeper in Owensboro, which cater to these women with emergency shelter, support and safety. However, what local social workers are discovering is that the number of available beds is being crushed by the overwhelming demand for them.

A. HOME TRAVEL – Although more people are working than ever before, finances are still tough as Tristate residents continue to claw their way out of the pandemic. The money crunch is leaving many unable to enjoy a well-earned vacation. Visitor bureaus in various Tristate cities, in cooperation with health facilities, are launching a huge push for local and regional attractions to offer low-cost or no-cost options for families who need a physical and mental break from the daily grind.

<u>C. Extreme Weather</u> – An increase in wildfires, hurricanes, tornadoes, and heat waves have been recorded the past few years, and local meteorologists and the National Weather Service in Paducah, KY, have already begun preparing for the potential for extreme winter weather as well. Various forecast models are predicting a colder and snowier winter than normal in our area and we want to make certain we are prepared for it.

E. RISE IN ADOLESCENT MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES – Local mental health professionals, as well as school organizations throughout western KY and southern IN, have seen an increase in mental health issues in students. Those issues cover a wide range of problems and frustrations. The uptick has prompted a much more involved parent/teacher relationship to ensure the long-term success of our children.
